Hello fellow Auxiliary Members!! This Chairman hopes you have recovered from the Holidays and are ready to do the Auxiliary business for the remainder of the fiscal year! I am creating this page in the middle of January for the February packet so if you are thinking "this lady is way behind" that is why.

Would like to address keeping AEF alive and well on the local level. It is probably a for sure thing that one of the members of your Unit has in the past, is right now or will be in the future in need of some small personal help financially. Does your Unit have a small fund that can be utilized to help someone over a small hump? Each Unit definitely should have a fund that can be utilized to help in a small, emergency way. Probably 90% of the Units contribute to AEF on a Department/National level but a lot less than that have a fund of their own! Would like to suggest making that a Unit goal.

Some ideas that were passed on from the mid-year reports are: Have a small collection from each member at each meeting. One of the Units calls this the door collection and uses 25cents. This is turned into the treasurer and over time adds up for an emergency. Another Unit is holding a 50/50 and the half they keep is placed into the Unit emergency fund. One Unit has a fundraiser that is repeated every month and one third is put in the local emergency fund! Lots of quick, easy ways to slowly build up a local fund.

The American Legion Auxiliary Department of Arizona AMERICANISM

February 2018

The American Legion passed Resolution No. 163 at the 1960 National Convention in Miami that established February as **Americanism Month**. "It is a time to reflect on what it means to be an American and rededicate ourselves [and our posts] to taking action that will uphold the principle of 100-percent Americanism".

Americanism is one of the Legion's four pillars – which is simply the love of America, loyalty to its ideals and institutions, allegiance to its flag, willingness to defend it against all enemies [foreign and domestic] and a desire to pass on the blessings of liberty to future generations.

Four U.S. Army Chaplains gave up their life jackets and prayed together when their transport ship, the U.S.A.T Dorchester was torpedoed eighty miles south of Greenland on February 3, 1943. The Chaplains came from different faiths and backgrounds. John P. Washington was a Catholic Priest from Kearny, NJ, Rabbi Alexander D. Goode was a native of York, PA. Clark V. Poling was a minister in the Reformed Church in America in Schenectady, NY. George L. Fox, a decorated World War One veteran, was a Methodist minister in Gilman, VT.

The story of the Four Chaplain's includes not only the background of the Chaplains, their interfaith cooperation, and their selfless sacrifice but it also includes the memories of the close to seven hundred lives lost that day, the stories of the survivors, the bravery of the rescuers and those who are inspired even today. We may never be asked to give up our own life jacket to save another person, but the story of the **Four Chaplains** can inspire us to reach out a helping hand in a time of need.

In 1941, the **USO** (United Service Organization) is organized as a way to serve and entertain American troops. Today, their mission is to "strengthen America's military service members by keeping them connected to family, home and country, throughout their service to the nation". The USO provides programs, entertainment and services at more than 200 USO locations worldwide, including Afghanistan, Djibouti, Kuwait, United Arab Emirates, Germany, Italy, Japan, Iraq, South Korea and the United States.

Americanism Essay Contest – This year's theme is **What can I personally do to promote Americanism in my school or community**. A citation and \$50 prize will be awarded, along with an additional \$50 donation to the Children of Warriors National Presidents Scholarship Fund. Encourage your children, grandchildren, nieces, nephews, neighbors – <u>any</u> child in grades 3-12. Still plenty of time to spread the word and to get the entries sent to the Americanism committee by **April 1, 2018**.

"I am calling to express my strong support in keeping the AH-64 Apache helicopters at the Silverbell Army Heliport and to prevent deactivation of the 1-285th ARB. The loss of these jobs will result in a significant negative economic, employment and security impact to our community. Thank you and as you work to resolve these issues, please know that the soldiers and families of the 1-285th ARB have my full support."

Background notes:

- The chief of the Arizona National Guard is mounting a last-ditch effort to save Apache attack-helicopter training at the Silverbell Army Heliport near Marana, as the Army moves to transfer most of the Guard's Apaches to active-duty units.
- The plan will cut hundreds of soldiers from the already diminished AH-64 Apache combat unit at Silverbell, which together with other units contributes an estimated \$147.4 million annually to the local economy.
- The Army already has withdrawn helicopters from the 1st/285th at Silverbell. The battalion has already lost all but four of its former fleet of 20 Apaches, and unless Silverbell is picked as one of the Guard Apache battalion sites, the 1-285th ARB faces possible deactivation.

