

Fall Planting Guide

Here are some varieties you can still plant in the fall.

This list assumes a first frost date during the second week of October.

Check your local frost date and adjust accordingly.

In Ohio, for example, these can all be sown directly in the ground in August.

Greens can be picked when small and tender for salads.

Vegetable/Herb	Recommended Varieties	Sow by date (assuming first frost is October 9th)
Beets	Ruby Queen, Cyindra, Bull's Blood	Mid-August
Chinese Cabbage	Pak Choi	Mid-August
Collards	Morris Heading, Southern Giant	Mid-late August
Chervil	Curled	Early-mid August
Fennel	Sweet Florence	Early August
Garlic Bulbils	All Varieties	Following Spring
Kale	Vates Blue Scotch Curled Dwarf Siberian	Mid-late August
Lettuce, Leaf	Black Seeded Simpson Ruby Red	Mid-August
Mustard	Asian Mix (Osaka Purple, Tatsoi, Wasabi, Red Giant)	Early August
Swiss Chard	Rainbow Mix (Flamingo, Canary, Fordhook, Rhubarb, Ruby Red)	Mid-August
Turnip	Seven Top	Mid-late August
