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#### PASTOR LEANNE'S MESSAGE:

Spring Chicks -

When I was a kid, my father brought home some chicken eggs and an incubator, and put them in our basement. Every day, he took his children down in shifts to see the eggs, and when they started hatching, he sat with us around the incubator, explaining what we were seeing. At some point, he took them all out to a friend's farm, and eventually, they ended up on our table as a Sunday meal. As a kid from an agricultural community, I never flinched at the whole process, it all seemed so natural and yes, quite wonderful.

Watching those chicks hatch was an enriching experience - and I have often wished that all children had access to the wonderful processes of farm life. To help a child develop wonder at the world is to help them respect mystery and marvel; even the smallest thing, like baby chicks evoke a reaction in our little ones to feel awe, joy and respect for the wonders of God's creation.

So imagine my joy when one of our childcare workers brought in an incubator and chick eggs, so that the children of our Child Care can have a similar experience to the one I now cherish. Sunday morning, there was one baby chick, by Monday, about ten. Their tiny "peep-peep peeps" greeted me at the Child Care center door. The look of excited wonder and joy was on the face of our little ones. Well done, Child Care workers!

One of the most valuable skills a church can offer is to teach its children AND adults how to marvel and appreciate mystery. Everywhere we look in our world, God is at work in amazing processes which science and intellect can explain in formulas, but the soul must take in as wonder. As adults, we are often to busy to marvel that a spring flower

knows when it's time to peek up through the soil, a chick finds its way out of a nest and birds know when to make a trek back to their nesting grounds. We also forget the wonders that scripture tells us about – the amazing vast love of God, God's revelation in Jesus and the marvelous end-goal of

salvation history. Keeping wonder alive, making space in our souls for mystery opens us up to real worship and marvel at what God does each and every day. Wonder produces respect and gratitude.

So... slow down, and rejoice in the birth of baby chicks. Notice acts of kindness and scenes of beauty. Marvel in the change and growth of a child. Enjoy the night sky and new colors popping out on the trees. Feel how soft your dog's fur is. Notice the world around you. God is still at work, and we all too often miss it, because we have forgotten how to marvel.

**Hospitality**—The church will once again participate in the community garden, Pride and Juneteenth events. The deadline for scholarship applications is May 16.

Proclamation-Christian Education—May 18 will feature the children's choir. VBS will be July 21-24.

**Proclamation**-**Worship and Music**—Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter services had wonderful music. Wax candles will be replacing the current alter ones.

**Property and Equipment**—The accordion doors in the parlor were removed. A new Trans-trash company will save money. A security camera and air handler have been fixed. Plans will be made to grind down some raised parts of the sidewalk.

#### **Collecting plastic grocery bags for a good cause!**

The committee is working with a woman who creates the mats, like the one pictured here, by hand-weaving the plastic bags. It takes about 500 bags to make one mat. The committee decided to test whether the congregation would support this effort, hoping this could be a long-term outreach (and environmentally friendly) project for our congregation.

The First Presbyterian Church Scholarship Committee is pleased to announce the availability of a limited number of scholarships for our church community. Applications are now being accepted from students within our Congregation who are enrolling or are already enrolled in higher education. The deadline for applications is May 16, 2025.

To be eligible for consideration, a student must be an active member of First Presbyterian Church of Bismarck or have been an active participant in the life of the church for at least three years. Students at any level of study beyond high school are eligible to receive a scholarship award. Students are eligible to receive a scholarship for a maximum of four years: the years do not need to be consecutive. Graduate students may apply for scholarships, providing they are within the four-year maximum.

Generous, education-minded members of our Church who were anxious to help students accomplish their academic and technical goals gifted monies to scholarship endowments within our church since 1985. Since the scholarship program was established our Church has provided \$194,700 in educational assistance to students over the past 40-years!

Applications are available in the church office and for download from the front page of the church website at <u>www.fcpbismarck.com</u>. The deadline to apply is **4:30pm on Friday, May 16, 2025**.


