REGULAR MEETING - BOARD OF TRUSTEES SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 1 DANIELS COUNTY,

- Vice Chairman Jesse Cole called the meeting to order at 8:00 p.m. Roll was taken and it was established that a quorum was present. Chairman Hagan was not present at this time.
- Patrons and visitors were recognized.
- On motion by Matt Stentoft, seconded by Leif Handran, the minutes from the August 20, 2018 Regular Meeting and August 8, 2018 Budget Meeting were approved unanimously as presented.
- The Principal and Superintendent reports were discussed and are attached and made a part of these minutes by reference.
- On motion by Matt Stentoft, seconded by Tim Tande, the August 17, 2018 – September 5, 2018 claims in the amount of \$33,423.06 were approved unanimously as presented.
- On motion by Tim Tande, seconded by Leif Handran, the Activities Report for August 2018 was approved unanimously as presented.
- Don Hagan entered the meeting at this time. Vice Chairman Cole continued to run the meeting.
- Committee Reports:
 - **Buildings & Grounds:** Leif Handran met with SAFI, Larry Henderson and Brock Berryhill to discuss options for buildings. Tentative plan is to demolish and start over if sufficient funds can be raised.
 - **No other committees met**
- Matt Stentoft moved to approve the changes to the 2018-2019 Bus Routes as presented. Tim Tande seconded and all present voted in favor.
- Superintendent Thomas will begin advertising for an Assistant Plant Manager.
- Don Hagan moved to purchase an Axiom Autoroute 8Pro+ and accessories for the Scobey Schools shop at a cost of \$10,000.00 using donation money. Tim Tande seconded and all present voted in favor.
- Matt Stentoft moved to pay Sarpy Transportation in the amount of \$7,453.65 for the warranty repairs made to the MCI cruiser. Leif Handran seconded and all present voted in favor.
- No action was taken on the Building repair quote from L & L Construction.
- Matt Stentoft moved to approve the changes to the Spartan Standards, adding wording for “nicotine and vapor products” to Section VI Extracurricular Activities and Section XVI Tobacco, Drugs and Alcohol. Don Hagan seconded and all present voted in favor.
- Leif Handran moved to approve the repairs to the LTC Cruiser by Thievin Auto Body in the amount of \$2,800.00. Tim Tande seconded and all present voted in favor.
- There was no further business and the meeting was adjourned

To the Scobey Community,

It's been an interesting first month of school. Students are back in classes and teachers are working to make up the learning losses that students experienced over the summer. The Special Education professionals attended the Experienced Teacher Forum September 11th in Glasgow. The administrators are busy with Fall reports mandated by the State. There are four multi-part reports linked to two surveys that must be completed by November 1st. The data pulled from the reports submitted by Montana schools are available sometime next year. This is how the State determines funding according to State formulas and whether a school meets the requirement for accreditation.

The ASVAB test will be administered to the Juniors next week. The Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery is one of the most relevant nationally normed tests which looks at all aspects of student achievement. Make sure that your student is ready to test Wednesday, October 3rd.

The Title 1 Parent meeting is scheduled for 5PM October 1st at the School Library. Title 1 is a federal program that funds additional help for those students that struggle in certain content areas. The

program provides tutoring for those who don't qualify for Special Education Services.

The Student Council with the support of the Scobey Lions purchased a small salad bar and condiment cart. The average Spartan (Spartans are rarely average) has an .18 attendance rate.

FAFSA Window Opens Oct. 1

The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) filing window opens on Monday, October 1. Students and parents/guardians each need an FSA ID and password. To get started go to FAFSA.ed.gov. Priority filing deadlines for colleges and universities is December 1.

College Application Week October 1-5!

College application week (CAW) is October 1-5, 2018. This is the week where seniors may apply to a college or university and have the application fee waived or deferred. There will be a special CAW event at Scobey School on Tuesday, October 2, from 4:30—7:00 pm in the elementary computer lab. Students and parents are welcome to come and apply to college, ask questions, complete FAFSA forms, and enjoy refreshments!

ASVAB, ACT & PSAT

ASVAB Testing for juniors and any seniors who missed it last year is scheduled for Wednesday, October 3, beginning at 8:30 am. The PSAT test is scheduled for Wednesday, October 10, for those juniors who signed up last spring. Cost of the test is \$10. The ACT test will be given in Scobey on Saturday, October 27. Students must have registered online at actstudent.org by September 28. Late registration closes on October 14 and additional fees do apply. The ACT test will also be given on December 8. Registration deadline for that test is November 2.

JMG to LEAD Conference

On October 30 some of the JMG students will be attending a leadership conference in Helena. Student officers within the JMG Montana Career Association from high school and middle schools across Montana will be attending a one-day leadership conference. Students will have an opportunity to interact and share ideas with each other while connecting with peers and business owners/leaders from across the state! This year's theme is MOBILIZE. Tough to read


TWO WORDS:
