Despite all the money coming in on Stanford as the line went from Colorado +7 to +10, the Buffaloes pulled off the biggest upset of the weekend shocking Cardinal backers (including us) with a 35-32 underdog win. Colorado is a surprising 2-0 under first-year coach Karl Dorrell pulling back-to-back outright upsets.

Wake Forest is 6-1 ATS this year covering by an average of 10 ppg.
BYU is 6-1-1 ATS this year covering by an average of 13 ppg.
Kansas is 0-6-1 ATS this year failing to cover by an average of 12 ppg.
Penn St is 0-4 ATS this year failing to cover by an average of 14 ppg.
Utah St is 0-4 ATS this year failing to cover by an average of 12 ppg.
Kansas games are 6-0-1 to the OVER this year by an average of 7 ppg.
Florida games are 5-1 to the OVER this year by an average of 17 ppg.
South Alabama games are 7-1 to the UNDER this year by an average of 6 ppg.

Misleading Finals

Ohio (-27) beat Akron 24-10. However, Akron had 20-15 first down and 435-307 yard edges but were -3 in TO's.

Boise St (-14) beat Colorado St 52-21. However, Colorado St had a 315-291 yard edge. Boise St blocked two punts that were returned for touchdowns in the first half. They also returned a blocked field goal 91 yards for a score late in the first quarter. It was the first time Boise State had multiple blocked kicks returned for touchdowns in a game since moving to the FBS in 1996.

Nebraska (+2.5) upset Penn St 30-23. However, Penn St Penn St had 30-17 first down and 501-298 yard edges. Nebraska led 27-6 at halftime thanks to a fumble return TD. The Nittany Lions would dominate the second half but missed a FG and were stopped on downs twice inside Nebraska's 15-yard line in the 4Q.

Virginia (-6) beat Louisville 31-17. However, Louisville had a 478-368 yard edge including 317-165 on the ground. UVA got a 85-yard interception return TD in the first quarter (minimum 10-point swing).

Bad Beats

Toledo (+1) backers were covering the entire game until the final seconds. UT did get a questionable spot in their favor on 4th & 11 that eventually allowed them to score a TD with 2:54 left to take a 38-28 lead. Western Michigan scored a TD with :45 left, then recovered an inside kick. They faked a spike (shades of Dan Marino vs the Jets) and scored a TD with :17 left for the win and cover.

Wake Forest led 45-24 mid-3Q but NC scored 35 straight points to take a 59-45 lead. Wake (+12.5) backers were going to suffer a really bad beat but the Demon Deacons converted a 3&18 and got a TD with :57 left for the back door.

It was not only a bad week for **South Carolina** head coach Will Muschamp but also Gamecocks' backers suffered a bad beat on Saturday night. SC (+12.5) led 42-38 early 4Q before the Rebs' scored the game's final 21 points. The Gamecocks were stopped on downs at the Ole Miss 5-yard line with under 2 minutes left.

If you bet **OVER 51 in Oregon St/Washington**, you have our sympathies. It was 24-21 at halftime and all you needed was 7 points in the second half. The teams were inside the 10-yard line THREE times and you get just 3 total points!

Games in Rotation Order

HOME TEAM IN CAPS

Wednesday, November 18th

BALL ST 37 Northern Illinois 26. We get that Northern Illinois is off to a horrible 0-2 SU and 0-2 ATS start but we feel Ball St is getting way too much love in the market with this line. Remember, by far the MAC's best team Buffalo was only a 14-point favorite vs NIU (albeit on the road) just two weeks ago. The Cardinals haven't been overly impressive in close games vs Miami, OH and Eastern Michigan that were decided in the final seconds. We lean NIU.

Toledo 33 EASTERN MICHIGAN 27. It's tough getting margin on Eastern Michigan as the Eagles while 0-2 SU on the season are 2-0 ATS with close road losses at Kent St and Ball St. Toledo (+1) backers were covering the entire game until the final seconds last week. They led 38-28 but Western Michigan scored a TD with :45 left, then recovered an onside kick. They faked a spike (shades of Dan Marino vs the Jets) and scored a TD with :17 left for the win and cover. Has Toledo recovered from that heart-breaking loss? Slight lean on EMU.

CENTRAL MICHIGAN 31 Western Michigan 29. Best MAC matchup of the week as these two both enter at 2-0 SU and ATS. Tight series as the two teams have split their last 30 meetings. We lean with CMU here as we will fade Western Michigan off that improbable win last week as the Broncos scored 2 TD's in the final minute to beat Toledo. Even in Year 2, CMU head coach Jim McElwain is probably the best coach in the MAC.

Thursday, November 19th

WYOMING 34 Utah St 14. If you're wondering why this line is so high, note 0-4 SU/ATS Utah St not only has an interim coach but also just dismissed their starting QB Jason Shelley this weekend. Redshirt frosh Cooper Legas (3rd string) will get the start as the backup Andrew Peasley has tested positive for COVID. Meanwhile, Wyoming saw their game vs Air Force cancelled due to COVID last week. Wyoming hasn't laid 20 points vs an FBS team since 2013. They were 24.5-point favorites vs FCS Idaho last year and didn't cover as the Pokes are 5-14-1 ATS laying 17 or more since late 1996. Pass.

