

We will start with a delicious, catered dinner, which will be followed by the play, *The Herd*: Rory Kinnear's passionate and heartfelt comedy-drama looks at a family in turmoil when life doesn't turn out as expected.

Here are some excerpts from the reviews and a little bit about the author.

Chicago Tribune: April 12, 2015: The Herd, which you will not want to miss, is about three generations of a fractured British family, but it is the grandparents, portrayed by Smith and Mahoney, who emerge as the moral core of the story. . . The Herd does an awful lot really well . . .but it is rare indeed to find a contemporary play with such richly written roles for older characters. It is as if Kinnear was determined to nix all the usual cliches: Smith's Patricia and Mahoney's Brian have aging bodies that get in their way at times, but they are intellectual, vital, sexualized and, above all, humorous beings, and their role in this play would be to dispense the wisdom of experience had Brian not come to the apt conclusion that life is little more than "luck and doggedness."

NY Times Review, May 1, 2015 "The drama of family discord has been such a staple of the American theater that a curtain rising upon a suburban living room almost automatically makes us settle in and wait for the fireworks to start. But the British can squabble and stew, stiff upper lips be damned, quite as well as the rest of us, as is illustrated by *The Herd*, a lively and moving comedy-drama by the British actor Rory Kinnear. . . ."

The author is the 38 year-old acclaimed British actor Rory Kinnear. His range runs from the Shakespearian lago at the National Theatre through *Penny Dreadful*, appearing in *The Imitation Game* and three James Bond movies. Prior to writing *The Herd*, he had never written a play. But Rory related that an actor has time on his hands, thus he wrote his first play.



Tiffany Chang, age 17, is a senior at Corona Del Sol High School and a member of her school chamber orchestra. She is currently studying with Phoenix Symphony violinist Jing Zeng.

Ms. Chang began playing the violin at the age of three. At age six, she joined the Metropolitan Youth Orchestra and was Concertmaster by age ten, when she was honored with the 2009-2010 Division 1 Director's Award. In 2014 and 2016, she was concertmaster of the All State Orchestra sponsored by the Arizona Music Educators Association.

Tiffany was the winner in the Junior Category of the Music Teachers National Association (MTNA) Competition in 2009, 2011 and 2012 and advanced to the Division level in Hawaii,

Las Vegas, and Utah.

This past summer she attended the Interlochen Arts Camp, where she was recognized as one of the top young musicians in the country. Not only did she win one of the coveted concertmaster positions of the World Youth Symphony Orchestra, she also performed the third movement of the Tchaikovsky *Violin Concerto* with the orchestra as winner of the extremely competitive concerto competition.



Zhou Jiang

Pianist Zhou Jiang was born in Kunming, Yunnan province of China. She began her piano studies at the age of five. She pursued her undergraduate studies at Shanghai Conservatory of Music, where she graduated with a Bachelor's Degree in 2008. There she took part in many performances with fellow students and faculty.

Ms. Jiang obtained her Master's Degree and Piano Performance Certificate in Collaborative Piano at Lynn University in Boca Raton, Florida. She is currently pursuing a Doctoral Degree in Collaborative piano at Arizona State University.

She has concertized throughout the U.S. and Europe. In 2012 and 2013, she toured Texas, Tennessee, North Virginia, North Carolina, Pennsylvania and Oregon. Her European tours have taken her to Germany, France, Austria, Belgium, Holland, and Luxembourg. In 2014,

she performed as a Guest Artist at the Saarburg International Festival in Germany and Vienden International Festival in Luxemburg.

Deborah Lipstadt, MA'72, PhD'76, honored with Alumni Achievement Award ~ The Holocaust historian received the award prior to a screening of the film *Denial*.

Deborah Lipstadt, MA'72, PhD'76, was presented the Brandeis Alumni Achievement Award in a ceremony followed by a screening of a film based on her legal battle against Holocaust denier David Irving. After the screening, Lipstadt engaged in a conversation with Oscar-winning filmmaker Errol Morris, H'11, in front of a packed house at Wasserman Cinematheque.

Brandeis University President Ron Liebowitz presented Lipstadt with the award, which is the highest form of university recognition bestowed exclusively on alumni.

"We are gathered here this evening to watch an important movie together and to hear from the real heroine of the film, alumna Deborah Lipstadt, whose career has been dedicated to pursuing the truth, even unto its innermost parts," Liebowitz said. "Deborah, you have brought great honor to us here at Brandeis."

Lipstadt is one of the world's foremost authorities on the Holocaust and the study of Holocaust deniers. She has been a professor of modern Jewish history and Holocaust studies at Emory University for over 20 years, and her books include: Beyond Belief: The American Press and the Coming of the Holocaust; Denying the Holocaust: The Growing Assault on Truth and Memory; History on Trial: My Day in Court with a Holocaust Denier and The Eichmann Trial.

She was thrown into the international spotlight when Irving, a purported historian and Holocaust denier, filed a

defamation case against her in 1996. Instead of settling the case, she elected to take him on before a British judge. *Denial* tells the story of the trial. Academy Award-winning actress Rachel Weisz plays Lipstadt in the film. In the discussion between Lipstadt and Morris that followed the screening, Lipstadt said that in order to expose those who deny history, you have to go beyond name calling, even if the names are true.

"You've got to do the hard work, you can't just say, 'You are a bigot," she said. "You've got to show, you've got to challenge. I think in our country and lots of other countries there's a great failure of that." Morris - who interviewed David Irving while making his 1999 film *Mr. Death*, which focuses on another Holocaust denier, Fred Leuchter - remarked on the importance of Lipstadt's mission of defending truth against the denial of history.

"There's this terrible post modern notion, which I revile, that there is no such thing as truth, that everything is up for grabs ... I respectfully, or disrespectfully, disagree. There is such a thing as truth, there's such a thing as historical reality, a world in which things have happened or not happened," Morris said. "Digging our way back to historical reality is a deeply and important noble enterprise."

The screening and discussion were a collaboration of the Brandeis University Alumni Association and the Film, Television and Interactive Media Program. *Denial* premieres September 30.

Since 1948, BNC members have raised more than \$131 million to support Brandeis students, faculty, the library and cutting-edge research in neuroscience.
