


















Nicholas Canny

For Nicholas Canny, a Little Village alumnus and 2010 graduate, New York Yankee tradition is an all-American affair. "It's not a coincidence that the words 'Yankees' and 'America' consist of the exact amount of letters," wrote the 13-year-old in his winning essay on Yankees tradition. "They

are one in tradition and meaning."

The Lynbrook, L.I., native is one of nine grand prize winners in the Daily News' 2018 Field of Dreams essay contest. Each year, The News accepts essay submissions from young people around the tristate area and beyond, with the best nine essays earning them the once-in-a-lifetime thrill of running out onto the field with the Yankees' starting lineup at the Stadium and standing with the players during the national anthem.

Nicholas and his fellow winners will get their moment in the spotlight Wednesday during the game against the Baltimore Orioles.



In his winning essay, Nicholas featured a pair of poems about both being a Yankee fan and an American. According to his essay, a Yankee "never abandons one in need" and always "keeps loyal to the rules of the game." Nicholas' Yankees fandom is rooted in family tradition — his grandfather grew up watching legends like Babe Ruth and Yogi Berra. One day, he hopes to be able to tell his grandkids about seeing current stars Aaron Judge and Giancarlo Stanton smash tape-measure home runs at Yankee Stadium.

The young slugger is actually a "Yankee" himself, having played for a Little League team named after the storied franchise. "It means an honor to wear the pinstripes," Nicholas told The News. "If you get drafted (by the team) you fulfill a lifelong dream."

Thank you to *Adrenaline Entertainment* who performed several shows for our students. The shows were awesome and all of the kids had a great time!










Student Spotlight

heard telling jokes to his teachers and friends. His favorite activities in school are soccer and playing with cars and legos.


James (left) on the playground with a friend

Room 5 Learning About the Rain Forest




