

Nominating Committee Needs Your Help

The 2024 Nominating Committee has been working since May to find candidates to run for 4 board positions. Currently, we have candidates for 2nd Vice President and Secretary. We have made announcements at every guild meeting, and we're spoken to almost everyone in the guild, but we still do not have candidates for President and Treasurer.

We understand that everyone is focused on the 2024 Quilt Show, but we are getting very close to when we need to present our slate of candidates to the membership and vote for these positions. Anyone who fills a position will have the support of the previous position holder and the current board to ensure they're comfortable with the responsibilities of the position.

What happens if we DON'T have nominees for President & Treasurer?

If no one steps up to serve in these positions, we are at risk of losing our 501(c)(3) status. What this means is we would have to regroup as a non-charity organization, losing the benefits of being a 501(c)(3), including all the money we have. That money will have to be redistributed to another charity organization if we do not meet the criteria for being a 501(c)(3) organization.

There is a sense of urgency at this point to find qualified candidates for President and Treasurer. The committee needs to present the slate of candidates at the October meeting.

We are sincerely asking for members who could fill these positions to reach out to one of us to add their name to the ballot or nominate someone whom you think might be appropriate for these positions.

Courthouse Quilters Guild 36th Anniversary Challenge: Portraits

Members were asked to create a portrait quilt using any technique and any subject, the only constraint being the size. The results were a beautiful, diverse collection of quilts depicting those we love, those that inspire us, and those that simply bring us joy. Courthouse Quilters Guild was founded in 1988 in Hunterdon County, New Jersey. The guild's name has roots in the early meeting location and local landmark, the Flemington Courthouse.

Hand-dyed Mandalas - Sisterhood of the Traveling Eyeballs


The "Eyeballs" is a group of fiber artists that have been meeting in Pittstown, New Jersey for more than 10 years sharing creative ideas and projects including dyeing, cyantope, felting, painting, gelli printing and whatever feeds our creative soul: A couple of us had previously dyled mandalas which are created by folding fabric in certain ways and dyed so we got our members on board with each member dyeing more. We then quilted and here are the stunning results! Look closely and you may see unusual forms that showed up!

Mandala means "circle," a geometric pattern symbolizing the universe, which can be used as visual meditation. The Buddhists use as a meditation of a universe of suffering to one of joy, We hope that you enjoy the color and shapes that are in these dyed mandalas.

Faces of Love - Sankofa Quilters Guild

The Sankofa Artisan Guild Philadelphia was established in 2019 by a diverse group of Black women interested in sharing their love of the arts. The guild is member-supported and maintains an open membership, irrespective of artistic expression, for artists interested in realizing the guild's mission. The following works are the result of a two-day workshop where participants created a portrait quilt based on a photo of their choosing. Specific techniques taught by our instructor Rameses, who has used this technique in his own art quilts. We learned step-by-step methods on how to design and sew a portrait quilt. The portraits within this exhibit are the result of joined efforts between both instructor and dedicated artists in the class.

Celebration of the Quilting Art - Newtown Quilters Guild



The art of quilting lends itself to many applications and styles. The Newtown Quilters Guild, celebrating its 35th anniversary in 2024, engages in many different types of quilting including a broad range of philanthropy and quilting challenges. Talented quilters create works of art, whether bed quilts, wallhangings, decorative and practical items or even wearable art.