TULSA 31 Tulane 25. Tulane was our only winner on these pages last week as they dominated Army. If you would have told us prior to the weekend, what game worries us the most among our picks it would have been Tulane as all the money was on Army (line went from Tulane -5 to -3). Go figure. They're taking on a Tulsa team that rallied from a 21-0 deficit to beat SMU. The Golden Hurricane are now in prime position to make the AAC Championship game if they take care of business. Tough spot here for Tulane traveling on a short week. We lean OVER.

Friday, November 20th

LOUISVILLE 38 Syracuse 19. Would like to back an underrated Louisville team here who is +47 ppg on the season despite their 2-6 record. TO's continue to be the story as they are -12 on the season. They were +110 yards last week vs Virginia but lost by 14. Most noteworthy is RB Javion Hawkins (822 rush yards) opting out for the rest of the season and WR Tutu Atwell who is injured could do the same. That gives us pause vs a Syracuse team that is -201 ppg on the season and playing with 60 players.

MINNESOTA 30 Purdue 29. Yes, Minnesota has been awful so far this season especially on defense but not sure the Boilers deserve to be road favorites here. Purdue was fortunate to beat Iowa (although in hindsight a good win), they escaped vs a short-handed Illinois team and then last week failed to cover vs Northwestern. WR Rondale Moore looks like he won't be playing this season with each game that passes and Minny has the much better ground game (215 rush ypg vs 61 rush ypg). Lean Minny.

AIR FORCE 30 New Mexico 23. Considering they have been relocated to Las Vegas and will most likely play their entire 2020 season on the road, the Lobos have impressed us the last couple of weeks with easy covers vs Hawaii and Nevada as double-digit dogs. Meanwhile, Air Force has had multiple COVID interruptions this season and is short-handed. Our power ratings say Air Force is the play here but we don't know how many players could be out for them and note new New Mexico DC Rocky Long has had success defending the option.

FLORIDA ATLANTIC 39 Massachusetts 9. Yes, we know that UMass is the worst team in the FBS and have been crushed by 41 points in each of their two games this season. However, it's tough laying 32.5-points with a FAU offense that is averaging just 20 ppg this year! The Owls did find new life last week with QB Javion Posey who set the program's single-game yards rushing mark for a quarterback with 182 yards. Still we lean UMass.

Saturday, November 21st

2★ OREGON 41 UCLA 23. Oregon is -5 in TO's in their first two games so far this season but yet are 2-0 ATS. The Ducks have incredible balance on offense averaging 269 rush ypg (7.1 ypc) and 270 pass ypg. New QB Tyler Shough has completed 68% of his passes and also ran for 166 yards. Oregon has by far the best program in a Pac-12 conference and even though they lost all 5 starters on the offensive line, their superior strength program has done a great job developing. Yes, we were impressed with what UCLA did last Sunday vs Cal (440-176 yard edge) but we think the Bears just weren't ready to start the season as they missed tackles on nearly every play. That blowout win is giving us value here. Maybe their is sentiment in the market for UCLA head coach Chip Kelly returning to Eugene where he was 46-7. The reality is he lost here 42-21 two years ago and we could see something similar here.

2★ PENN ST 24 Iowa 23. Obviously, Iowa has looked the part the last two weeks outscoring Michigan St and Minnesota by a combined 84-14. While only 2-2 on the season, we have the Hawkeyes No. 15 in our power ratings so we do think they are legit. On the other side, while Penn St is 0-4, the Nittany Lions are +77 ypg and have lost 2 games this year despite out-gaining their opponent by more than 200 yards. That includes last week as they dominated the Huskers in the second half but a missed FG and two stopped on downs inside the 15 prevented them from making the huge comeback. If they were going to quit on the season, it would have been at halftime when they trailed 27-6. This seems like a good "buy low, sell high" spot as Penn St tries to avoid their first 0-5 start in school history.

Virginia Tech 29 PITTSBURGH 28. Not sure we trust VT here to lay more than a FG on the road. The Hokies played a short-handed Miami team last week and despite having a 24-13 lead, they lost to drop to 4-4. It was their 2nd straight heart-breaking defeat. Meanwhile, Pitt saw their game vs Georgia Tech cancelled due to COVID issues for the Panthers. As of press time it is unknown who will be out for them, if anyone is. If Pitt is reasonably healthy, they are the play for us here as the Panthers are +62 ypg on the season and just got back QB Kenny Pickett in a blowout win over FSU.

Georgia Tech at Miami, FL has been postponed due to COVID issues at Miami. Wake Forest at Duke has been postponed due to COVID issues at Wake Forest.

East Carolina 31 TEMPLE 27. If you're wondering how in the heck can lowly East Carolina be laying more than a FG on the road, it's because Temple is down to their 4th string QB Matt Duncan here. The Owls have been blown out in each of their last 3 games without starting QB Anthony Russo. ECU certainly has the QB edge with Holton Ahlers but we're not overly excited about laying more than a FG with a ECU defense allowing 40 ppg and 487 ypg.

Cincinnati 33 UCF 30. Obviously, Cincinnati has been dominant in their last 4 games winning them by an average of 33.5 ppg and covering them by 23 ppg. Last week, they literally ran up the score vs ECU including a fake punt up 42-10 and a 75-yard run in the closing seconds. However, they're playing a talented UCF team that should be playing with a chip on their shoulder here catching nearly a TD at home. Despite, having Cincinnati No. 11 in our power ratings (as high as any Group of 5 team ever), the ratings say UCF is the clear play. We do worry about their defense that recently saw 4 players dismissed.

