Called to order at 1pm

Treasure not present, no treasure report read.

- Several members renewed their memberships today, Ron R will get those to Kathy for processing.

Minutes from January Christmas party read by Amanda.

- Vote made to accept minutes as read, no corrections to be made.
- Accepted unanimously.

Old business:

- Building on to the shed to provide a shelter of such for business meetings.

- By Larimer Co rules, nothing can be built on the land that is permanent. Thus the reason the shed is on rails.
- Pat brought up she will be attending a Larimer Co business meeting and wanted to know more about what was wanted for building onto the shed.
