

Form Must Be Received By: February 21, 2024

Please submit your entries as early as possible. The total number of quilt entries and sizes determine the total number of quilts that can be displayed. All entries are date-stamped and will be accepted based on those dates.

All the quilts must be checked in at the Community Center on Thursday, March 21, 2024, between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. You will be given a receipt for each item entered into the show.

Quilts entered in the show will be available for checkout at the Checkout Table in the hall on March 23rd from 6 pm - 6:45 p.m. A receipt must be presented to pick up your entry.

Handcrafts Unlimited Georgetown Quilt Show Committee appreciates your interest in our upcoming show and your willingness to share your treasures!

Please fill out the attached form along with a **mandatory picture** of the entry quilt and return it or email it to:

Each entry will have signage attached that will include a short biography detailing some interesting facts, stories or details provided by the entrant. All entries will receive a confirming email. For questions about your item in our show, please call Susan Janes at (512) 258-5135.

PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING IMPORTANT INFORMATION

1. Quilts entered should not have been exhibited in a previous Georgetown Quilt Show. Entries should be made or owned by a Williamson or surrounding county resident or a Handcrafts Unlimited artisan or volunteer.
2. Quilt forms may be obtained at Handcrafts Unlimited or at the Quilt Show website at www.handcrafts-unlimited.com/georgetown-quilt-show.html. The entry form may be copied.
3. Please use one form for each item entered. The completed form must be **legible**.
4. No unfinished quilts will be accepted for display in the show.
5. To aid in the planning of the show, a picture of your entry **MUST** accompany each entry form. Acceptable pictures include photos, scans, digital photo printouts and Polaroid's. The photo should be no larger than 4" x 6".
6. **Each quilt entry must be placed in a separate pillowslip with the entrant's name, address and phone number securely attached to the back of the quilt and to the pillowslip. Entries without a pillowslip will not be accepted.**
7. Cancellations should be made by calling Susan Janes at (512) 258-5135 as soon as possible.
8. To ensure the quilt is displayed correctly, mark the TOP of the quilt.
9. For security purposes, the exhibit area of the Community Center will close at 5 pm on Saturday, March 23rd; to allow the show committee members and other volunteers time to prepare the quilts for pickup. Receipts are required to pick up all entered quilts. **A representative may pick up an item in your place, but the receipt will be required to ensure that each piece in our keeping is properly returned.** We ask for patience as we carefully ensure the safekeeping of your entries. Please mark your calendar with these dates. Quilts will be available for pickup on **March 23rd from 6 p.m. - 6:45 pm.**
10. People's Choice balloting will close at 2 pm, on March 23, 2024. The list of winners will be posted, and awards will be given out at 4:00 pm.
11. Entries will be accepted until available display space is full based on submission date. All entries are date-stamped.
12. Special hangers are used to display each quilt – no hanging sleeve is required.

A completed entry form and mandatory photo must accompany each item entered in the show. The completed form and photo may be mailed to Handcrafts Unlimited, PO Box 1191, Georgetown, TX 78627, returned to Handcrafts Unlimited, 104 West 8th St (on Georgetown's historic square) or emailed to sjanes@sbcglobal.net. Photocopies of this form will be accepted. **Allow extra time for mailed entries to ensure receipt on or before the deadline. All quilts are date stamped the day they are picked up at the Post Office and brought to the shop.**

Miniature Quilt (not just a small quilt but one with all the elements of a full-size quilt, usually no more than 25" on its longest side)

Multi-generational Antique Quilt (quilts that were started 50 years or more but completed or "refurbished within the last 50 years).

Modern Quilts – inspired by modern design; modern traditionalism; improvisational piecing; minimalism; expansive negative space. Must be quilted.

Small Applique Quilt (51% or more appliqued and less than 120 inches)- Edges of applique pieces must be finished with thread. (See Special Techniques for other options)

Small hand quilted (less than 120 inches)

Large hand quilted (more than 120 inches)

Machine Quilted – Free Motion* - Any Size – Any Machine Type

Machine Quilted – Digitized* - Any Size – Any Machine Type

Small Pieced Quilt (51% or more pieced and less than 120 inches)

Large Applique Quilt (51% or more appliqued and more than 120 inches)- Edges of applique pieces must be finished with thread. (See Special Techniques for other options)

Art Quilts – is an original concept or idea experimenting with texture, color and/or mixed media and should consist predominately of fiber or fiber-like materials with one or multiple layers held together with stitches.

Large Pieced Quilt (51% or more pieced and more than 120 inches)

Young Quilters (any size made by quilters 6-15 years old)

Crib/Children's Quilt (any size made for babies or young children)

Antique (quilts of any size that are at least 50 years old or older)

Special Techniques (more than 120 inches; made using techniques not fitting in with other categories. Examples: Crazy Patch, Yo-Yo, Embroidered, Cathedral Window, Tied, T-Shirt, Whole Cloth, Laser cut & pre-fused pieces with unfinished edges, etc.)

Machine Embroidered – All Sizes and Types