GEORGIA 34 Mississippi St 10. It will be interesting to see how either team handles the rest of the season with their preseason goals mostly by the wayside. Miss St beat Vanderbilt in their last game but were outgained by 274 yards as they benefited from +5 TO's. Meanwhile, Georgia has now lost 2 games on the season and barring a Florida collapse won't be going back to Atlanta for the SEC Champ game for the 4th consecutive season. It will be interesting to see if JT Daniels plays at all this year. We're not getting involved.

COASTAL CAROLINA 24 Appalachian St 21. What a matchup for the Sun Belt here. We were all set in taking Appalachian St but their QB Zac Thomas is questionable after taking a hard hit last week in the win over Georgia St. Yes, the unbeaten Chanticleers were a darling for us on these pages earlier this season, but now we think they are too expensive in the market especially against a program that has been by far the best in the conference for the last half decade. Until Thomas' injury situation clears, we're sitting on the sidelines for now.

Clemson 49 FLORIDA ST 14. This is the largest underdog role in the history of Florida State football! It is deserved considering Clemson should be plenty angry coming off a bye and a rare regular season loss in double-overtime to Notre Dame. On top of it, they get the return of QB Trevor Lawrence who has missed the last couple of games due to COVID. Will he show rust early? On the other side, Florida St is short-handed and has been crushed in their last 3 games. They have had multiple players opt out and many more are banged up. Only one way to go here but the market has moved several points since open.

Navy 30 SOUTH FLORIDA 29. Navy comes in off a double bye after dealing with some COVID issues. The Middies are -137 ypg and we think they are worse than their 3-4 record. Meanwhile, USF has lost 7 straight games but even at 1-7 are "only" -94 ypg on the season. We like the OVER here as USF games are averaging 58 total ppg and their defense looks gassed while Navy games are averaging 59 total ppg. **Game was just cancelled before we went to press.**

Missouri 30 SOUTH CAROLINA 27. So many question marks in this one. First, South Carolina fired Will Muschamp this week after the Gamecocks' 59-42 loss to Ole Miss. The Gamecocks should have covered the game (see page 1). Mike Bobo will be the interim coach here but they did see their two starting CB's leave the team after the announcement. How fired up will they be for the rest of the year? Meanwhile, Missouri has been dealing with COVID issues and are short-handed. "The way I have it, we're at 56 scholarship players, with one of those being suspended in the first half, and we still have two tests to go," head coach Eli Drinkwitz said. "So I don't know what our final roster or number will look like, but we are committed to playing this week." We're guessing this one might not get played and even if it did, your guess is as good as ours.

MARYLAND 30 Michigan St 27. We're not big into conspiracy theories but we do think that it is rather peculiar that Maryland couldn't play vs Ohio St last week but somehow can this week? Considering how stringent the Big Ten's COVID policies are we're guessing this one might not get played and note Maryland didn't practice on Monday. The Terps did become the first team ever to pull back-to-back outright upsets as 18-point or underdogs vs Minnesota and Penn St. They're taking on a dreadful Michigan St team that has been exposed the last two weeks vs Iowa and Indiana. However, we don't feel like laying nearly a full TD here when we're not sure who is playing or not. Lean MSU.

OHIO ST 41 Indiana 21. This is the 4th biggest point spreads involving two Top 10 teams ever. It's clear that one team (Ohio St) is a legit National Title contender while the other (Indiana) has been a nice story. The Buckeyes saw their game vs Maryland cancelled last week and they can ill afford to have another one or two cancelled if they want to make the CFB Playoff. QB Justin Fields has an 11-0 ratio and is completing a ridiculous 87% of his passes. Meanwhile, Indiana is 4-0 and feeling good after comfortable wins over Michigan and Michigan St. Our power ratings have this one right at the number. Pass.

NC STATE 35 Liberty 31. Liberty sits at 8-0 and already has a pair of wins vs ACC teams in Syracuse and Virginia Tech. It was the same VT team that crushed NC State earlier this year. Liberty QB Malik Willis is probably a Top 10-15 QB in the country as he is completing 68% of his passes with a 15-to-1 TD-to-INT ratio and 700 rushing yards and 9 more TD's. The Flames are taking on a NC State team that has exceeded expectations this year and has a chance to finish 8-3 with only Syracuse and Georgia Tech on deck. It should be noted the Wolf Pack are -59 ypg on the season. Too close to call for us.

Michigan 33 RUTGERS 23. Last week the Wolverines fell behind 28-0 at halftime to Wisconsin, their largest deficit at home since the Big House opened in 1927, and finished with their most lopsided loss at home since a 1935 loss to Ohio State! "We were thoroughly beaten in every phase," coach Jim Harbaugh acknowledged after the latest loss dropped Michigan to its worst start since 1967. "We didn't do anything well. We did not play good. We did not coach good." The Wolverines were missing their starting OT's, Jalen Mayfield and Ryan Hayes, along with DE's, Aidan Hutchinson and Kwity Paye, due to injuries. On the other side, Rutgers has been overrated in the market since their opening season win at Michigan St as they lost outright as a favorite to Illinois last week. We think UM bounces back here but don't want to lay more than 10.

Charlotte at Marshal has been postponed due to COVID issues at Charlotte.

