IDEAL 18 FLEET NEWS

Help is needed! ECYC and EYC are co-hosting a race day for Pettipaug Sailing Academy students in the Ideal 18s. We hope to make this an annual event as a "graduation present" for the senior class. This will be the first time most of them will race a keel boat and we hope it will draw some interest to our clubs. The date is Wednesday July 26th. EYC is providing the race committee and we are providing two mark boats. Commodore Steve will use his boat to bring spectators (mostly parents of the sailors, but anyone is welcome - just bring a PFD) out to watch the racing. The mark boats should be small powerboats. Their purpose is to drop, move, and retrieve the marks of the course. For frostbiting, they also rescue capsized sailors. If you have never been a mark boat before it doesn't matter - we will have an experienced racer on board with you to do the dirty work hauling the marks and to provide guidance. The race committee is in radio contact with the mark boats telling them where to go and what to do. Please contact me via e-mail if you can volunteer to be a mark boat. You would be needed between 10am and 3pm.

Good news from our Ideal 18 sailors: Rumor has it that Jon Gibbs is tearing up the Tuesday night races and that Sue Watts is rapidly improving.



The club's Ideal 18s are available for any qualified skippers to take out other club members or guests (please familiarize yourself with our Ideal 18 Usage Guidelines).

Bring a VHF radio. If you do not have your own, please ask Jean Little or me about using the club's radios. Please ensure you return the radios to their chargers after use. Life jackets must be worn at all times. There are a couple of spare life jackets in the lockers next to the side door.

 Check that each boat has two paddles as it can be difficult to clear the outer docks.

For graduates of Cindy Gibb's racing clinic and any other qualified skippers who feel they are ready to test themselves, one of our Frostbite skippers will be happy to crew for you in the Tuesday night EYC races which we are allowed to participate in. The racing is not highly competitive and is a good stepping stone to Frostbiting, the Rum Challenge, and the team race.



Friday Night Colors:

Friday Night Colors has been a long-standing tradition at the time of sunset at our yacht club, just like at countless yacht clubs around the country.

We generally time our ceremony with that of our neighbors'

at the Essex Yacht Club.

Some of you may not be familiar with the procedure, so here is a little primer:

The day's Officer on Deck (usually a member of the Board of Governors scheduled for that evening) will take the ECYC saluting cannon out of the trophy case and place it on the pedestal mount on the rail immediately next to the club by the flagpole prior to the time of sunset. He/she then loads the cannon with a shot gun shell.

Just before sunset the staff at the Essex Yacht Club will ring a bell as a warning prior to firing their salute cannon. They will then lower the EYC burgee.

When the EYC burgee has been lowered, our Officer on deck will ring **our club's bell** TWICE and say "Stand for Colors". ECYC members and guests are to stand and quietly face the US Flag at EYC as it is lowered. We follow this procedure as we do not lower our own US Flag, since our flagpole is lit throughout the night.

Once the bell has been rung and members have been called to "Stand for Colors," the assistant Officer on Deck (the following week's OOD or other designated assistant) will fire our cannon by hitting the end of the cannon with the mallet. The assistant and anyone close to the cannon should wear ear muffs or plug their ears against the noise.

WARNING:

The cannon shot is VERY LOUD when you are out on the deck!

When the US Flag as been lowered, the OOD will ring our bell ONCE and say, "As you were." Members and guest can now return to their seats and continue as before.
