Building & Grounds Trustees: The trustees have treated the HVAC system with bactericide, and monitoring it for the past month would indicate that the system is now performing as expected. We will continue to monitor water use. Water use has been normal since early July.

The AC unit in the conference room has been pulled in preparation for winter. The heating boiler has been placed on standby to deal with cold fall days. The forced air heating system will be activated late in September once the cooling system is no longer needed.

Adjustments have been made to the Family Room toilet in the basement to

reduce the potential for water loss and to improve flushing.

Trustees, with Mel Hansen and Barb Grossman handling merchandising on Facebook, have sold the old Welcome Desk that was in storage for \$250. The buyer will pick up the desk on Thursday, 9/18.

The windows in the Narthex have been washed and the batteries replaced in the emergency lights.



Our study this year is *Finding Resilience*, *Joy, and Our Identity in Jesus Christ* by Rev. Dr. Rhashell D. Hunter and Rev. MacKichen Walker.

In this Bible study, we will explore resilience. This is modeled for us by several biblical characters, gospel and epistle writers, as well as Jesus. So, what exactly is resilience?

Resilience is the ability to spring back into shape and to adapt well in the face of adversity, trauma, tragedy, threats, or stress—such as from family, relationships, health, workplace, and financial stressors. People who survive and thrive well in change are resilient.

The Bible study is also about joy. How do we find joy in a chaotic world? Christian joy may be different from how a lot of people define joy.

Joy is sometimes confused with happiness. For Christians, joy can occur while we are in the midst of difficult circumstances. Joy is the second fruit of the spirit, preceded by love and followed by peace. [Gal. 5:22-23] Trusting in God when we are in trying times can fill us with glorious joy and peace. We have joy in our suffering, because ultimately our joy is found in Jesus Christ.

We will also seek to rediscover our identity.

Identity is more than who we are or who we show ourselves to be. At its core, it points to our humanity. Our core identity is not found in our titles, our positions, our spouses, our partners, or our possessions. For Christians, our identity is found in Jesus Christ.

# **MISSION & OUTREACH** COMMITTEE UPDATE

During the month of August, we collected \$779 and a number of items of win-



ter wear for the school children of Bdecan church and the surrounding area. The collected items were delivered to Bdecan on September 13. From the people of Bdecan, "Pidamaya," which is "Thank you" in Dakota.

September's mission is collecting items for young people served by Nexus-



PATH who are aging out of the foster care system. These young people have not been able to live in their family of origin and lack the support system most of us and our children had when we were ready to set up our first apartment or dorm room. Everything needed for an apartment, other than furniture and large appliances, is needed. As always, if you are unable to shop yourself, Boots or Donna will be happy to shop for you.



For October, we are again collecting money to be sent to our partners in Kenya, to support the food program at the Mpangua school. Our Presbytery helped to build

school, and we have been assisting to provide food for their lunches. Kenya does not have a USDA type agency to help provide hot lunches for the students. Each parent is to provide a certain amount of money and groceries so that lunch can be prepared for the students. Because Mpangua is in an impoverished area, and there is a severe drought there, the parents can barely feed their children at home, much less provide anything to the school. This is an ongoing problem for which we collect money on a regular basis. They do provide detailed receipts showing that the money has been spent the way we intended. We built the school so that the children could be educated, and have a better life; and we know that they can't learn when they are hungry, so we need

to help feed them so that they will be able to better provide for their children in the future. We are all brothers and sisters in Christ. Thank you for your support.
