Annual Community Meeting and Board Elections Results

On November 8th at 6:30 PM the Community held its Annual Board meeting and Board Election. . VP Bob Francolini Conducted the meeting in President Ron Newsom's absence. Nancy ran the election process. Joyce Eldridge-Howard, Bill Merritt, and Bob Francolini were re-elected for another 2-year term. They nipped out Ken Holzschuh by a slight margin. Congratulations to all. They will join Ron Newsom who is finishing out his remaining year. Don Andersen is also finishing out his final year, but unfortunately has submitted his resignation to the board for health reasons. Don has been a long-term board member and has help shape the building and grounds program along with the financial

structure of the Community. We will miss him and look forward to his return to the board in the near future. With that said, the board has appointed Ken to finish out the term of 1 year for Don. The Board is in the process of assigning positions and responsibilities. We know Ken will be a great fit with the board and look forward to working with him to continue the excellent work for the Community. We congratulate Ken on his appointment and again, thank Don for his hard work and a speedy recovery.

No Fee Changes for Community Fee

The 2018 Budget was presented to the residents by Bob Francolini. We should end up the year with a small surplus which will be put into a snow reserve fund. Several contract changes were noted. Bottom line is that the Board approved a no fee increase on 10/25/2017 for the Community Budget. (Condo Fee is a separate Budget). We still must complete the balance of the year, but all looks good. As soon as all the financials are completed for the year, a copy of the budget for 2018 will be available for all residents.

Contract Changes

A new **Snow removal and landscaping contract** has been award to A&B Landscaping beginning with this winter snow removal. It is at a lower cost and improved service. They will begin the landscaping in the Spring.

Insurance for the Community also changed to Farmer's insurance. Lower cost and complete coverage.

New Pool Company and new hours: New Contract has been awarded to American Pools. They have been with us in the past and they bid on the contract at a lower cost. In addition, the pool will be opened Memorial Day Weekend until Labor Day weekend. The New hours will be from 12 PM to 7 PM each day, 7 days a week.

Capital Reserve Study Due: In the late spring we will have a Capital Reserve Study completed to make sure we are on track for all future items to be purchased. These are items like equipment, furniture, roofs, pool surface replacements, etc... This is part of your monthly fee, so we must make sure we are on target since the original survey was done when the Community opened.

Building and Grounds

Joyce covered the Year of projects for the Community at the meeting.

- Repaired a section of a fallen picket fence along with stabilizing and replacing the separated/or deteriorated section with 15 pickets on Thornton
- Repaired existing chain link fence with a loop cap and secured the fence with a top tension wire on Weber Ave.
- Removed twenty-two (22) dead shrubbery and replaced with burning bushes at the entrance (both sides) and near the basin at Steele Place.
- Beautification Project: Installed various plantings, boxwoods, river stone around trees added mulch to what is known as the "Teardrop/Lollipop" parking area on upper Weber Ave.
- Cut down a hanging tree limb at the entrance and cut back branches of trees pushing through the chain link fence at the entrance.
- Mulch was applied around the trees and edifices throughout the community.
- Removed twelve (12) trees and replaced in the common and identified areas.
- Removed (ten) 10 dead trees in the common areas throughout the community.
- Removed tree growth behind one of the houses on Thornton. Clipped the limbs which were growing through the wooden pickets.
- Six (6) residents adopted a tree in the community. This entails watering the trees periodically throughout the spring and summer.
- Removed volcano mulch in close proximity to the front of four (4) townhouses on Weber
- Tall grass was planted on both ends of the aisle in front of the Clubhouse which replaced one small dead evergreen. The other tree was removed and replanted
- Street cracks in the community were all sealed by Supreme-Metro and the street signage was refreshed.
- The tree in front of a 63/65 Weber Avenue was removed.
- This summer, the retention basin near Weston/Boyd was pumped out to remove muddy water, leaves and debris. A temporary fix until the basin was completely dry.

- This fall, the retention basin near Weston/Boyd was scaled and the input/output drains were cleaned.
- Tree branches were cut back from eight (8) street lamps on Weber Ave.
- Storm drain behind 88 Weber was repaired and river rock was added around the perimeter of the drain. Seed/topsoil included.
- Storm drain repair on Thornton is more extensive. An engineer has just completed the evaluation of the needed repair. Repair pending.
- Two storm drains input/output drains were cleaned (total of four 4), two in each basin near Weber Avenue and Steele Place.

The weeds and growth behind the dumpsters near the condos on Waterman Lane, facing the street were cleaned out and the dead trees were cut down...

- The roots of five (5) trees were cut in front of five identified townhouses.
- Five (5) ft. of bamboo was cut back along the fire access road.
- Identified sidewalks were replaced throughout the community. (Nancy's lead)
- PENDING THIS FALL: A plan to cut down the two (2) dead trees bracing the one (1) leaning tree on the service road near upper Weber Ave.
- All unfinished projects will carry over into the spring.

So you can see it was a busy year for Building and Grounds.

ADOPT A TREE or PLANT Program. Joyce has suggested the the community can help with the landscaping activity through a program of adopting a tree or bush in the common area to water and maintain. We are all responsible for our landscape on our property, and we have asked everyone to water the nearby plants in the common areas. By adopting the plant we can be assured of special care and watering being done to preserve the plant. Call Nancy or Joyce and sign up for "ADOPT a Plant" program or sign up on the list in the Club House.

We continue to identify areas in need and work on planned Activity for 2018.







Guest parking for Holiday Parties!

Please call Nancy and let her know that you will need to use the clubhouse parking for your guests. She needs to make sure there is nothing going on at the clubhouse first.