Auxiliary members step up and reach out to help military families during deployments in very practical ways, such as assisting with their needs for child care and lawn work or by providing a listening ear to a spouse. Members do helpful things such as collecting coupons and sending them to overseas commissaries, hosting send-off and welcome-home events for our troops, providing them with pocket flags, and showing the gratitude of our nation by providing military families with Blue Star and Gold Star Banners. Auxiliary units are encouraged to partner with other organizations that serve the military, such as local USO affiliates and ROTC/JROTC units.

Auxiliary members also assist our communities in times of natural and manmade disasters through Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) courses. VA&R REPORT TUCSON VA MEDICAL CENTER 12-31-17

American Legion Auxiliary Units sponsor Bingo parties which are held on the third Saturday of each month at 1:30PM in Building 60 at the VA hospital. Volunteers are needed to assist with this activity, which is much appreciated by our hospitalized Veterans. Please consider sponsoring the Bingo program. Thank you to the past & current District presidents who volunteered at the June Bingo. We are now welcoming Veteran patients from the Building 95 Substance Use Treatment Disorder Program to our Bingos.

The American Legion Auxiliary Units sponsor Bridging Ceremony refreshments for the Substance Use Disorders Treatment Program (SUDTP) on the third Tuesday of each month and any month that there is a fifth Tuesday. We sponsored refreshments on December 19st, 2017. We will be sponsoring refreshments on January 16th & January 30th, 2018. Volunteers are needed to help with this program. The time is 2PM and the venue is Building 90 at the VA hospital. Thank you to members of Unit 131 & 132 who have volunteered to help with this program. Special thanks to Fire Woman and Jude for all their assistance with this activity.

The new Residential Mental Health Rehabilitation facility is now open. This added 25 new beds to house Veterans in various treatment programs with on-site housing on the hospital campus. The staff requesting donations has put forward that donations in kind, rather than monetary donations, would best fill this need. Units 102, 131, 132, 109 and District 2 have responded to this need and we ordered 250 backpacks and water bottles in July, we ordered athletic equipment, adult coloring books, crayons, colored pencils and yoga mats during December with the final delivery on January 2nd, 2018. The December donation was made possible largely by a very generous donation from Unit 102.

Veterans Creative Arts Festival is scheduled for February 7, 2018. Volunteers are needed to assist VA personnel with conducting this event.

Employee Appreciation Luncheon is March 7th, 2018. As always, volunteers, salads and desserts are needed from all Units. Start time is 9AM; we serve from 11AM to 1PM.

The grand total of monetary donations by American Legion Auxiliary Units for May 1, 2017 to December 31, 2017 is \$10,778.13. Thank you Unit 66 & Unit 39 for your generous donations.

The grand total of material and activity donations for the American Legion Auxiliary for May 1, 2017 to December 31, 2017 is \$39,473.50. We would like to express special thanks to Elaine Yates and Yuma Unit 19, Ann Reatherford, Unit 24, Unit 131, Unit 132, Unit 73 and Unit 109 members and unaffiliated volunteers for their constant support of VA programs through their donations. The Legion family is the largest supporter of the Arizona Fisher House. Currently, Arizona Fisher House is funded for the foreseeable future. Other programs are in dire need of donations (ie. Homeless, Building 95, Social Services, Bingo, etc.). The donation figure does not include Christmas Gift Shop at this time.

Fifteen registered hospital volunteers and ten summer youth volunteers, donated time which was credited to the American Legion Auxiliary. The grand total of registered volunteer hours May 1, 2017 to December 31, 2017 is 3,706; occasional volunteer hours are 239.5 donated by fifty five occasional volunteers (includes Christmas Gift Shop volunteers). We are now down to ten registered volunteers at SAVAHCS. Please consider volunteering at SAVAHCS if you can possibly devote the time. We have one new American Legion Auxiliary registered volunteer. Please consider sponsoring a summer youth volunteer at SAVAHCS. The cost is \$40 per youth. All hours logged by each sponsored youth will be credited to the American Legion Auxiliary.

