Charity Fabric: Pam R. reported to the guild the results of a recent fabric buying trip taken by Pam, Lynda P. and teri L. to Choice fabrics in Springfield Tenn. An anonymous church member donated \$300.00 to buy fabrics for the Redbird Charity quilts, this and 121.37 from the Bee's account purchased approximately 135 yards of fabric at approximately \$3.12/yard.
