Application, Budget and Attachments Saving Procedures

1. Save the Grant Application and Budget documents to your hard drive, i.e. desktop or personal folder, for easy access, modifications and saving.
2. Save Grant Applications as *First Four Words of Project Title - MMDDYYYY* ex: *Skating to the Moon-09012010*.
3. Save Attachments as *First Four Words of Project Title-A1, First Four Words of Project Title-A2*, ex *Skating to the Moon-A1, Skating to the Moon-A2, Skating to the Moon-A3*, etc.



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Project Details

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Each project proposal should be limited to the cells provided in this application, with the exception of scanned supporting documents which should be attached.

Education grants fund project-based learning that results in increased student achievement.

Number of Students/Partners

1. Statement of Need
Describe targeted student population and need for the project using facts and evidence.

2. Project Goal
State planned outcome of the project.

3. Rationale
State: a. Why project is important and b. How project relates to CIP (Campus Improvement Plan).

4. Objectives
Provide Statement of Intent to include: a. Proposed learning students will gain. b. Specific changes applicant intends to achieve in targeted population, c. How objectives will be measured and how they relate to instructional methods. Goal should be realized when objectives are attained.



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5. Instructional Methods/Strategies

Describe how the applicant proposes students will learn. Outline steps applicant will take to achieve specific changes in targeted population .

6. Student Activities

Describe and/or list student activities.

7. Evaluation

Each proposal must contain a plan for objective measurement of results. Evaluation must include a baseline measurement, a mid-point measurement, and a measurement of final outcome.

8. Timeline/Sustainability

State proposed timeline of project and if project or use of materials will be ongoing. Preference will be given to projects which can be replicated by other teachers.

9. Overall Presentation

Application should a. Be professional, b. Be Grammatically correct, and c. Adhere to application design format and requirements.

10. Innovation

Proposed project should be innovative, demonstrate a new idea, represent a creative teaching approach, or be an effective method of delivering instruction to a diverse group of students which will result in increased student achievement.