ARMY 23 Georgia Southern 19. Army is overrated due to a ridiculously weak strength of schedule where they have played only two teams in our Top 100 and lost to both of them (Georgia Southern ranks No. 91 this week). We cashed against Army last week in our only winner on these pages as they fell to Tulane 38-12. On the other side, we also think Georgia Southern is overrated as the Eagles are 5-1 in games decided by 7 points or less this season. Last week in what we thought was a good spot vs Texas St, they only won by 2 despite a 386-30 rushing yard edge. Lower scoring game with both teams knowing how to defend each other's option. We're passing at the current numbers.

Usc 30 UTAH 27. First game of the season for Utah who has been dealing with COVID issues. Coach Whittingham said "We tried to do everything in our power the last couple of weeks to play but between the 53 available scholarship players and/or a position group being decimated, that knocked us out of competition." Who knows who will be in or out for them here. Meanwhile, other than QB Kedon Slovis' late drive heroics we have not impressed at all with 2-0 SU but 0-2 ATS USC who has nearly lost outright as a double-digit favorite to Arizona St and Arizona. If we knew Utah was going to be relatively healthy, we'd bad back the Utes here.

Arizona State at Colorado is cancelled due to COVID issues at ASU.

COLORADO ST 37 Unlv 21. This game could be cancelled as UNLV Athletic Director Desiree Reed-Francois said on Wednesday morning the Rebels are waiting the results of their Tuesday tests to determine whether or not they can play. UNLV is 0-4 SU and 0-4 ATS on the season and will be a double-digit underdog in every game this year. Tough start for first-year head coach Marcus Arroyo. Meanwhile, the Rams are off a misleading blowout loss to Boise St where the Broncos had 3 special teams TD's. We could only look towards Colorado St here especially if the Rebels are short-handed

WESTERN KENTUCKY 24 Florida International 16. A match-up of two very disappointing teams. FIU is 0-4 SU and 1-3 ATS on the season after a blowout loss to FAU last week. Did you know FIU's only cover came against unbeaten Liberty this year? Of course, we had Liberty in that one on these pages and if you played that game today the Flames are laying more than 3 TD's! Sigh! On the other side, WKU beat a lowly Southern Miss team last week but failed to cover the spread as the Hilltoppers are 1-7-1 ATS this year. Do you really feel like laying more than a TD with a WKU offense averaging only 15 ypg? Lean UNDER.

Rice 34 NORTH TEXAS 31. Welcome back to the 2020 CFB season North Texas as we last saw the Mean Green on October 17th. In case you forgot, they are all offense averaging 39 ppg and 594 ypg and no defense allowing 44 ppg and 549 ypg. On the other side, Rice is a team we have wanted to play on and while we easily cashed with them a few weeks ago, they've seen their last two games cancelled. The Owls have only played two games this season but they both have been more recent than North Texas who has played 5 this year. That's 2020 for you folks.

WASHINGTON 34 Arizona 21. Both teams have played only one game so far this season. Even though Arizona is 0-1 and Washington is 1-0, we were more impressed with what we saw from the Wildcats in their near upset of USC. Arizona QB Grant Gunnell "There's definitely some disappointment, especially when it's that close and everyone is saying you're the underdog — literally everyone," Gunnell said. "But we're optimistic and we're driven. That's the 20th-ranked team in the nation and our first game of the year." Meanwhile, Washington had 24-16 first down and 408-252 yard edges and were also +2 in TO's in a non-cover vs Oregon St. The Huskies got a friendly spot when Oregon St was driving in for a score late in the game. Our ratings say Washington is the play but we don't have enough of a sample size yet from either team.

1★ OREGON ST 26 California 25. Cal has had an interesting last two weeks to say the least. First, they saw their opener vs Washington cancelled. Then their game at Arizona St was also cancelled. On Friday, it was announced they would play at UCLA on Sunday and the Bears would get crushed. UCLA had 23-11 first down and 440-176 yard edges including 244-54 on the ground. It looked like Cal hadn't done much tackling in fall practice. "We haven't played a football game in about a year. We haven't played anyone but ourselves in a real, live game scenario, live tempo, tackling, everything, in about a year. So there are obviously going to be some hurdles there," QB Chase Garbers said. How much can they improve in one week vs a 0-2 Oregon St team that has a pair of close losses?

STANFORD 33 Washington St 30. Folks, that was as ugly as it gets with Stanford last week. First, we were supremely confident on Gameday as our Stanford -7 selection had turned into Stanford -10 as the Cardinal were getting back QB Davis Mills. However, Colorado boat-raced them and the 35-32 final was indicative on how bad the Cardinal looked. This program is certainly trending in the wrong direction after a historical decade from 2008-2018. Meanwhile, Washington State blew a double-digit lead vs Oregon last week. The Cougars were "gifted" 3 TO's early but the Ducks easily out-played them in the second half. Tough seeing the Cardinal dropping to 0-3.

FRESNO ST 28 San Jose St 27. San Jose St is 4-0 for the first time since 1955! They're also 4-0 ATS but we think you're starting to pay a premium on them now. We think Fresno St is still under-valued in the market as after a tough opening loss to Hawaii, the Bulldogs have won and covered 3 straight games. However, Fresno has also played against fellow new coaching staffs in Hawaii, Colorado St and UNLV along with a interim coach last week at Utah St. That prevents us from making this a play. We do like the UNDER as San Jose St games are only averaging 44 total ypg.

