**AN ORDINANCE EXTENDING ONE YEAR CONTRACT OF EMPLOYMENT TO VILLAGE
EMPLOYEES AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

This Council of Amelia Village, Ohio met in Special session on April 20, 2019, at the Amelia Police Station / Mayor’s Court Building with the following members present:

WHEREAS, Amelia Village is committed to providing its residents with the finest services possible and understand that there is a potential for the filing of Petitions for Surrender of Corporate Powers, and;

WHEREAS, Amelia Village recognizes that the provision of these services is contingent upon its hiring and retaining personnel who are dedicated to serving the needs of the residents of Amelia Village; and

WHEREAS, Amelia Village believes that its current staff are such personnel and wishes to retain that staff to ensure the efficient and orderly provision of Village services;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of Amelia Village, Clermont County, Ohio, that;

SECTION I. Upon a motion duly made and adopted the rules requiring two (2) separate readings on two (2) separate dates are suspended to permit the adoption of this Ordinance as an Emergency measure.

SECTION II. All employees of Amelia Village are hereby incurred into a one year contract of employment conditioned upon the effective passage of Surrender Corporate Powers by the electors of the Village and such contract shall take effect upon that date.

SECTION III. Employment Agreements as described in Section II will take effect as to all Village employees, and will be consistent with each employee’s current terms of employment.

SECTION IV. At the expiration date for the Employment Agreements, employees shall revert to the employment status assigned to them prior to the execution of the Employment Agreements.

SECTION V. Council hereby finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of its committees, if any, which resulted in formal action, were taken in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with applicable legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION VI. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure for the preservation of the public health and safety and the general welfare of the Village. Specifically, its adoption is necessary to retain the Village employees necessary to ensure the daily operation of the Village as well

as the efficient provisions of services to Village residents. Therefore, this ordinance shall go into immediate effect.

MR. FISCHER moved to suspend the rules requiring two readings on two separate dates.

MR. FITE seconded the motion.


