Shall the board of trustees be authorized to impose an increase in local taxes to support the general fund in the amount of \$10,000.00 which is approximately 1.52 mills for the purpose of providing funds to support the general fund for the proper maintenance and operation of the school district for the 2025-2026 school year beginning July 1, 2025.

Passage of this proposal will increase the taxes on a home with a market value of \$100,000 by approximately **\$2.05** on a home with a market value of \$300,000 by approximately **\$6.16**, and on a home with a market value of \$600,000 by approximately **\$12.31**. An increase in property taxes may lead to an increase in rental costs. The durational limit of the levy is permanent once approved by the voters, assuming the district levies that amount at least once in the next five years.