Utah 30 SOUTHERN MISS 21. One of the biggest early line movers of the week is this one as we bet UTSA -3 on Sunday. Southern Miss looks like they are just playing out the season with a 3rd string coach and a 3rd string QB. Meanwhile, UTSA looks to have gotten their mojo back last week with a blow-out win over UTEP as they outscored the Miners 35-0 in the final 31 minutes! It was interesting that the team announced they had dismissed DC Tyrone Nix at halftime. Some value lost here with the big line move.

NEVADA 24 San Diego St 23. This matchup will now be the 3:30 game on CBS with Brad Nessler and Gary Danielson on the call. Good for both teams to get that type of national exposure in what should be a competitive game. The Aztecs rebounded from the loss to San Jose St two weeks ago with a dominant performance vs Hawaii last week (led 28-0 at halftime). They're taking on a 4-0 Nevada team that has the best QB in the Mountain West in Carson Strong. We lean home team.

NEBRASKA 35 Illinois 21. Illinois gets back QB Brandon Peters for this one although they probably stick with Isaiah Williams who ran for 192 yards and a TD in the upset over Rutgers last week. Meanwhile, Nebraska got an upset over Penn St last week although it was misleading as the Huskers were out-gained by more than 200 yards! They nearly blew a 27-6 halftime lead. "The state needed it, the team needed it, I needed it," Frost said. "We talked at halftime, and I talked to them frankly, that we've been in this situation before. You need to learn how to win. Winning will help the kids know they can win going forward." Nebraska QB Luke McCaffrey was 13 of 21 for 152 yards and a 1-1 ratio while running for 67 yards and a TD in his first start. We lean UNDER.

Houston at SMU game was postponed due to COVID issues at Houston.

ARKANSAS 31 Lsu 30. LSU was laying 42 in this game last year and early this week was actually catching points vs Arkansas. That's the largest point spread difference in one year that we've ever seen. It is deserved considering how bad the Tigers have looked so far this season. This is their first game in a couple weeks and it looks like they are doing better as far as the COVID situation goes. They're taking on a Arkansas team that disappointed us greatly last week on these pages. If you told us before the game, that the Hogs would score 35 points, we'd say our chances of covering the 17.5-point spread would've been 85-90%. Wrong! As they allowed 63 to the Gators! Our power ratings say this game is right at the number but we feel Arkansas has the better coaching staff and the better QB (TJ Finley will start for LSU).

Wisconsin 26 NORTHWESTERN 19. The winner of this one mostly likely heads to Indianapolis as the winner of the West Division. Wisconsin was ready, not rusty, in its first game in three weeks as they crushed Michigan last week. Wisconsin had 26-10 first down and 468-219 yard edges including 341-47 on the ground. They're taking on a 4-0 Northwestern team that has already topped last year's season win total. The Wildcats have won three straight close games and they were outgained by both Iowa and Nebraska. Wisconsin is clearly better but we don't want to lay more than a TD vs NW's tough defense.

ALABAMA 41 Kentucky 14. Kentucky hasn't lost a game by more than 3 TD's since 2017 as it is tough to get margin on a team that has a rush-oriented offense and usually plays sound defensively. Obviously, the Wildcats haven't played Alabama in that time frame, but we're thinking the Crimson Tide could be a bit rusty after missing the last few weeks. Kentucky only beat Vanderbilt by 3 last week but the Commodores scored a couple of late TD's. More importantly, UK got back Terry Wilson at QB.

Florida 48 VANDERBILT 17. Obviously, Florida crushed us on these pages last week as QB Kyle Trask was 23 of 29 for 356 yards and 6 TD's and Trask is now the Heisman favorite! He's taking on a Vandy team that has been scrappy this year with covers vs Texas A&M, Mississippi St and last week vs Kentucky. We're not in the business of laying this kind of number on the road but if Florida head coach Dan Mullen gets a chance to pad Trask's stats, he will.

1★ OKLAHOMA 35 Oklahoma St 24. Bedlam! Even with Oklahoma St on a historical run as a program under head coach Mike Gundy, they still play a second-fiddle to in-state rival Oklahoma. The Sooners are on a 15-2 SU (+13 ppg) and 11-5-1 ATS (+4.4 ppg) run in the series since 2003. We also believe Oklahoma despite their two losses is one of the best teams in the country. They have won and covered 4 straight games. They are now healthy and their young QB Spencer Rattler has more experience. Oklahoma St should have beat Texas but they also probably should have lost at Kansas St. We like the Sooners here.

IOWA ST 29 Kansas St 20. Both teams come in off a bye in what is a very important game in the Big 12 race. It is tough laying double-digits with Iowa St who struggles getting margin (4-7 ATS as a double-digit favorite since mid-2018). Meanwhile, Kansas St is 19-9 ATS as a double-digit underdog since late 2006. The Wildcats are 11-1 SU in this series and should have beat Oklahoma St in their last game. We lean with the Wildcats.

Ole Miss at Texas A&M has been postponed due to COVID issues at A&M.

Georgia St 31 SOUTH ALABAMA 27. Georgia St nearly pulled off a big upset at Appalachian St last week losing by only 4 as 18-point underdogs. They're taking on a South Alabama team that looks like they are running out of gas with 3 straight losses albeit to the better teams in the Sun Belt. The worry has to be a USA run defense that has allowed at least 236 rush yards in each of their last 3 games. Meanwhile, Georgia St averages more than 200 rush ypg.

