# Silverlake HOA Termination of Recreational Facilities Agreements

The Silverlake Homeowner's Association (HOA) Board of Directors terminated the agreement concerning shared use of recreational facilities on December 14, 2006. These two agreements were between (1) Silverlake HOA, Inc. and Southwyck Section IV and (2) Silverlake HOA, Inc. and Southwyck Section I. This termination resulted in the following limitation of recreational facility use:

- The 2715 Southwyck Parkway Silverlake pool, park, tennis facilities, and clubhouse will be available only to members of the Silverlake Homeowners Association
- The Southwyck Lake Park, playground and volleyball courts located on Northfork Drive and Shelby Drive will be available only to members of the Southwyck HOA.
- The 3131 Morgan Road pool, playground, and baseball field will be available only to members of the Southwyck HOA.
- The exercise park located on Morgan Road at Bentley Drive will be available only to members of the Southwyck HOA.
- The Northfork Road at Huntington Way pool, playground and soccer field will be available only to members of the Southwyck HOA.

Southwyck residents will be receiving forms in the mail for use of the Southwyck pools. Signs will be posted on all Southwyck recreational facilities outlining resident usage and limitations.

ANNEXATION - December 31, 2006 - Southfield Village, Huntington Park, Southglen, and Emerald Pointe residents are also residents of the City of Pearland.

### MUD INFORMATION AND BOARD STATUS

The City of Pearland assumes all the MUD assets, debts and obligations upon annexation.

**POLICE SERVICES** (281-652-1100)

### STREET MAINTENANCE & DRAINAGE (281-652-1900)

The City will take over maintenance including sidewalks.

### GARBAGE SERVICE (Utility Billing Dept. 281-652-1603)

- The City has a contract with Waste Management for garbage bags only. Only bags may be placed at the curb for pickup.
- New city rates are currently being negotiated with Waste Management for your garbage service, but will not exceed \$13.29 per month per residence.

### WATER & SEWER BILLING (281-652-1603)

- The MUD water deposit was transferred to the City of Pearland.
- The utility bill consists of water, sewer and garbage service. Water is currently billed at \$10.89 a month and includes a minimum consumption of 2000 gallons.

### ANIMAL CONTROL (281-652-1970)

- Cats and dogs are required to be registered with the City. A current Rabies Certificate is needed and tags can be purchased at the Animal Control office. The annual fee is \$10 for neutered pets and \$20 for pets not neutered.
- New residents have 60 days to register pets.
- Animal Control will routinely patrol all neighborhoods, respond to stray animal calls, and enforce pet nuisance ordinances such as loud and/or unrestrained animals.
- Residents are allowed up to 3 cats or dogs in any combination.
- Cats and dogs must be on a leash or contained in a fence at all times. Animals cannot be tied outside of a fenced yard. Owners must have physical control of pets at all times.
- Owners are required to pick up after pets in all public areas.

### **HOA Status**

The role of your HOA will stay the same after the city transition, continuing to maintain neighborhood parks and enforce deed restrictions. While the City does not enforce deed restrictions, through its Code of Ordinances, the City provides an additional level of neighborhood protection that is often easier and less burdensome to enforce than deed restrictions. Some of the relevant codes dealing with nuisances include:

- High weeds and grass
- Junk or abandoned vehicles
- · Fence in need of maintenance
- Off-premise signs (bandit or snipe signs placed within the right of way)
- Trash and debris

## Southwyck Lake Park

Current plans for the park near the lake at Northfork and Shelby are a work in progress. Negotiations are underway with the board of directors for Brazoria County M.U.D. #2 to possibly fund a renovation of the outdated park equipment. The M.U.D.board has agreed to take on the drainage problem initially before making any decisions about park renovation. They have hired an engineering firm to conduct a survey of what is needed. Hopefully, this will clear up the standing water issues that we all face at this park.

In addition to negotiating with the M.U.D. board, the Southwyck Master Association recently replaced all the picnic tables, benches, and added outdoor grills to the park for this Spring season. There are other plans in place to update the landscaping as well as the outdoor structures that cover the brick area in front of the lake.

### Morgan Road Baseball Field

Upgrades are completed on the Baseball field. The following is a reminder of the guidelines for use of the field:

The following guideline was established by the Southwyck Section IV Homeowners Association so that all residents will have access to the baseball field facilities in a fair and equitable manner.

### SCHEDULING OF ORGANIZED TEAMS:

Any organized team with Southwyck resident members, youth or adult, must reserve the field. The team having the highest number of players who live in Southwyck will be given first choice when scheduling practice times. The team with the next highest number will be given second pick, and so on. In case of two or more teams having the same number of residents, priority will be determined by coin flip. Any and all other remaining teams will then be scheduled following the same rules.

Organized teams will be required to submit a roster of team members and coaches for verification.

#### SCHEDULING FOR SOUTHWYCK RESIDENTS:

Any Southwyck homeowner may reserve the field for group use. Reservations will be accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis.

### **RULES FOR GENERAL USE:**

Field users must follow rules established by the Deed Restrictions for use of common areas.

Field users may be required to show proof of residency
