CURRENT/NEW SERMON SERIES

On Sunday, July 29, we began a new sermon series-<u>The Five Sacrifices</u>. The Old Testament Book of Leviticus is often maligned. (I have joked, when leading a "Read the Bible in a Year" group, that, when we completed that particular book we should all get t-shirts that read "I Survived Leviticus"!) But it includes some powerful views on connecting with God AND it is seen as a bridge to God's gift of His Son in the Gospels. One of the most powerful aspects of Leviticus is often referred to as The Five Sacrifices. These "offerings of the law" serve a threefold approach-1. they provide a way to make and keep a right relationship with God, 2. they are a metaphor for Jesus' sacrifice for us and 3. they are a pattern for our own approach to God. The weeks of the series look like this:

Sunday, July 29, 2018- <u>The Burnt Sacrifice</u> (Leviticus 1)

This sacrifice is the first step toward loving God perfectly. (Leviticus 6:13, Romans 12:1-2)

Sunday, August 5, 2018- <u>The Meal Sacrifice</u> (Leviticus 2)

This sacrifice speaks of a life that is dedicated to generosity and giving. (Leviticus 3:11-13, Romans 7:7)

Sunday, August 12, 2018- <u>The Peace Sacrifice</u> (Leviticus 3)

This sacrifice is one of praise and thanksgiving. (Genesis 31:44, Romans 5:1-2) **Sunday, August 19, 2018-** <u>The Sin Sacrifice</u> (Leviticus 4) This sacrifice looks toward our unintentional weaknesses and failures before

God. (Leviticus 4:35b, Romans 3:21-24)

Sunday, August 26, 2018- <u>The Trespass Sacrifice</u> (Leviticus 5) This sacrifice addresses intentional sin. (Psalm 69:13-15, Romans 2:12-13)

VBS 2018

VBS was amazing. Watching all the kids get fired up learning about God helped boost my spirit! Honestly, I thought that this Vacation Bible School was going to be a flop and not really work out, which saddened me with all the work that I put into making Vacation Bible School what it was. But it wasn't. It was awesome. We had 26 kids on Sunday night and we served 76 dinners. On Monday we had 32 kids and we served 83 dinners. On Tuesday night we had 31 kids and served 86 dinners. On Wednesday we had 30 kids and we broke 100 with a total of 102 dinners served.

We also had an Adult Bible Study that was based on the same verses that the children were learning. We had 10 adults participate in the study on Sunday. On Monday we had 10 participate as well! On Tuesday we had 7 adults and on Wednesday we has 8 adults participate!

So adding all the numbers up, adults that participated in the Bible Study =35. We had 119 kids for VBS, and we served 347 meals! It was an amazing VBS and I feel very blessed to have been such a big part of it!

I want to THANK everyone who donated food, money, time, and work to this year's VBS. We had a total of 40 workers, not including the kitchen volunteers who helped make these 4 days special for the children.

We had prayers twice a night where the kids could pray or they could have me pray over them for whatever they had on their hearts. These children that we are helping grow in Christ have such pure hearts and always brought tears to my eyes with the prayers that they came up with. They make me want to be the best person I can be so that they can learn from me.

The program went well! The kids learned 4 songs this year and the adults learned one with their Bible Study. The kids also learned 4 sign language phrases, Find Adventure on the River, Find Acceptance on the River, Find Joy on the River, and Find Rest on the River. I remember learning a word or two in my VBS days but these kids learned 4 whole phrases in just a few days. And another thing we did, which we haven't done in a while, was a Sunday Program. We only did 2 of the songs but we were able to have the kids present for the 10:30 Special Music, and SPE-CIAL it was!
