- Do not mark NEW women veterans when they are renewing.

Please let your members know that if they pay online, they need to let you know. Members can now also pay by phone using a credit/debit card. Call National at 1-317-569-4500 and tell them you want to pay your dues by phone. National is sending out cards for the 2019-2020 year until then they must let you know. Do not give them a card. They can only pay the current years dues. If they owe 2018 or before they will pay 2020 first to be current...this will be a rejoin member.

You can also pay others over the phone at National. Example...I can pay all my daughters, granddaughters and great-granddaughters. Hey maybe I will ask if I can pay another relative for friend. Doesn't hurt to ask.

- Encourage Legion Family members to fly an American flag at their home.
- Provide American flags to your local schools for classrooms.

- Identify and distribute assembled pocket flags to active-duty military overseas.
- Encourage Auxiliary members to contact state and federal representatives and ask them to support the flag amendment.
- Encourage members to participate in Get Out the Vote and Kids Voting USA campaigns. For more information, refer to www.legion.org/vote and www.kidsvotingusa.org.
- Work with local schools to further education of the U.S. Constitution, either whole or in part such as the Bill of Rights or the Preamble.

- Contact your local school teachers to see if they would be interested in hosting a Veterans in the Classroom event.
- Provide information to the teacher hosting your program about the challenges facing today's military families.
- The teacher can introduce the topic before your unit's presentation. It may be helpful to reference the article that was published in the Legion's magazine at http://www.legion.org/magazine/162500/hardest-year.
- Promote your Veterans in the Classroom event through local media and on your own social media accounts.
- Volunteer to provide transportation to and from the school for the veteran speaking in the classroom.
- Wear your American Legion Auxiliary apparel when you visit classrooms.

As a senior member who graduated from the Junior program, I know how important it is to have chairmen who believe in preparing girls to become active adult members of the organization by providing positive volunteer experiences that instill the ideals of the Auxiliary.

Throughout the year through this bulletin I will post ideas of projects you can do with your Juniors. I would also like it if you have any ideas that you share with the rest of us, by sending them to me. In as much as we are celebrating the 100th birthday let's make it a fun year!

Ideas:

- Get your school or unit involved in making Pocket Flags for Veterans Day, see if you can have all the classes in your school fold flags for military personnel. Talk to your principal or counselor and explain that you are a member of the American Legion Auxiliary. Explain that you want to teach classmates about Veterans Day and that they can make a difference in a military service member by doing little projects like folding Pocket Flags. You could also use this as an opportunity to work towards a patch. You could give a presentation about what the flag represents and the meaning behind it. Your school may not be able to pay for the flags, so talk to them about fundraising ideas. You could sell suckers at lunch on every Friday for a month. Visit the link http://www.pocketflagproject.com for more information.
- Write thank you letters. Contact a nursing home or veteran's home near your unit and ask how many veterans live there. Then get other Juniors in your unit or friends together and write thank you letters to them. To tell how much you appreciate their service and sacrifice they gave to our country. You can even include drawings of flags, or a picture of poppies.
- Collect items for the Give 10 to Education project. With other Juniors in your unit or with friends collect items for students in your school who has a parent in the military or National Guard. Work with your teacher or school counselor on how to get the items to the students.

Legislative

October 2019

Greetings,

We have a lot to catch up on, so I am going to try and make this as short as possible.

First and foremost, the American Legion Auxiliary has recently had an eligibility change by Congress. Simply, the verbiage on the application and in the National Standing Rules and Bylaws has been changed from "Wife" to "Spouse". This will now include men. There are many female service members whom when they are deployed leave behind their spouses and children. This change allows their spouses to join a unit and receive assistance and support if needed.

According to Military.com, on the week of August 29, U.S. Customs and Immigration rolled out a disastrous new policy that delineates U.S. residency requirements for the purpose of U.S. citizenship as it applies to children born abroad. The policy goes into effect on October 29, 2019 and will affect the following: Children of parents who have never lived in the U.S. or established residency, children of couples including a U.S. citizen and non-citizen, children of non-citizens serving in the <u>armed</u> <u>forces</u>, and non-citizen children adopted by U.S. citizens. The new policy unleashed a firestorm of criticism for its poorly worded verbiage, leaving many thinking that USCIS was revoking birthright. Their data indicates this policy would have affected only "20 to 25 children a year." USCIS sought to clarify the changes with the media.