TEXAS 45 KANSAS 16. Laying points with Tom Herman has never been one of our favorite things to do. However, Kansas pretty much gives you no other option. The Jayhawks are 0-6-1 ATS this year failing to cover by an average of 12 ppg. We actually like the OVER here as Kansas games are 6-0-1 to the OVER this year by an average of 7 ppg and Texas games are averaging 70 total ppg (albeit a lot of that is OT scoring).

TROY 35 Middle Tennessee 24. Interesting matchup here as these two teams played earlier this year with Troy crushing Middle Tennessee in their season opener 47-14 outgaining the Blue Raiders 496-241. It has gotten better for Middle Tennessee since that game as besides last week's blowout loss to a very good Marshall team, they have been competitive (4-2 ATS). Our ratings have this game right at the line.

AUBURN 32 Tennessee 21. Both teams saw their games cancelled last week due to COVID. We can't believe how bad Tennessee has looked recently. The Vols had an 8-game winning streak dating back to last year but have since lost 4 straight games and are also 0-4 ATS. In their last game vs Arkansas, the Vols blew a 13-0 halftime lead. It will be interesting to see what head coach Jeremy Pruitt decides at QB here. Meanwhile, the last time we saw Auburn they were playing their best game of the season with a 48-11 win over LSU. Their offense is starting to get going as they have topped at least 446 total yards and 206 rush yards in each of their last four games. Slight lean OVER.

Arkansas St 36 TEXAS ST 30. You have to give Texas St credit. Despite 7 straight losses, the team is still playing hard and they have covered 3 straight games against the better teams in the Sun Belt. However, they were out-rushed 386-30 last week to Georgia Southern and were probably fortunate to only lose by 2. They're taking on an Arkansas St that has dealt with COVID issues all year and have lost 3 straight after a 4-2 start. We don't see too much value here.

Boise St 38 HAWAII 23. Boise St had a nice bounce back win last week vs Colorado St but note the Broncos did score three special teams TD's something they haven't done in any game since joining the FBS ranks in 1996. Meanwhile, there could be some trouble in paradise as Hawaii has failed to cover 3 straight and last week were dominated by San Diego St (trailed 28-0 at halftime). Boise St is 7-0 SU (+35.6 ppg) and 7-0 ATS (+14 ppg) vs Hawaii since 2009. We lean Boise and the OVER.

MEMPHIS 49 Stephen F. Austin 14. Last week's Memphis-Navy game was cancelled due to COVID issues at Navy. We would have liked Memphis in that match-up. This week the Tigers are taking on a Stephen F. Austin team that has won 6 straight games! However, they haven't played anyone worth of note (multiple Division 2 teams) since they lost 50-7 to SMU back in September. We like Memphis here at anything less than 35.

The Central Arkansas at UL-Lafayette game was cancelled on Wednesday Morning due to COVID issues at UL-Lafayette.

BYU 52 North Alabama 7. The 8-0 Cougars have outscored their opponents by 31 ppg and outgained them by 249 ypg. They're coming off a bye after crushing Boise St. This is the weakest team they have played so far this season as North Alabama is 0-3 but did cover vs Liberty and Southern Miss so far this season. The Lions are getting dominated at the line of scrimmage with a 213-50 rush ypg deficit. It will be interesting to see if BYU can schedule more games since the Pac-12 just announced on Wednesday morning that it will allow non-conference games.

VIRGINIA 49 Abilene Christian 10. Abilene Christian is 1-4 this season and were crushed by Army 55-23. They just lost to a Division II team in Angelo State so it's safe to say they are not a very good FCS team. After a 1-4 start, Virginia has won back-to-back games and with winnable games vs Florida St, Boston College and Virginia Tech to close, they are now thinking winning season.

Week 12 Computer Projected Lines for Every CFB Game

For the past four seasons we have posted computer projected lines for every game. **Games where there was of difference of more than 3 points saw our computer lines actually beat the Vegas line at a 302-252-12 (55%) clip the last three years.** That's pretty solid and actually better than our own handicapping in some seasons. **Last week's plays went 2-4 and now the record for this year is 39-33.** Keep in mind, these computer lines don't take into consideration off-the-field factors like revenge or flat spots. They are basically a power-rating number difference between the two teams that also takes into consideration the home field advantage.

Of the 12 games where our computer is off more than 3 points compared to the Vegas line (highlighted), our favorite team this week to back would be **Oregon -13.5.**

The Comp column is the computer projected line and the Diff column is the difference between the Vegas line and the Computer line. "+" numbers in the difference column say back the underdog. "-" numbers in the difference column say back the favorite. Let us know if you have questions.

Week 12 CFB ATS Trends

1. Toledo is 25-5 SU (+18 ppg) and 17-11-2 ATS (+5.4 ppg) vs Eastern Michigan since 1990. The Rockets are 6.5-point favorites at EMU this week.

2. Northern Illinois is 17-6 SU and 16-7 ATS vs Ball St. However, the Huskies find themselves in their largest underdog role of the series this week catching 15 at Ball St.

3. Wyoming is a 20.5-point favorite vs Utah St this week. Wyoming hasn't laid 20 points vs an FBS team since 2013. They were 24.5-point favorites vs FCS Idaho last year and didn't cover as the Pokes are 5-14-1 ATS laying 17 or more since late 1996.

4. Florida St is a 34.5-point underdog vs Clemson this week. That's the largest underdog role in the history of Florida St football.

