The Rev. Dr. Natalie P. Alford was appointed pastor of the historic Trinity African Methodist Episcopal Church in Middletown, DE, in 2005, making it her fifth charge as a Pastor. She is a native of Newark, NJ. She has earned the following degrees: B.S. from Rutgers University, M.Div. from The Harvard Divinity School, and an Ed.D. from The University of Rochester. She is an author, adjunct professor, and Life Coach.

The Rev. Dr. Kim W. Anderson Pastors Metropolitan African Methodist Episcopal Church in Harlem, New York. She earned her Doctorate of Ministry from Palmer Theological Seminary of Eastern University in the area of Marriage and Family. Rev. Anderson has worked for social service organizations providing in-home counseling and support to children in Foster and Adoptive care. She has

also worked for PBS - Channel Thirteen/WNET in New York City, managing the local educational training team, The Teen Leadership Institute and served as an associate producer and advisor for the video series, Ethical Choices. She also consulted as an outreach coordinator for the weekly news program, Religion and Ethics. She is a lover of the theatre, having performed for many years as a member of The Ensemble Theatre Company and developed a one-woman show, "SOS – Sisters of Survival," featuring pieces written by or about Women of Color.

The Rev. Dr. Erika D. Crawford was appointed Pastor of Ebenezer African Methodist Episcopal Church in Rahway, NJ, in June of 2011 making her its first female pastor. She is a native of Stamford, CT and received her B.S. from Voorhees College, her M.Div. from New York Theological Seminary, her D.Min. from Fordham University (Bronx, NY) and did post graduate work at Regent Park College of Oxford University (Oxford, UK).

The Rev. Kimberly L. Detherage, Esq. was born and raised in Louisville, KY. She currently serves as the Pastor of St. Mark A.M.E. Church in Jackson Heights, New York; the first female pastor in the church's 184 year history. She is an attorney; the Connectional President of Women in Ministry; Dean of the NY Conference Ministerial Institute; a member of the New York Conference Board of Trustees, Board of Examiners and the First District Self Help Board. She received her Bachelor of Arts degree in Communications from Boston College; her Juris Doctor degree from Boston College Law School; and Master's of Divinity Degree from Emory University with Certificates in Black Church Studies and Women Studies.

The Rev. Andrea M. Hargett, an educator and advocate for youth, is an Itinerant Elder in the African Methodist Episcopal Church. She received a Master of Divinity Degree from New Brunswick Theological Seminary in 1995. She was assigned to serve the St. Matthew's Community A.M.E. Church of Hollis in 1996 and is joyfully laboring in her sixteenth year as pastor. She received her Bachelor of Arts Degree in Psychology from Hunter College in 1976, Master of Science Degree in Special Education from Adelphi University in 1982, Master of Library Science Degree from Queens College in 1991 and Master of Science Degree in Education and Advanced Certificate in School Psychology from Brooklyn College in 2010. She is currently pursuing a Doctor of Arts in Marriage and Family Therapy at Eastern University.
