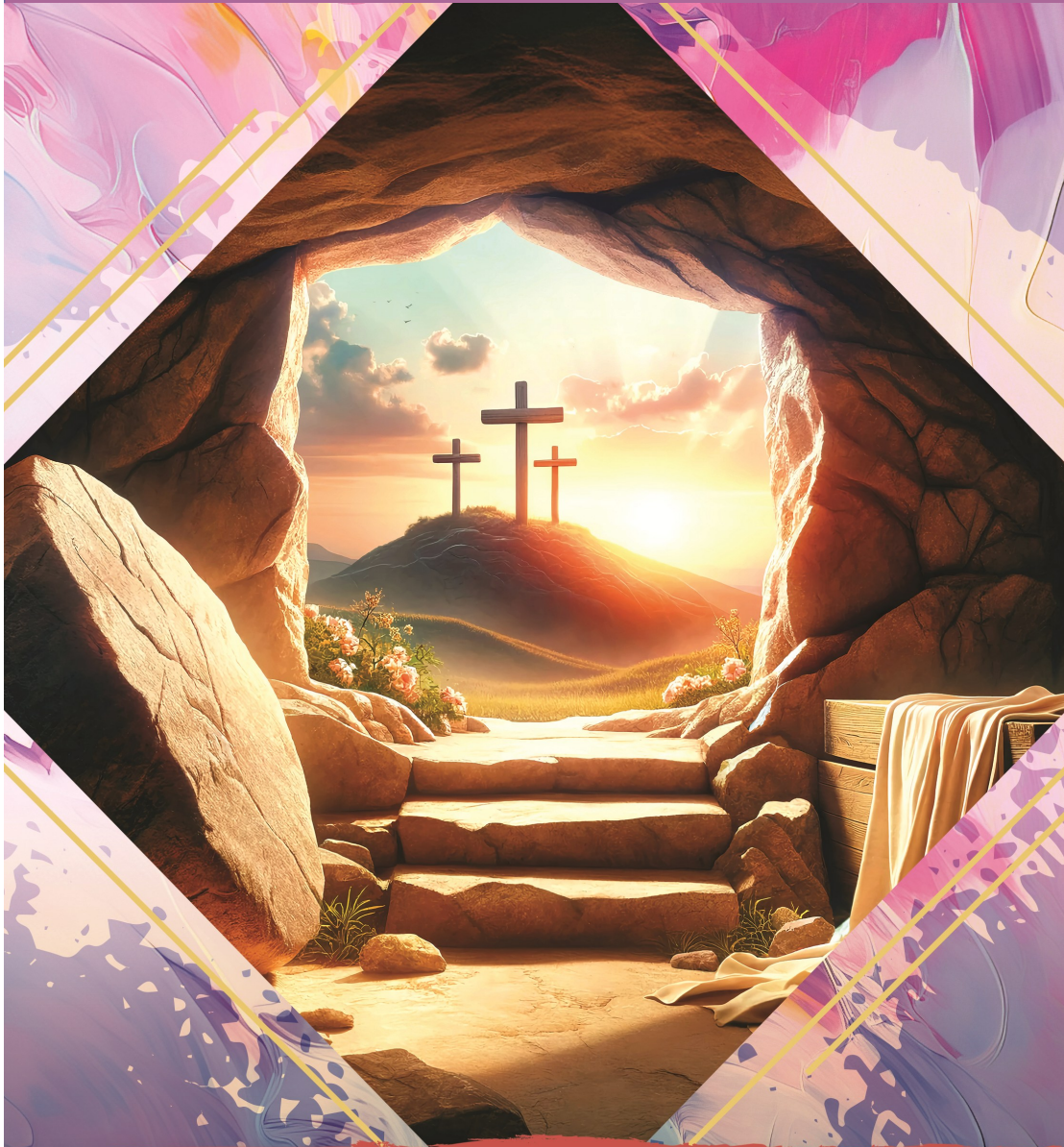

Introduction to Liturgy of the Word Easter Sunday

- Acts 10:34a, 37–43 Peter is an eyewitness: The Lord is risen.
- Psalm 118 “This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad.”
- Colossians 3:1–4 All who are baptized, set your hearts in heaven. or 1 Corinthians 5:6b–8 Christ our Passover is sacrificed: Out with the old, in with the new.
- John 20:1–9 Three witnesses, Mary, Peter, and John, respond to the empty tomb.
- or Luke 24:1–12 (#41C) Why search for the dead? Today the dead have been raised!
- or, in the afternoon, The Lord is made known
- Luke 24:13–35 (#46) in the breaking of the bread.

On Easter Sunday, we hear some of Jesus’ earliest disciples testify to the unprecedented event they had witnessed. Saint Peter addresses an assembly of Gentiles, teaching them about Jesus and how God raised him from the dead. Saint Paul preaches about the effect Christ’s resurrection has had on his life. In the Gospel, Saint Mary Magdalene, the first to see the empty tomb, frantically announces the news to two of Jesus’ closest disciples. None of his disciples yet understood that Jesus had to rise from the dead, but the disciple whom Jesus loved believed at once. Let us consider how we ourselves testify to the Resurrection.
