

Alicia studied media and marketing communications at Fordham University and the HBCU, Virginia State University.



Bernard Calloway from Broadway's Memphis), "Best Actress in a Musical" (Althea Alexis), "Best Choreographer" (Juson Williams), "Best Musical Direction" (Jeff Bolding). In addition, Lawrence's visionary acuity garnered six nominations and five (5) Award wins for the hit play, Flambeaux: A Caribbean Musical for which he also co-wrote the Libretto and Book.


Other shows Lawrence has directed are Indelible and The Standard Upgrade; MISUNDERSTOOD; TROIKA BERMUDA (2013 National Black Theater Foundation); ResurGENTs: The Reappearance of Hope which Lawrence wrote, directed, and produced and received four MITF Award nominations: Winner Best Choreography, 2011/2013 Artist in Residence for Troika Bermuda (Co-wrote and Directed WIP #3: MISUNDERSTOOD, 2013 National Black Theatre Festival Main Stage Participant) Black Man Rising by James Chapmyn (2007 and 2009 National Black Theatre Festival); four AUDELCO Awards; Players Theatre; Arc Light Theatre; Dr. Barbara Ann Teer's National Black Theatre; and Project Change in Bermuda. Some projects include "Is Heaven Still Blue for the Fallen Angels, " for NEC, and "Starboy" both by Cris Eli Blak, "Black Spurs," and "The History of Black Music," by Celeste Bedford Walker, and the world premiere of "Watch The Throne," at Black Spectrum Theatre.

Lawrence was mentored by the late great director and playwright, Ray Aranha and has studied Playwrighting with the late Leslie Lee, PJ Gibson, Laurence Holder, and Cassandra Medley. Lawrence has studied directing with Yale alumni Jackson Gay and May Alvares, and Daniel Goldstein from Julliard. Lawrence teaches screenwriting at S.I.C. Film School located at Lionsgate in Yonkers, is a theater coach, a proud member of Equity, SAG-AFTRA, and a lifetime member of the legendary Actors Studio.

Lawrence has supervised the release of over fifty projects, and is currently developing literary projects including the follow-up to Dr. Myrah Brown Green's "Brooklyn On My Mind," an untitled "Redd Foxx" project with Actor/Comedian Gil Tucker, "Brothers BBQ," in Charlotte, NC, as well as the historical retelling of the fall of the famous "Moulin Rouge" the first integrated casino in Las Vegas.


JUSTINE J. HALL, Playwright, Co-Dir. as the Wife