On September 2nd, a former Marine temporarily had his five weapons confiscated by the FBI from remarks he made at a protest against ANTIFA. The temporary seizure came through the use of <u>Oregon's</u> "Red Flag" Law.

On September 12, 2019 the U.S. House Judiciary Committee met to discuss acting on the impeachment of President Trump. Representative Lesko and Representative Biggs spoke out against the action.

Also, on September 12, 2019 the 2nd 2020 Democratic debate was held in Houston. Out of the ten contenders in attendance, three notable names were Bernie Sanders, Elizabeth Warren and Former Vice President Joe Biden. There was a contentious debate over healthcare and the China Trade Deal.

In conclusion, please write letters to your Congressmen and women about healthcare and Medicare benefits and to ensure long term adequacy and stability of social security.

The meeting was called to order at 10:05 a.m. by Chairman Dylan Dalzotto. The opening ceremony was conducted and guests introduced.

The newly selected AVHOF Inductees were congratulated.

Pat Upah (Col, USA, Ret) gave a report on the Honor House. Their mission is to bring resources to the veterans in their homes. The have a Vet Centered Care Program which encourages veterans to take control of their own feelings. The Honor House was founded by a severely wounded Iraqi Veterans in 2011. They are located at 8433 N. Black Canyon Hwy, Suite 164, Phoenix, AZ8502. For more information you can check out their web page at thehonorhouse.org.

Marie Culpepper, Director of Community and Business Development for Canyon State Academy presented information on how the academy student volunteers can help at veteran service organization events. The academy is located on 180 acres. It is a group home for boys and girls between the ages of 4 and 17. The majority of students are boys. They have 50 beds, the stay is between 6 and 12 months. If they are close to completing the program a waiver can be granted if the 12 months is reached, to allow the child to finish the program they are enrolled in. They are located at 20061 E. Rittenhouse Road, Queen Creek 85142. Their website is canyonstateacaemy.com. Marie's email is marie.culpepper@rop.com. Telephone: 480-987-9700.

Tom Hodges gave a briefing on Saddlebrooke Veterans Club, Tucson's Troop Support Program. Email: info@saddlebrookertroopsupport.org; Webpage: www.saddlebrooketroopsupport.org. The 25-member nonprofit Saddlebrooke Veterans Club's mission is to provide Southern AZ veterans with gift cards, financial assistance, and emergency funds for financially-strained, vetted military families and National Guard troops. They stock and maintain three military food banks with items collected from donations and provide baby layettes for military families in need. They also support the Military Lounge at Tucson International Airport with snacks, computers, and a place to relax for troops awaiting departure to their next station. Lastly, they have partnered with GoGog.com, which helps transitioning service members connect with identified and matched civilian employment opportunities.

Roll Call was taken, a quorum was established, motion was made and second for approval of June's minutes, approved.

The treasurer's report was given. The total funds in all accounts is \$69,040.47 as of 31 August 2019.

Ken Garcia from Representative Gallego's Office gave a report on what Representative Gallego has been working on and how he is helping the veterans.

Dr. Maureen McCarthy, Chief of Staff for the VA Medical Center gave a report on the new Mission Act and advised the membership that they are currently recruiting for some positions at the VA. (See attached flyers). The Veteran's Resource Center has served over 7,000 veterans since is opening. Due to

the Center, Patient Advocate complaints have reduced by 30%. The Phoenix VA received national recognition for the improvement of access to the Primary Care Clinics. There will be a Women's Town Hall Meeting on Tuesday, October 1 at the VA Medical Center 650 E Indian School Road. Starting a 5:30 p.m. (I think that is the time, will check on it and let you know if it is different).

Currently they are taking Agent Orange claims but they will not be processed until after the first of the calendar year.

The nominations for officers within the UAV is moving up one month to November, since the December meeting has been cancelled due to Pearl Harbor Day.

The new Director for the National Cemetery reported that the Undersecretary for the VA is coming to Phoenix. He will be here October 22-23.

Terry Araman gave the legislative report. There was not much to discuss since the legislature in not in session. The Veterans Caucus will be getting together with the legislators towards the end of September, or early October to discuss legislation.

Terry reminded the members that nominations for the Coper Shield and Copper Star are due no later than 30 September.

Judith Hatch gave a report on the upcoming Pearl Harbor Day. Invites have gone out to all past participants request information as to whether they plan on participating again this year. There will be a flyover, groups were given information as to how they can contribute to the flyover (see attached flyer). The Navy, Marine, POW/MIA and Arizona flags need to be replaced.
