This note comes from the [Pacific Northwest Historians Guild](#), which brings together scholars concerned with the study and dissemination of regional history.

We are writing to let you know of a free virtual talk that may be of interest to your members.

On Thursday December 3 our speaker will be Eric Wagner, author of *After the Blast, The Ecological Recovery of Mount St. Helens*, published this year by the University of Washington Press.

Many are familiar with the effect of the devastating 1980 eruption of Mount St. Helens, but what happened later? Scientists thought they would have to wait many years for life to return to the area. A few weeks after, small plants were bursting through the ash and animals were skittering over the ground.

Mount St. Helens has been surprising ecologists ever since. Eric Wagner will share with us a fascinating look through the blast area and beyond and how scientists began to think in new ways about how life responds in the face of seemingly total devastation.
