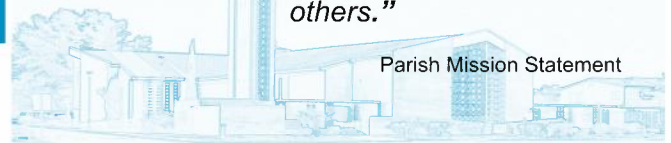

Marriage preparation is to begin at least 6 months prior to the wedding. It is strongly recommended that a couple planning to be married at St. Joseph contact the Parish before making any contractual arrangements with a facility for their reception. During the initial interview with the priest of the Parish, the couple will be provided with all the necessary information needed for their preparation experience.

Please continue to pray for our brothers and sisters who have had to endure the natural disasters here in our country, in Mexico, and in Puerto Rico.

Last Sunday at the Masses, Fr. Ricky told us of his experiences while visiting Puerto Rico. My first permanent assignment in the Air Force was at Ramey AFB. I was there from August 1956 to August 1959. It was a beautiful island and a fabulous assignment. When I could get a pass, my favorite place to visit was the city of Ponce.

Fr. Ricky mentioned the pork sandwiches there and compared them to the sandwiches in his country, the Philippines. I'll take the cowardly way out and say that when I was in the Philippines, I thought their sandwiches were the best. When I was in Puerto Rico, I thought theirs were the best. Now that I'm here and have been told that discretion is the better part of valor, I'll just say "It's a toss-up."

How did we get our sandwiches in PR? You would drive down the road and there at the side of the road was a man roasting a pig on a spit. You would tell him what you wanted and he would cut off a slab about ¾ inches thick and about 6 inches long, put it between two slices of bread, wrap it in a newspaper and hand it to you. IT COST ALL OF 50 cents. What a snack for the ride!

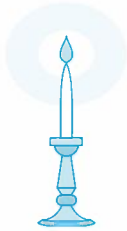

**TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

Before long, as we've seen, the four newly constructed Eucharistic Prayers became two. The old Roman Canon faded away into relative disuse after 1600 unbroken years, sometimes heard only at Christmas Midnight Mass or the Easter Vigil. The new Eucharistic Prayer IV, at least in its English form, grates a bit on most hearers, and besides is meant only for Ordinary Time. The reconstruction of the ancient prayer of Hippolytus, Eucharistic Prayer II, is the most familiar, but its brevity sometimes creates an imbalance with the Liturgy of the Word. No wonder that as soon as the creative juices began to flow at the Vatican, people worldwide were trying their hands at new prayers.

In 1967, even before the final shape of the new Mass was announced, bishops were asking to adapt that celebration for the needs of children. They wanted to clarify what ought to happen when large numbers of children are at Mass: what could be adapted, omitted, or shortened. Experimentation had already begun. Separate Liturgies of the Word for children were by this time commonplace in Holland and elsewhere in Europe. Catechists were saying that many of our liturgical forms were too complex for the children in their charge, and priests were making adaptations on their own. Clearly, the Vatican had to take this seriously.

Santiago mismo construyó la primera iglesia donde hoy se encuentra una gran basílica en honor de Nuestra Señora del Pilar. En el siglo XVIII, el Papa Clemente XII declaró el 12 de octubre como su fiesta en memoria de la llegada de los europeos al continente americano. De María vienen los principios del Día de la Raza.
