BY LAWS OF THE APOSTOLIC FAITH BIBLE COLLEGE, INC.

Article VII Doctrine

consists of all believers who believe in the saving grace also find that way? Is my life an example of being of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and who have accepted Him as their personal Savior. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. The common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows.

- * Triune God; Father, Son, and Holy Spirit
- * Creation and Formation
- * Man is basically sinful and in need of salvation
- 1700 Hinton Road * Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Savior, which is the conception of Spiritual Life
 - * Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul, and Body, A second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ
 - * Baptism of the Holy Spirit; evidenced by the speaking in other languages.
 - * Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit
 - * Sacrament of the Lord's Supper
 - * Washing of feet
 - * Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers
 - * Do not condone divorce and remarriage
 - * Destruction of the wicked
 - * Conditional Immortality
 - * Rapture of the Man Child Class
 - * Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly
 - * A ministry supported by tithes and offerings

These doctrines shall be adhered to in the teachings of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teaching approved by the Board from time to time if they are not inconsistent with the above listed basic doctrines.

the average cost of a new home was \$19,300.00. A 1st class stamp cost 5 cents; a gallon of gas was 30 cents. To buy a dozen eggs you paid 30 cents and milk was 49 cents a gallon. The average income was \$5,623.00 and a Hershey candy bar was 5 cents. Touch tone telephones were introduced; FM radios were available in cars and the United States Postal Service instituted the zip codes. The American Heart Association was the 1st agency to campaign against cigarettes and the United Sates Supreme Court ruled that Bible reading in public schools was unconstitutional. On Nov. 22, 1963 President John F. Kennedy was assassinated and Lyndon Johnson became president.

That same year the Apostolic Faith Bible School in Baxter Springs, KS began another term on Sept. 9th with 42 students and ended with graduation on the 4th of Dec. At the end of the term an article was written in the Dec. issue of the Apostolic Faith Report. The beginning statement was "The 1963 term of the Apostolic Faith Bible College was especially blessed of God in many ways." It went on to say they had a larger number of students, every financial need was supplied and a Christian spirit of love and unity prevailed throughout the term. The scripture at the end of this article was the one printed on the graduation announcement in the Report. I am sure if we asked each one, no doubt their testimony would be that God had truly stood by His Word, as He has always done and will do yesterday, today and forever.

At the closing exercises nine students felt the call of God -4 for ministry and 5 as gospel workers and helpers. As I read the names of those ordained, I knew them all. Our paths have crossed many times throughout the past 50 years- I along with so many of you have been touched by their years of ministry. So in this issue we say "Thank you" for their 50 years of service by allowing them to share where God has taken them and how He has blessed.

As I reflect on the days of beginning in the ministry, I remember when I felt the call of God. It was at a youth camp at Laverne,OK in the summer of 1958. The camp was held 4 miles south of Laverne on property that belonged to Emmett Cornell. I was 13 years old. The camp was conducted under the direction of Bro. Gene Waterbury. I don't remember for sure who the other preachers were that helped him., but I do remember the moment at the altar when I knew the Lord was calling me to the ministry.

Later that year as I was sleeping one night, I was awakened by a very vivid dream. I still can see the events depicted in the dream. It was the coming of the Lord. Jesus was descending and people were coming out of graves, ascending to meet him. Others, who were alive, were joining them to meet the Lord in the air.

It was 5 years later (1963) that I attended my 1st year of Bible School in Baxter Springs, Kansas. Bro. Gene Waterbury was superintendent. He gave me great instruction and was certainly a wonderful example to follow in the study of the Word, which has enabled me to fulfill the call.

I thank the Lord for leadership like Bro. Waterbury, Bro. Gail Schultz, Bro. Jacob Regier, Bro. Robert Girouard and many others who have been and are a great blessing to me.

Bro. Ken Priest and I held our 1st revival together in Amarillo, TX for Pastor Neil Ragan in 1964. There was a snow storm that left the area covered with 17 inches of wet snow. We had lots of fun playing in the snow. What a memory!

After a 2nd term of Bible School, Anna Margaret Scroggs of Waka, TX became my bride on March 6,1965. This just happened to be the wedding anniversary of Danny and Pat Robinson. They blessed us by driving more than 300 miles through a dirt storm to attend our wedding.

Anna and I accepted our 1st pastorate in Sugarland, TX in August 1965. We were there only 11 months when such difficulties arose that we deemed it necessary to resign. We moved to Sunray, TX to pastor the small congregation in August, 1966. Our 1st child, Delvin, was born during the year we spent there. It was discouraging to know that the first two churches we served were sold after we left.

We served 4 years as pastors in Enid, OK. Our 2nd child, Darin, was born there. We served for a few months as pastors at Shattuck, Ok. From there we pastored in Joplin, MO, Baxter Springs, KS, Arnett, OK Hardesty, OK, Canyon, TX and Liberal, KS. In the midst of these times of pastoring, we also had 3 periods of evangelistic ministry. Each one lasted a period of 13 months.

In Nov. 2001, we began a new work in Liberal, KS. Originally, it was called The Latter House Worship Center. Later we changed the name to Abundant Life Fellowship because some thought we had become Mormon because of the word Latter.

The number 13 has occured many times in my life. I was born on Oct.13,1944. I was called to the ministry at age 13. I was the 13th superintendent of AFBC, which lasted for 13 months. I was the 13th pastor of the Hardesty, OK church which lasted 13 years. I was the 13th pastor of Trinity Faith Church which lasted 39(13x3) months. There are more but that is enough for you to get the idea.


We will keep on keeping on for the Lord who enables us since He put us in the ministry. We expect to participate in the events of the dream that came to me 55 years ago. Hallelujah!




Parable of the Dead Church
