



University of Michigan Fragile X Clinic by Joe Jacher

Hello from the University of Michigan Fragile X Clinic!

After a short hiatus, the Fragile X Clinic is once again up and running! As mentioned in previous newsletters, as part of our clinic we enroll participants into the FORWARD Registry and Database. The Registry is open to all individuals with a Fragile X premutation or full mutation and their family members. As part of registry information, include basic demographic information as well as interest in potential future research studies. The Database is open individuals with a Fragile X full mutation only (there is no age limit) and includes questions about development, education. health, and behaviors. Personal

identifiers such as name, date of birth, address, etc. will never be shared without your permission.

individuals interested in participating in the FORWARD Registry and Database: If you or your family members have not yet been evaluated by the University of Michigan Fragile X Clinic or if it has been more than six months since you were last seen in clinic, please call our office to set up an appointment to review medical history and discuss enrollment in the study. Clinics are scheduled on two Thursday mornings per month in Ann Arbor the C.S. Mott Children's Hospital. Additional clinics may become available on a limited basis if needed due to scheduling conflicts for patients and their families. For anyone interested in scheduling an evaluation, our office number is 734-764-0579.


Maggie (Mary Margaret) Branch

Paul graduated with his Certificate of Completion May 25.




Mid-to-Late September Saturday
