In those small towns where, clustered round about, old houses squat and jostle like a fair, that's just caught sight of it, and then and there shut up the stalls, and, silenced every shout,

the criers still, the drum-sticks all suspended, stands gazing up at it with straining ears: while it, as calm as ever, in the splendid wrinkled buttress-mantle rears itself above the homes it never knew:

in those small towns you come to realise how the cathedrals utterly outgrew their whole environment. Their birth and rise, as our own life's too great proximity will mount beyond our vision and our sense of other happenings, took precedence of all things; as though that were history, piled up in their immeasurable masses in petrification safe from circumstance, not that, which down among the dark streets passes and takes whatever name is given by chance and goes in that, as children green or red, or what the dealer has, wear in rotation. For birth was here, within this deep foundation, and strength and purpose in this aspiration, and love, like bread and wine, was all around, and porches full of lover's lamentation. In the tolled hours was heard life's hesitation, and in those towers that, full of resignation, ceased all at once from climbing, death was found.

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

Feast of Dedication of St John Lateran

John 2:13-2

"Are we celebrating anything tonite?" Sometimes, waiters or waitresses in restaurants may ask that question to you, as they introduce themselves. They wish to serve best, by making connections so that they can highlight your special occasion during the meal (maybe your birthday, or promotion or just because it is Friday Eve!) In our Church, I say it a lot, but it is true, that, we Catholics are always a party waiting to happen! Every day celebrates something special from our faith. Our liturgical calendar is full, so that nearly every day, we are celebrating some saint's life, or a holy event in Christ's life or the Blessed Mother's life, or even some other doctrinal teaching of our faith (All Souls, Trinity, or Christ the King). We always have something to be grateful to God for and to celebrate about our Christian Faith! And today we have the unique Feast of the *Dedication of the Basilica of St John Lateran!* It's understandable if you wonder, "St John Say Who?" Why is that church building so important? Basically, it is the mother church of every Catholic. If asked about our mother church, we might have thought that the most important church building to us was St Peter's Basilica (Vatican). But St Peter's wasn't built until the 1500's, so before there was a St Peter's as a papal headquarters church, the original was St John Lateran. It was dedicated in the beginning, in 324 AD by Pope Sylvester, as the first official church dedicated following Constantine's edict legally recognizing Christianity, which ended the Empire's persecution of Christians. So our original, original was St John Lateran, the oldest church building in the West. (A little piece of Catholic trivia is that we have one other feast that celebrates an inanimate object and that day celebrates "The Chair of Peter" every February 22. Why? It celebrates the teaching authority role of the chief apostle Peter, and his historical successors, our chief shepherds-popes.)

So, today is a historical feast commemorating an ancient building, but the church building is only a collective sign of our unity, that we trace an origin for our practices from the earliest days of Christian history. What does the building represent, but the generations and generations of believing Catholics that have continued to gather over time and worship God in solidarity through a similar routine (ritual prayer) shared in common. Yet, what goes on inside the building is what is most important. As we all learned as kids, the little hand gestures to the song, "Here's the church and here's the steeple, open the doors and there's all the people!" Yes, the living church of Jesus is the People of God. The inside, not the outside, upholds its life!

Jesus' attitude toward the physical structure of buildings (& locations) is revealed when He converses with the Samaritan Woman at the Well in John 4:20-21,23, when he responded to her claim that "Our ancestors worshiped on this mountain; but you people say that the place to worship is in Jerusalem." Jesus replied that, "Believe me, woman, the hour is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem.....the hour is coming, and is now here, when true worshipers will worship the Father in Spirit and truth; and indeed the Father seeks such people to worship him." Of course, as today's gospel reminds us, Jesus had already 'cleansed' the Temple, to restore its holy function of fostering 'genuine prayer and worship' instead being used to create business and commerce. In John 2:19, Jesus says, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." They people misunderstand Him, thinking that He is referring to the physical building, but Jesus clarifies that He is the 'Presence of the Living God', as John 2:21 informs us that, "He was speaking about the temple of his body." Over in Matthew 12:6, Jesus suggestively floats the same conviction to the crowds, by saying, "I tell you, that something greater than the temple is here." Jesus is the New Temple of the New Covenant. To worship God in the New Temple, means to visit 'Christ in Us and in one another' by imitating His conduct of charity. Even without a physical building of a Temple out there somewhere, Jesus is telling us that we worship and glorify God through the reverent upholding of His Body-His Image Presence in our brothers and sisters (letting our bodies serve God like Jesus' – striving to imitate His deeds-words). Acknowledging Christ in us, in here (me) and in you (there), is visiting His sanctuary. This is what St Paul means too, when, in Romans 12:1, he writes, "I urge you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God, your spiritual worship." Christ's Presence – that is His Temple! Peace, Fr Brian