5. No. 3 Ohio St is a 20.5-point favorite vs No. 9 Indiana this week. That's the 4th highest point spread involving Top 10 teams ever.

6. LSU was a 42-point favorite vs Arkansas last year. This year they are a 2.5-point favorite. That near 40-point swing is one of the largest we've ever seen in just a year's time.

7. Even with Oklahoma St on a historical run as a program under head coach Mike Gundy, they still play a second-fiddle to in-state Oklahoma. The Sooners are on a 15-2 SU (+13 ppg) and 11-5-1 ATS (+4.4 ppg) run in the series. This week Oklahoma is a 7-point home favorite.

8. Kansas St is 11-1 SU vs Iowa St since 2008 but his year find themselves a 10.5-point underdog at the Cyclones.

9. Kansas St is 48-24-1 ATS as an underdog since 2009 and they are 19-9 ATS as a double-digit underdog since 2006.

10. Boise St is 7-0 SU (+35.6 ppg) and 7-0 ATS (+14 ppg) vs Hawaii since 2009. This week the Broncos are 14-point favorites at Hawaii.

HOME TEAM IN CAPS

Thursday, November 19th

SEATTLE 31 Arizona 27. Obviously, Seattle has finally been exposed losing 3 of their last 4 games. The Seahawks have been outgained in 7 of their 9 games this season. QB Wilson has struggled as of late including 3 TO's vs the Rams last week. On the other side, it was Heartbreak Hotel for us backing Arizona -2.5 last week. After covering for most of the 4Q, the Cardinals gave up a last minute TD to the Bills only to get a "Hail Mary" miracle cover...or not as they took a knee on the extra-point attempt and won by 2. The Cardinals have topped at least 30 points in 5 straight games. Arizona has covered 5 of the last 6 meetings including an upset over Seattle a few weeks back. However, this looks like a good spot to back Seattle here.

Sunday, November 22nd

1★ OVER 47 CLEVELAND 27 Philadelphia 24. Eagles are off to their worst start since 2012, while the Browns are off to their best start since 2012. How pathetic were the Eagles last week? Off a bye they were 0-for-9 on 3rd down and lost outright to the Eagles as we had an embarrassing loser on these pages. It was their first game since 2004 without a 3rd down conversion. Meanwhile, Cleveland's Nick Chubb and Kareem Hunt ran for a combined 230 yards in the non-covering win vs Houston. However, Chubb chose to run out of bounds on what would have been a long TD run much to the dismay of Cleveland -4.5 backers. If you are looking to play totals, we think there is going to be some good value backing Cleveland **OVERS** provided the weather is decent (no wind, just rain here). The Browns have played in two of the worst weather games of the season (vs LV and HOU) and that is suppressing their scoring averages significantly.

NEW ORLEANS 27 Atlanta 23. Drew Brees is out indefinitely after suffering several broken ribs and a collapsed lung. Jameis Winston will get the start here. Obviously, Winston has plenty of upside (led the league in passing last year) but also was the first 30-30 man in NFL history with 30 TD's and 30 INT's last year. The Falcons come in off a bye and like usual, they are playing their best ball of the season after a slow start. They would be 4-0 SU and ATS under interim coach Morris if Todd Gurley would've taken a knee vs Detroit. Do you really want to trust Winston here?

1★ Detroit 26 CAROLINA 24. Teddy Bridgewater was hurt (knee) last week vs Tampa Bay and as of press time it is unknown who will start for Carolina here. It doesn't seem like it is serious and he is expected to practice on Wednesday in a limited basis. PJ Walker, who played under Matt Rhule at Temple, would be the starter if Bridgewater can't go. The Panthers are off a blowout loss to the Bucs last week as they have now dropped 5 straight games and the playoffs are a big long-shot now. Meanwhile, the Lions nearly blew a 21-point lead last week as they needed a 59-yard FG on the final play to beat Washington. They still have playoff hopes but need a win here. Carolina hasn't had a bye and are a tired team with a less than 100% QB. Not all shops have this one up but we did just bet Detroit +1.5 on Wednesday at 3:00pm ET. The Lions are good at PK or better.

New England 24 HOUSTON 23. The Pats' playoff hopes (11 straight appearances) are still kicking after back-to-back primetime wins including last week's shocking upset over the Ravens in the wind and rain. Meanwhile, the Texans are now 0-7 SU this season against teams not named the Jacksonville Jaguars. Last week in the heavy wind and rain, they fell at Cleveland 10-7. On the bright side, QB Watson has a 9-to-0 TD-to-INT ratio in his last 4 games. The Pats should attack a Houston defense that just gave up 230 rush yards to Kareem Hunt and Nick Chubb. Remember the look-ahead line had this one Houston -3 so if the line moves to Pats -3, we will be backing the Texans here.

Pittsburgh 28 JACKSONVILLE 19. For a 9-0 and very popular franchise, the Steelers aren't getting a lot of love in the market place. Last week, they were laying less than a TD at home to Cincinnati and then proceeded to crush the Bengals 36-10. Big Ben had 4 TD passes and 0 INT's for the 12th time in his Hall of Fame career. While this line looks steep, the Jags were just catching 2 TD's in Green Bay last week. They have covered two straight games under QB Jake Luten but this is still a team that's lost 8 straight games and are in solid position to get either Trevor Lawrence or Justin Fields in next year's draft. Pittsburgh has a huge game at home vs Baltimore on Thanksgiving on deck. Lean Jags.

