- Volunteer to keep up the area around the flag pole at your community's civic government area by planting seasonal flowers and collecting trash.
- Encourage local businesses to fly the American flag, especially on patriotic holidays.
- Encourage Legion Family members to fly an American flag at their home.
- Provide American flags to your local schools for classrooms.
- Order pocket flag kits and distribute to members. More info here: http://www.pocketflagproject.com/wp/participate/get-started/
- Identify and distribute assembled pocket flags to active-duty military overseas.
- Encourage Auxiliary members to contact state and federal representatives and ask them to support the flag amendment.
- Encourage members to participate in Get Out the Vote and Kids Voting USA campaigns. For more information, refer to www.legion.org/vote and www.kidsvotingusa.org.
- Work with local schools to further education of the U.S. Constitution, either whole or in part such as the Bill of Rights or the Preamble.

Creative Arts September 2019



The "Give 10 to Education" program is designed to allow our members to support education from different angles. Every unit participating will receive a certificate. Let's try for 100% participation, because this project can allow all members, juniors included, to participate. Here's how it works!

Determine what type of activity in which you would like to participate. Here are some suggestions:

- 1. Donate 10 minutes/hours/days of your time to volunteer in a classroom.
- 2. Assist with or donate 10 items to a backpack program held at many schools.
- 3. Donate 10 boxes of pencils or crayons to a classroom or school.
- 4. Provide a \$10 donation to a school library.
- 5. Help a teacher on the playground for 10 minutes.
- 6. Donate 10 flags and discuss the importance of the flag to a class.
- 7. Donate 10 pair of socks to a kindergarten class.
- 8. Donate 10 pair of shoes.
- 9. Give 10 dictionaries to third grade students.
- 10. Support a scholarship fund (including National Scholarships) by donating \$10.

American Education Week is November 18-22, 2019. Visit the schools to promote the Auxiliary scholarships. Send a card to all local school staff, including all school personnel who children interact with, teachers, office staff, bus drivers, custodians, etc.

Promote Teacher Appreciation Week, May 4-8, 2020. Send cards to your local schools' teachers. Donate resources that teachers or needy children may need. Plan teacher appreciation events at your schools.

FINANCE INFORMATION

SEPTEMBER 2019

As your finance Committee, let us begin this month with a couple of questions for all Units and Districts: #1 Do you know the meaning of the word Audit and #2 Has your Unit and District had their Treasurers books & records Audited? Audit – a formal checking of your financial records. How long has it been since your records were audited? You answer this question. The new National ALA Guide Book states on page 45:" The Unit Treasurer should be present to facilitate an audit. If your By-Laws don't state how the audit is to be conducted the Unit may hire an outside auditor or appoint an audit committee of two or more persons. The Unit Treasurer should provide a report after an annual audit of the Treasurer's books. Once the audited report has been adopted, it becomes part of the Unit's or Districts permanent record.

This is why we continually remind all of you to retain receipts of income and payouts whether by check or cash as these items are necessary to complete an AUDIT. It is NOT GOOD POLICY to keep writing a check to yourself – take a check with you when purchasing items or paying out to a vendor.

An Audi t protects not only the Treasurer and other officers but the organization as a whole. It is also good policy when writing checks to either make a copy of your written check or better yet, when you order checks get them with duplicate copies.

Our very sincere thanks to ALL who donated items for the drawings at the Department Convention – many were handmade and most of all the Finance Committee thanks all who purchased tickets for the many items. Because of your generosity and the tables full of items, the income from the ticket sales was \$1,030. to be used to pay for overhead expenses at our Department headquarters office. Also to those fantastic Auxiliary ladies that helped with ticket sales – THANK YOU ALL!!!

Another reminder – have you made your annual report to the office of the Secretary of State listing your Unit as a veterans organization, your annual report to the AZ Corporation Commission and to the Internal Revenue Service filing some form of the 990. Your fiscal year determines the date for filing to the IRS.

Remember the three words this committee will be using from now on - HONESTY, INTEGRITY AND RESPONSIBILITY!!!

- 5. Please contact me and I will provide you with the necessary form and some helpful hints on the video checklist.


