FEATHERS IN THE WIND

When I was growing up in the 1950s there was a television program every Sunday called "The Big Picture" which showed pictures of World War II. Children my age watched with pride because many of our fathers, uncles and etc. had fought in that war, come home, and started a life.

Then came the 1960s when the conflict in Vietnam developed and grew. We had been too young to know about Korea, but Vietnam stamped us with fear, hatred and a general lack of understanding about what it was about.

As time went on, there were protests and songs and even riots, but nothing really accomplished anything, except heartache. The news pictures of the wounded, seen on a regular basis, made everything seem worse. One just wanted it all to stop. When it did, we all looked around and wondered what had been proven?

When the 50th anniversary of US involvement in World War II came, in 1991, the Amana Heritage Society put on a program, during which several veterans spoke about their experiences.

My father, who was also a World War veteran, showed me how to tie ropes to hang flags properly because, as a sailor, he had to learn these things. I also remember the quiet way in which he instructed my sister and myself in gun safety.

Now, it is over eighty years since the start of the war, and there are very few veterans left. It was an all-encompassing war, the type that I hope we never experience again.

Tom Milligan directs this new, never-before-performed on any stage, comedy by mom-son playwrights, Karen Schaeffer and Alex Schaeffer. They were in the house for the Friday, Dec. 6 opening night and audience members had the opportunity to chat with them about how they came up with the concept and created the script.

We had so much fun! Directed by Tom Milligan you can see his hand for technical detail and according to his "Director Note" in the program, every cast member added his or her own touches. The result is as deliciously frothy as a Christmas egg nog.

The lovely Lisa Margolin stars as Cassidy, the hometown hero who went to LA to become a B-movie screen star but now finds herself back again, cast as Scrooge in a dubious production of a Christmas chestnut directed by an over-reaching ego, Kris (Eric Dunlap). She tries her best amidst on-stage rivalries, a secret romance, costume glitches, egos, temper tantrums, lost props and low budget everything – hey, if you've ever been part of a volunteer community enterprise of any type this all rings like a bell, and lends itself perfectly to a farce.

Things unravel at the very first rehearsal, but the local police detective, Mark, (played by Michael Raabe) a hunk of cynical New York City who can't quite believe he's in this boring burg, is handily on site playing Bob Crachit. He is not convinced that anything's really amiss, though Cassidy and her fellow female thespians think otherwise. The interaction between the female actors on stage and off is pure, small-town camp and I'm here for it with the delightful Marcia Hughes, Brie Bevans, Dana Jensen and Jennifer Beall.

Our favorite scene is the actual opening night performance of "A Christmas Carol," which left us speechless with delight. Raabe, Ron Gilbert and Duane Larson make the most of it all and truly had us laughing out loud.