INDIANAPOLIS 27 Green Bay 26. The market really likes this Colts team the last few weeks. First, they flipped to favorite vs Baltimore (proceeded to lose) and then on a short week at Tennessee, Indy again took a ton of money and flipped to favorite. This time their backers were rewarded with a 34-17 win (430-294 yard edge) as QB Rivers threw for 308 yards. Now they welcome in the Packers fresh off a non-cover vs Jacksonville as a big favorite. Green Bay did have a 395-260 yard edge. Neither team has played that tough of a schedule but it should be noted that Indianapolis has played the weakest per Jeff Sagarin. Slight lean on the Packers.

WASHINGTON 24 Cincinnati 23. Washington nearly rallied from a 3 TD deficit vs the Lions last week as they had a 464-372 yard edge. QB Alex Smith was 38 of 55 for 390 yards, all of them career-highs as he makes a strong case for Comeback Player of the Year considering all the surgeries he went through. They're taking on a Cincinnati team that was given too much respect in the market last week catching only 6.5 at unbeaten Pittsburgh. Rookie QB Joe Burrow was pressured 21 times and hit 13 as the Bengals were a miserable 0 for 13 on third down. Washington has outgained each of their last 4 opponents. That has to account for something right? Also Cincinnati is 0-11-1 SU in games decided by 7 points or less the last two years. Add another here.

BALTIMORE 27 Tennessee 21. Obviously, revenge time for Baltimore who lost to the Titans in the playoffs last year despite 29-15 first down and 530-300 yard edges (-3 in TO's). It's clear that the Ravens are nowhere near as good as last year's edition. Last week they were upset as TD favorites in New England on SNF. Meanwhile, Tennessee has extra rest after being outclassed on TNF vs the Colts (outgained 430-294). The Titans have been outgained on the season despite their 6-3 record as we feel both teams are overrated in the cluttered AFC race. Baltimore does have rival Pittsburgh on deck on Thanksgiving. Note if it is close, Baltimore has the best kicker in the NFL in Justin Tucker while Tennessee has Stephen Gostowski who has missed 8 FG's. We're passing for now.

MINNESOTA 27 Dallas 20. Not a great spot here for the Vikings on a short week after thumping the Bears on MNF with a 385-149 yard edge in a 6-point come-from-behind win. QB Kirk Cousins was 0-9 ATS on MNF but got his first win and cover. They have won 3 straight games and are 6-3 ATS this season (0-2 when we've backed them of course). Meanwhile, the Cowboys come in fresh off a bye and will get back QB Andy Dalton here. Dallas showed some fight in their last game as they nearly upset the Steelers. The Cowboys do have Washington on deck on Thanksgiving. We lean with the Cowboys if you can find a "+7.5".

2★ Kansas City 34 LAS VEGAS 24. We know this is the most obvious play of the week but when you have the best QB and one of the best coaches, you're usually not in bad shape as the Pats were close to 60% ATS for 20 years under Belichick and Brady and now the Chiefs are on a 17-1 SU and 15-3 ATS run in their last 18 games with Reid and Mahomes. The lone loser in that run came against the Raiders in Week 5 of this year so they do have revenge. KC is coming off a bye and Andy Reid is 25-6 SU and 21-10 ATS off a bye in his career. On top of it, the Raiders are off a misleading blowout win over the Broncos last week as they were +5 in TO's. The Chiefs need to keep pace with the unbeaten Steelers and get some revenge here.

Miami 24 DENVER 22. We don't like the spot here for the Dolphins but we're tired of fading them on these pages and coming up short. Despite their 6-3 record they have been outgained on the season but have somehow managed 5 straight wins in their best start since 2001. They are playing a Denver team that is off a misleading blowout loss to Las Vegas last week as the Broncos were -5 in TO's. We're not huge fans of Drew Lock who threw 4 INT's last week and reported on Tuesday night, Lock has a severe strain and bruising in his ribs and may not play here. The look ahead line on this game was "Pick" so we originally thought there had been an over-reaction in the market but not now if Lock doesn't play. Note that the early forecast has temps in the upper 40's so it could have been much worse for the South Florida team. Passing for now.

L.A. CHARGERS 28 N.Y. Jets 21. Why in the Hell did we trust the Chargers on these pages last week? We made a case for them statistically as they are much better than their 2-7 record. However, they are horribly coached and shame on us for backing them. We certainly won't back them here laying more than a TD as the Chargers are just 4-10-2 ATS laying points since late 2018 and remarkably have a losing straight up record at 7-9 in those games. As well as rookie QB Justin Herbert has played, they are 1-7 SU in his 8 starts. Meanwhile, the Jets come in off a bye and are still looking for their first win of the season. In their last game, they nearly beat the Patriots but got outscored 13-0 in the 4Q. Joe Flacco will get the start here. We lean with the Jets.

Monday, November 23rd

TAMPA BAY 27 L.A. Rams 22. Really good game here on MNF. The Bucs rebounded off the loss to New Orleans with a blowout win over Carolina last week. Tom Brady threw for 341 yards and 3 TD's. They got WR Antonio Brown into the mix (7 catches) and the Bucs are the first team since the 1994 Houston Oilers to have 3 Pro Bowlers at WR. Meanwhile, the Rams got an important win over the Seahawks as their defense got after QB Russell Wilson. Totals players note the Rams have seen each of their last 6 games go UNDER so that's why you're dealing with a lower total here. We lean Bucs.
