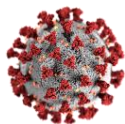

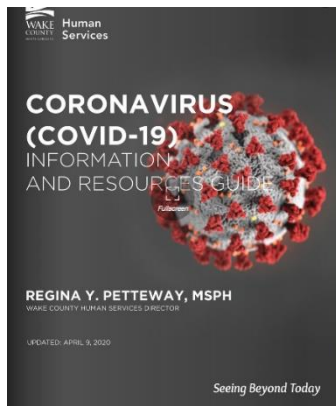

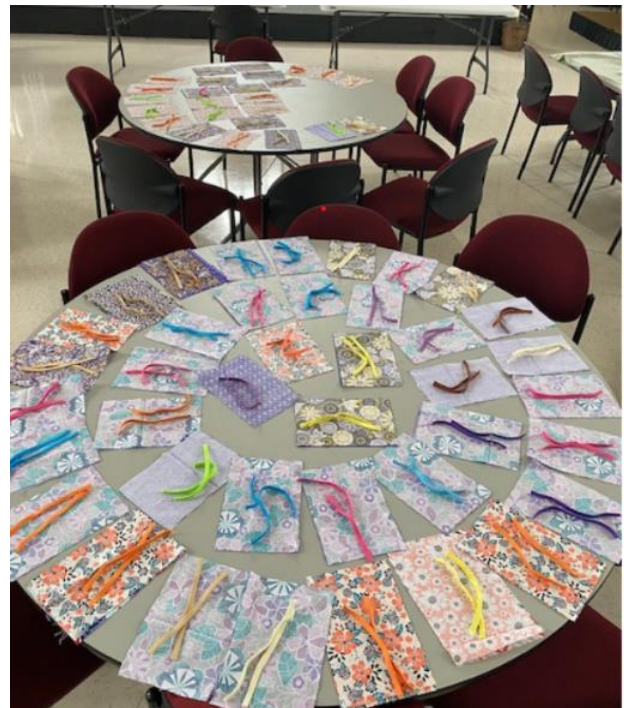

Goal was to make fabric masks to be donated to the health community and our St. Paul seniors when they needed to go out to shop or doctor's offices. When we complete the project next week we will have made 637 masks. So far they have been donated to 75 of our senior members, 2 nursing homes in Raleigh, 2 facilities in Durham, a Unit at the VA hospital in Durham and for Wake County Senior Citizen Case Worker team. Over 425 have already been distributed and the remainder are in the works.
