

## Spirited Life

e are in a time when many seem to live with deep anger, much of which may come from fear generated by a sense of loss of control over our lives. We struggle to control the economy, our borders, the spread of disease, the violence in our cities and on our roads. Places once deemed safe—our schools, stores, and churches—have been invaded by violence. Ironically, those who feel most threatened by violence tend to turn to violence as a solution.

Do the scripture readings on this feast of Pentecost offer any hint of light as to how we might move forward? Saint Paul's Letter to the Romans contrasts living in the flesh with living in the spirit that has been given to us. To "live in the flesh" is Paul's code word for living by our baser instincts—lust for power, revenge, and pleasure; anger; greed—all of which focus on ourselves. By contrast, to live in the spirit is to respond not from our baser instincts but rather to choose a more noble path, to take the high road, to care for the common good. For Paul, living in the flesh is a dead end, unable to bring us to life now or in the hereafter. To live in the spirit is to live in God, already in this life. Thus, Paul cautions that we not "fall back into fear," something that arises from our preoccupation with the flesh.

## Dear Padre,

My Catholic friend says she speaks in tongues and does not feel she needs an interpretation as she does so. She writes down the exchange as she listens to others. What does the Catholic Church say about speaking in tongues? How should I respond if she asks to pray for me in this way?



Good for your friend. A robust spiritual practice is a real grace from God. At the same time, it seems that a gentle reminder,

albeit a respectful one, to your friend might include the wisdom of St. Paul. In 1 Corinthians, Paul cautions that the person who speaks in tongues must ask for interpretation of what is spoken so that it may be confirmed. There is real wisdom offered here. It is also helpful to remember that in the Christian understanding of supernatural gifts, such gifts are not intended solely for the individual person but always for the well-being of the community and the common good (1 Cor 12:7). Keeping this integrated and balanced understanding as an essential component of the manifestation of the charismatic gifts of the Holy Spirit will only lead to good and to a more powerful experience of God's grace and life. In the Christian life, it is never about just the individual, but always inclusive of the experience of our brothers and sisters in Christ.





## Msgr. Robert A. Kurwicki Elected New **Administrator of Diocese of Jefferson City**

Msgr. Robert A. Kurwicki has been elected to serve as the administrator of the Diocese of Jefferson City. He is the first to hold the title of administrator in the 70-year history of our local Church.

The election was held by ballot at the rectory of the Cathedral of Saint Joseph with the eight priests of the diocesan College of Consultors participating. It follows the installation of the Most Reverend Shawn McKnight as Archbishop of Kansas City in Kansas on May 27, 2025. Archbishop McKnight's leadership of the Diocese of Jefferson City, which began in 2018, ceased when he assumed his new role in Kansas.

As administrator, Msgr. Kurwicki is charged with maintaining the essential operations of the diocese. According to Canon Law, a diocesan administrator may not enact major changes or initiatives, as those responsibilities are reserved for the next bishop, who will be appointed by Pope Leo XIV.

Msgr. Kurwicki, currently serves as pastor of St. Peter Parish in Jefferson City and was Vicar General under the previous Bishop. He resides at the St. Peter rectory in Jefferson City.

"I humbly accept the responsibility of serving as diocesan administrator of the Diocese of Jefferson City," said Msgr. Kurwicki. "I thank the College of Consultors for their trust, and I ask for your prayers as we work together in the coming months and prepare for the appointment of the next Bishop of Jefferson City."

Msgr. Kurwicki will continue his role as pastor of St. Peter while fulfilling the duties of diocesan administrator. His appointment will conclude upon the installation of the new bishop.

There is no official timeline for the selection of a new bishop. Once Pope Leo XIV has appointed a new bishop to lead the Diocese of Jefferson City, and he has accepted, the announcement will be published in the daily Vatican Bulletin. This could happen at any time. However, in recent similar situations in the United States, it has taken several months to a year for a new bishop to be named.


