Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. I **thank God** every time I pray for you that our church continues to function and to serve our community. I thank God for the leadership of our Council, the officers, our committee members, and all of you who pray to strengthen them with wisdom, creativity, and encouragement. I thank God for our church staff and the support of all the families who support them.

We continue to hold worship services in the church at 9:30 AM. I hope you all have access to Sunday services through YouTube, Facebook, our Hope Lutheran church website <hopelutheranfosston.com>, FM radio KKCQ 96.7, or the local cable stations Garden Valley, channel 7, or Fosston cable channel 21.

As our nation's leaders ponder the wisest way to reconvene the operations of our economy, please use **your best judgment as you consider these important factors**:

- Are you a member of a vulnerable age group?
- Do you have an underlying condition that elevates your risk?
- Are you feeling ill or running a temperature, or have any symptoms indicating something contagious? If so, stay home!

Your church and its leaders are engaged in the emerging information and health directives. Please pray that we will respond and guide with calm, faith, compassion, and reason as we move forward and receive more information from the LCMC office and Coordinator Randy Freund of the Augustana District.

When we do finally get together again, some of our **worship practices** will change so that we can better care for each other:

- Please wash your hands thoroughly before going anywhere and after each activity. Follow-up washing
 with hand sanitizer. Keep fingernails short so nothing contagious stays wedged in them. If you wear gloves
 when serving food or any other activity, refrain from touching anything else with the gloves on or they too
 may become contaminated. Wearing gloves is no substitute for hand washing! Just consider this 'ritual'
 handwashing.
- Please do not shake hands, hug, or have any other form of touch when **greeting** each other, or passing the Peace. Instead, please smile (with your eyes as you may be masked), nod, bow, give a peace sign, wave, or other form of acknowledgement is wonderful. For this reason, (although it will be hard) your pastor will not be shaking hands in greeting or saying goodbye.
- No communion will be given by intinction (the dipping of the bread into the wine.) Altar guild members and all who serve or prepare the elements, please thoroughly wash hands and follow-up with hand sanitizer before touching anything. Communion servers step out and follow this procedure during the Hymn after the sermon, in preparation of distribution.
- Offering plates will not be passed but will be placed by the doors. You are invited to prayerfully share your tithes and offerings as you are called. Now would be a good time to consider electronic giving, or simply use the on-line giving icon on our Hope Lutheran website, <hopelutheranfosston.com> which will also allow you to designate what amount, what fund, and how often you would like to support this ministry.

When, and if, we return to a church assembly, please continue to **practice physical distancing** as we worship. Family units may sit together, but six feet away from other family units. Please feel free to **wear masks**. Remember "Wherever two or three are gathered in my name, there I am in the midst of them" (Matt. 18:20.)

We will **honor and respect emerging guidelines** from care facilities (assisted living, nursing homes, and hospitals) and we encourage FaceTime, electronic meetings and phone calls as well as cards or letters as they are allowed.

Our ways of doing **mission and ministry** will change. However, the needs of our beloved members will not, especially those who are vulnerable or isolated. If you know of someone who is elderly, grieving, sick, or dying, please consider how we may be of loving support to them. Please let me (phone 218-820-2017, or 218 -435-6765) know of anyone who has pastoral needs. This includes members of our church, or our community.

Jesus says, "Be not afraid" (Matthew 14:27,17:7, & 28:10; Mark 5:36, & 6:50: Luke 12:4; John 6:20, & 14:27) Make use of your most powerful tool, that is prayer. Stay well-informed (new information comes daily); stay safely connected. Our lives belong to the One who is the almighty God, and He promises to be "with us always, even to the close of the Age." (Matthew 29:16-20.) May the Peace of the Lord sustain us all.

Text: Psalm 71:6 From my mother's womb, you have been my strength.

