## Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education Scholars <u>Program</u>

The Scholars program awards scholarships to eligible child care professionals to complete coursework in the area of child development or early childhood education, as well as the Child Development Associate (CDA) and Certified Childcare Professional (CCP) Credential Assessment. These scholarships enable child care providers in Oklahoma to improve their skills through education, receive an educational stipend.

### November is Lung Cancer Awareness Month:

a great time to ensure all children have access to environments that are healthy and free from smoke. Even in homes and child care facilities where active smoking indoors does not take place, children still may be exposed to thirdhand smoke.

Thirdhand smoke, unlike firsthand (ie., the smoke inhaled directly by the person smoking) and secondhand (ie., the smoke exhaled by smokers and the smoke from the burning cigarette, cigar or pipe), is not inhaled from being near a smoking source. Instead, it is the solid film that smoke leaves behind on surfaces. clothing, skin, and hair. It has all the same cancer-causing qualities as its first and secondhand counterparts. If a caretaker goes out to smoke and then returns to take care of children without washing their hands or taking off an outer "smoking" layer (like a jacket or large shirt), children may come into skin contact with thirdhand smoke.

You can protect children from thirdhand smoke by putting a complete no-smoking policy in place. You can also advise staff who smoke to do the following:

- Go outside, completely off the property (and out of sight), to smoke.
- Wear an outer layer of clothing while smoking that can be taken off before re-entering the facility and spending time with children.
- Wash hands after smoking and before interacting with kids.

- the program's mission of collaboration and continuous improv


