ROLLING WITH THE CHANGES

As previously announced, we will launch a new worship schedule beginning Sunday, September 7, as noted below. This change is coming because of the need to better utilize the time and energy of our many volunteers. For months, attendance at the 10:30 service was propped up by the presence of our chancel and bell choir. However, the break they've taken this summer has pointed out just how much attendance had actually dropped at 10:30. Deaths, disaffiliations, a desire for a different worship style or for a larger gathering are some of the reasons for the decline. To be perfectly honest with you, we should have changed our schedule much sooner, but I've had to deal with a stubborn old man who doesn't like change.

Me.

I don't like change, and let's face it: change can be hard. I've struggled with how to change our worship schedule even as I've tried to minimize the disruptions. Turning the 8 am service into a blended service with the chancel and bell choirs will make the service a little longer, so that meant starting the second service at least 15 minutes later. On the other hand, the 8 am service is the only one we can record for WRMJ, and that broadcast must fit our allotted time of 50 minutes.

I considered offering Sunday School during the

second service, but with no service afterwards, that would make it very difficult for those who teach or attend Sunday School to also attend worship. After talking with our teachers, the best solution came into focus, and that was to present a dedicated time for Christian Education. But that meant starting the second service another 15 minutes later.

I'm aware that we've had many parents who have dropped off their children for Sunday School and then come to worship. While they will lose that "benefit" with our new schedule, I would encourage them—and others—to attend one of the two adult classes which are offered. A second option is to enjoy fellowship in the café. A third option is to form a new class for and meet in the dining room. If you're the parent of a young child, or if you can identify with parents of young children, I would encourage you to prayerfully consider if God might be nudging you to lead that kind of a Sunday School class.

I know that many of you have enjoyed worshipping at 9:15 and having the rest of the day for other activities, and I respect that. That's the primary reason why we're not moving the second service to 10 am. My hope is that after a month or two, that 9:45 will feel as natural as 9:15 has felt for these past several years. Sometimes change is necessary, and this is one of those times.

For those who have worshipped regularly at 10:30, Blended Worship at 8 am will feel the most familiar. I know that represents a big change to your Sunday morning routine, but please know how much I appreciate your willingness to likewise "roll with the changes."

Even change is hard, but we have received overwhelming support for our new worship schedule, and for that, I am most grateful.

I want to thank our Forgiven Praise Band for their willingness to "Roll with the Changes." Thank you to Katie Moran as she is incorporated into 8 am Blended Worship. Also, thanks to the chancel and bell choirs as they adapt to ministering at an earlier time of day






September is Food Pantry Month


The Mercer County Food Pantry located at 1200 S. College Avenue in Aledo and is serviced by the Churches of Mercer County. Its mission statement says, "We exist to offer temporary/ emergency food assistance to residents of Mercer County, Illinois."

Key services provided are: food based on family size (all MC residents are eligible), commodities (government-provided food) based on family income, rotating toiletries, and resource information. Since the food pantry is supported by all churches of Mercer County, Aledo UMC is only assigned to volunteer there three weeks a year. The final weeks for us this year are in September and October. Volunteer opportunities for Aledo UMC will be on Tuesday, September

30, from 5:30 to 7pm and on Friday, October 3, from 8 am to noon. If you would like to volunteer your time, please see Mary Flint.

There are other ways to support our local food pantry.
