Soroptimist International of Grosse Pointe (SIGP) held its Annual Awards Ceremony at Assumption Cultural Center on March 11, 2020. A total of 66 people attended the inspirational event, which included 35 Soroptimist members, 6 awardees and their families, and 12 other guests including Midwest Region Governor-elect, Darcy Merritt and Midwest Region Fundraising Chair, Patricia Cavell. SIGP President Aleksandra Andjelkovic announced that six women were receiving monetary awards to honor their achievements and fund their educational efforts.

The **Live Your Dream (LYD)** award is the signature award of Soroptimist International of the Americas. The firstplace winner of \$3,000 was **Deborah Smith**. She is a sin-

gle parent and a student at Wayne State University in the Social Work bachelor's program. Her goal is to continue into the master's program. She plans to use her degree to help women gain understanding on how to overcome adversity and achieve dreams.

The second-place LYD winner, **Lavina Hutchinson**, was awarded \$2000. At an early age she was the primary support for her two younger half-sisters and continues to be the primary support of her 18-year-old sister, taking on the "mother role." Rising above these challenges, she earned an Associate Degree in general studies from Wayne State University and is currently in the Macomb Community College nursing program working on her Associate Degree in Nursing. She plans to graduate at the end of this academic year and will immediately begin a bachelor's degree in Nursing at Oak-land University.

Angeles Cuevas Cervantes was awarded the Virginia Wagner Educational Award of \$3,000 Angeles is a firstgeneration college student from Southwest Detroit who will complete her bachelor's degree at Eastern Michigan University in Language & International Careers-Spanish. Her goal is to become a licensed certified interpreter and start a business using her talents in her community.

The **Soroptimist Ruby Award** is given to women who have made a positive difference in the lives of other women and girls. **Amanda Good**, CEO and one of the founders of **Alternatives for Girls (AFG)**, was awarded a \$500 donation to be used to help homeless, high-risk girls and young women avoid violence, exploitation and teen pregnancy.

Anti-Human Trafficking Update

Mary Ellen Brayton, Laurie Jost and I have decided that in light of the recommendations of Soroptimist International of the Americas headquarters (SIAHQ) that we *cancel all events through June 1st for good measure.*

We are also canceling our August 29th Human Trafficking Awareness 5K Walk/Run. With the social distancing and closing of businesses, we felt it best to postpone this event until the spring of 2021. We feel an August event and the new recommendations from SIAHQ (see below) would not give us sufficient time to create a successful event.

...if you are with a club located in the US or Canada, our club and region liability coverage does not cover communicable diseases. Holding an event of any size given the current circumstances will be considered negligent, placing great risk upon the club, its members, the region and SIA headquarters (SIAHQ). You must postpone or cancel all club events at least through May 11; June 1, for good measure.—SIAHQ

Once we are able to gather without the threat of spreading this disease, your committee co-chairs will schedule a meeting to continue our efforts with a new 5K Walk/Run date and the rest of the duties needed to ensure a successful event.

If you are a sub-committee chairperson and can communicate with your team via email and phone to complete your duties, please do so. The more we can get accomplished during this downtime via technology, the further ahead we will be when we are able to reconvene.

Thank you all for your commitment to this event and hope to see you all very soon.

SIA Membership Updates

For those of you interested in learning more about Membership totals for our clubs, region and federation please see below.

Soroptimist of the Americas

Individual Members: 29,980

Total Clubs: 1,260

SIA showed a net increase of 223 members during February 2020. This is a 7.5% decrease from the previous 5-year average net increase of 241 members during the month of February. The organization also showed a net increase of two clubs this month.

Region Membership updates:

- During February 2020, 24 regions showed a monthly increase in membership over January 2020. Meanwhile, one region decreased in membership this month and four regions showed no change during February.
- Additionally, 13 regions (América del Sur, Board Directed SIA Northern Philippines, Camino Real, Central East Coast, Desert Coast, Founder, México-Centroamérica, **Midwestern**, Northeastern, Northwestern, Philippines, Taiwan, and Western Canada) show growth in a year-over-year increase in membership compared to February 2019, more than at the same period last year when five regions showed year-over-year growth.


