Audrey & Givenchy by Cindy De La Hoz (2016). Swoon-worthy photo book about the long partnership between Hepburn and fashion designer Hubert de Givenchy. Perfect for fans of Hepburn's fashion

Audrey Hepburn: A Life of Beautiful Uncertainty by Tom Santopietro (2025). The latest complete biography, including never before seen photos. Nicely researched and readable. My current top pick.

Audrey at Home: Memories of My Mother's Kitchen by Luca Dotti (2015). A unique biography from her son. Combines anecdotes, excerpts from her letters, recipes for her favorite dishes and more than 250 previously unpublished family photos

Audrey in Rome by Luca Dotti (2013). Photo book edited by Hepburn's son. Chronicles Hepburn's long-running links to the city, from Roman Holiday through her marriage to Andrea Dotti

Audrey Hepburn Treasures by Ella Erwin, et al (2006). Rare. Hard to find and great for collectors and diehard fans. Like a scrapbook with mix of text and photos. Includes small "treasures" in envelopes in the pages

Audrey Hepburn: An Elegant Spirit by Sean Hepburn Ferrer (2003). Lovely memoir written by her son

Breakfast at Tiffany's: The Official 50th Anniversary Companion by Sarah Gristwood (2011). Half photographs and half narrative. Lots of behind-the-scenes info about the making of the movie.

Audrey Style by Pamela Clarke Keogh (1999). Another great book for fashionistas. About half photography and half narrative. Includes interviews with designers including Givenchy and Ralph Lauren

Dutch Girl: Audrey Hepburn and World War II by Robert Matzen (2019). Riveting biography focusing on her childhood years during WWII. A must-read for those interested in Hepburn's history, esp during World War II

Audrey Hepburn by Barry Paris (2001). The most ambitious and personal account ever written about Hollywood's most gracious star. Comprehensive, but some readers find it dry

Enchantment: The Life of Audrey Hepburn by Donald Spoto (2006). Juicy and sometimes salacious but engaging biography. Focuses on Hepburn's insecurities and infidelities.

Fifth Avenue, 5 AM by Sam Wasson (2021). A history of the making of Breakfast at Tiffany's.



Timeline: Audrey Hepburn

- 1929 Audrey Van Heemstra Ruston born in Belgium on May 4
- 1935 Parents divorce
- 1939 Returns to her mother's native Holland at the outset of World War II. Endures hardship during the war including severe malnutrition and anemia
- 1949 Begins career in musical theater
- 1953 *Roman Holiday* released, for which she receives an Academy Award for best actress
- 1954 Sabrina. Marries Mel Ferrer, an actor and film director
- 1960 Son Sean Hepburn Ferrer born
- 1961 Breakfast at Tiffany's
- 1964 My Fair Lady
- 1969 Marries Andrea Dotti, an Italian psychiatrist
- 1970 Son Luca Dotti born
- 1989 Named a UNICEF International Goodwill Ambassador. Final film appearance in *Always*
- 1993 Dies from cancer at age 63. Buried near her home in Switzerland
