

Well known as the **City of Angels**, Krungthepmahanakorn (Bangkok) is the present capital city and the focal point for Thailand. It was made the capital of Thailand in 1782, by the first monarch of the present Chakri Dynasty. It is a vibrant city, a national treasure house and Thailand's spiritual, cultural, political, commercial, educational and diplomatic center with endless choice of sightseeing and entertainment opportunities. In addition to the many temples and historic buildings, such as The Grand Palace and Wat Arun, the list of interesting places to visit is endless. There are numerous canal (klong) networks, the Chaophraya River, giving Bangkok the name of "Venice of the East".

## DAY 1: OCTOBER 27, 2019 Fly to Bangkok

## **DAY 2: OCTOBER 28, 2019**

## **Explore Bangkok**

After breakfast this morning, you will visit **The Grand Palace**, a "must see" attraction. The Palace is an architectural wonder of golden stupas, walls and pillars encrusted in shining and colorful mosaics. Previously the residence of past Kings of Thailand, you will see palaces once used for different occasions; the Reception Hall, the Coronation Hall,



the Throne Hall, the Royal Guest House and Wat Phra Kaew. The architecture is predominantly Thai, though there are some European influences. The palace served as the official residence of Kings of Thailand from the 18<sup>th</sup> to the mid-20<sup>th</sup> century. The most famous building within the palace grounds is **Wat Phra Kaew** and this is regarded as the most sacred buddhist temple in Thailand. Continue to **Wat Po**, with its massive reclining Buddha. Enjoy a traditional Thai foot massage to relax your mind and body.

Continue to **Supatra River House Restaurant** for your first authentic Thai dishes in Thailand. This gracious old Thai home on the banks of the Chao Phaya River, opposite the Grand Palace, was formerly the home of Khunying (Lady) Supatra Singholaga, who in addition to being a successful business woman, was a leading advocate of women's rights in Thai society. The interior of the house is divided into several dining areas with a cozy bar, and seating outdoor on the terrace. The décor is traditional architecture, and the views of the river, Grand Palace and Wat Arun are spectacular.

A cruise through the Thonburi canals is an experience that no other Asian capital can offer. The journey down the legendary **Chao Phraya River**, known as the "River of Kings", and its tributary klongs (canals) gives a perspective on the critical importance this waterway played in the creation of Bangkok and the old capital of Thonburi, hence the title "Venice of the East". A boat trip takes us to famous riverside landmarks, including stops at the glittering Wat Arun (the Temple of Dawn) and the magnificent Royal Barges Museum. We also proceed past other notable icons such as the Holy Rosary Church, which was built by the Portuguese who were the first Europeans to settle in Thailand in the 16<sup>th</sup> Century; and the Oriental Hotel, famous for hosting celebrated authors such as Joseph Conrad and Somerset Maugham.

Return to the hotel for dinner on your own this evening.



# DAY 3: OCTOBER 29, 2019 Cultural Explorations of Bangkok

Begin your final day in Bangkok with a visit to the **Damnoen Saduak Floating Market**. There are countless floating markets throughout Thailand, but the Damnoen Saduak is the most famous. Situated in Ratchaburi province, this market is like a trip back in time to the Siam of old. You will see colorfully clad merchants paddle along congested canals in sturdy canoes laden with fresh fruit, vegetables and other food items to sell to shoppers on the canal banks. There is lots of activity and bargaining is part of the fun of the sale.

This buzzing market is at its best in the early morning before the crowds arrive and the heat of the day builds up. After visiting the market, we continue onto Phra Pathom Chedi in Nakorn Pathom, reportedly the largest pagoda in South East Asia. The golden-tiled dome of the Chedi towers almost 116 – metres into the air.



After lunch on your own, you will have some free time at the hotel.