This chairman has volunteered 245 hours and logged 2,820 miles this year in service to the Tucson VA Medical Center as of December 31, 2017.

6 JANUARY 2018

Meeting was called to order by the newly elected chairman, James Katzenberger at 10:07 a.m. The opening ceremony was conducted and guests introduced.

Emily Laflamme, Program Coordinator, Crisis Response Network for "Be Connected" gave a report on her organization. Be Connected is a state-wide initiative aimed at reducing the rate and risk of military suicides in Arizona by connecting veterans, service members and their families to the right resource at the right time. The rate of suicide is 3xs higher among Arizona veterans, and 4xs higher among older veterans. The magnitude of this issue shows a collaborative community approach is needed. The presentation discussed "Be Connected" program components, including the 24/7 Support Line, Resource Matching Tool, and training opportunities. Kathy Laurier gave a presentation on the upcoming "Patriotic Gala" being held on Saturday, April 21, 2018 at the Embassy Suites in Scottsdale. The cost is \$65 if purchased before 31 March 2018.

Terry Araman gave an overview of "How to advocate for a bill" in the State Legislature. There are over 1,000 bills introduced during each Legislative Session. To log on go to azleg.gov.

Roll call was take, a quorum was established. Carol made a motion to accept the minutes as printed, second by Pat Connell, approved.

Treasure report was given. Current cash balance for this period is \$56,318.81.

Members were encouraged to send get well wishes to Jesse Gersten and Art Sloane.

Luis Cardenas-Camacho gave a report from Congressman Gallego's office.

Director Nelson from the VA Medical facility reported on issues dealing with the VA Medical Facility. Currently they are seeing between 181 and 185 patients daily in the Emergency Room. Their bed have been full due to the flu outbreak. They are continuing to work on the suicide prevention program. In 2017 the VA spent \$93 million in patient care. The CVS mini clinic referrals are going well. The need for Primary Care Physicians is growing and continues to be a primary concern. Mental Health is trying for same day services. The new Dental building will be opening on Tuesday, the formal ribbon breaking ceremony will be at a later date. One change is in the podiatry clinic. You do not need a referral from your Primary Care Physician to schedule an appointment in podiatry. The hospital has received a davency (not sure of spelling) robot for the surgery department. Using it will cut down on pain and healing time. Cardiology will now be able to perform more in house surgical treatments and not have to send them down town. There are 91,000 veterans in the Phoenix VA System. Director Wanda Wright, AZ Department of Veteran's Services gave a report on last year's activities. The "Be Connected" program was launched by her office as a pilot program to the purpose of preventing suicides". Another program "school assist' has helped 750 students with school needs. Their Virtual Veterans Assistance through Skype is also doing well. They brought \$450 million to the stat from federal programs. Veteran's unemployment has dropped to 3.9% but many veterans are underemployed. Efforts are being made to correct this issue. The Tucson State Home currently has 117 patients. The Phoenix Home has 160 beds filled out of 200. Need to fund additional staff to be able to fill the remaining beds. There were 763 internments at the veterans cemeteries throughout the state last year. In 2018 they are planning on having a 50th Anniversary program for the POW/MIA/KIA's and the Gold Star Families. Also hope to have the "Be Connected" statewide. Looking for pre 9-11 donations to help out those veterans that were pre 9-11.

Judy Hatch gave a report on "Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day". The program went well. She is working with the ADVS to have a separate fund set up where people and organizations can donate specifically for Pearl Harbor Day so as to avoid the issue that came up this year which almost resulted in no fly over. Organizations or individuals can make a donation to the Department of Veterans Services specifically for Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day by writing Pearl Harbor Day in the memo of the check. About \$3,000 is needed to insure both the flyover and the rest of the program.

A propose change to the by-laws was made, changing the secretary and treasurer positions from elected to appointed. A vote was taken and approved.

There being no further business to come before the membership, closing ceremony was conducted and the meeting was adjourned at 12:15 p.m.