You, who knit me in my mother's womb, still care for me, and mold me like a potter shapes a clay pot. Mold me as You like, but never forsake me, I am Yours to mold and shape, as you see fit. Your teaching is true and makes me confident. Your love makes me strong to meet the challenges of each day. When You want me for Your own, guide my footsteps to Your throne. Amen.

May 27

Text: 1 Corinthians 5:7-8

Alleluia. Christ, our paschal lamb, has been sacrificed. Therefore, let us keep the feast. Alleluia.

Prayer: God of mercy, we no longer look for Jesus among the dead. He who raised Lazarus, Jesus Himself, is alive, and is the Lord of Life. Increase in our hearts and minds the new future we share with Jesus. Help us to grow as Your people into the fullness of an eternal and joy-

filled life with You, Jesus Christ our Lord, and the Holy Spirit. One god, now and forever. Amen.

May 28

Text: **John 20:29** "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet come to believe.

Action: Think of a time, when your faith was weak, or you felt too discouraged to trust God. Now think, of who or what was it that lifted you up? Strive to see how the "journey" made your faith stronger. Be the catalyst to lift up someone who needs it during this stressful time.

Prayer: Precious Lord, give me eyes to see You in everyday occurrences. Give me insight and empathy that enables me to know how to be an encouragement to others. Thank You for the gift of faith that has been strengthened through the difficult fire. Help to understand that like a father, You chasten those You love and who will inherit Your kingdom. Thank You for the people in my life who lift me and encourage me in faith and service. Amen.

May 29

Text: John 20:30-31 John writes "Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in His name."

Action: Think about what other things Jesus may have done that is not written in our Bible. Why

do you think the stories selected by the gospel writer, John were chosen? Matthew and Luke based their texts on Mark's earlier text. Only John has a somewhat different message, a less historical, but more spiritual and theological account. Scan the subheadings of the gospels and decide which of the four speaks to your heart the most.

Prayer: Gracious Lord, thank You for Your Word. Give me a hunger to learn more about You by studying Your Word in the Bible. As I learn, give me understanding and wisdom. Fill me with knowledge of You, and how to be living out the signs of Your presence in these trying times, for Jesus sake. Amen

May 30

Text: Judges 3:31; 5:6 The story of a farmer by the name of Shamgar (the first of 6 minor judges living at the same time as Deborah) is found in this Old Testament text. Here again, like Moses, Gideon, and you & me, God used an ordinary person, to save His people, Israel. Shamgar simply used what he had as a farmer and trusted God. He did what he could, where he was as a farmer and herder of animals. God blessed his efforts. The name "son of Anoth" was a goddess of war under the foreign god Ba'al, consequently, Shamgar was most likely not a Hebrew. Including Shamgar as one who helped save Israel is an early indication of God's inclusion of us, Gentiles in the family of God.

Action: Read the Judges text in

Judges 3-5 and see the great promise of what one person can do. Think about the gifts and tools you have, that God may bless as you make the most of what you have, where you are, and how you can bless others by allowing God to use you.

Prayer: Precious Lord, help me to do what I can with what I have. Help me to "bloom where You have planted me." Show me how to be a blessing to others, for Jesus sake. Amen

May 31

Text: Judges 3 is the story of Deborah, a judge of Israel who led her people in triumph over the Canaanite commander Sisera. At this time Israel remained incapable of uniting under the leadership of a mere woman, so Deborah shared the triumph with her male counterparts for the sake of her country.

Action: Think of a time when someone thought you were less capable than You are or failed to give You credit when it was due. How did that make You feel? Angry? Vengeful? These are natural reactions that belong to the old nature. "Vengeance is mine says the Lord, I will repay." (Deut. 32:41 & Romans 12:19)

Prayer: Dear Jesus, help me not to seek to "get people back"; to not return evil for evil. Show me how to be like Your servant Deborah and set my ego, my anger, my vengeance aside in order to do what is best for the common good of your people. I know this is a growth process, Lord. Be patient with me, for Jesus sake. Amen.
