

## THE FEAST OF OUR LADY OF LOURDES February 11

On February 11, 1858, a young lady appeared to Bernadette Soubirous thus beginning a series of visions by one who identified herself as, "I am the Immaculate Conception." A story we are all familiar with but one

which is so worth telling over and over.

Bernadette was a sickly child of poor parents whose practice of the faith was scarcely more than lukewarm and she could recite only a few familiar prayers. Her parents were not impressed with her stories. Yet our Blessed Mother chose her to be her voice to the world.

The apparition was described as "a pretty young girl with a rosary in her hand". Bernadette was impressed that the lady used the polite form of address rather than the informal-the humble virgin appeared to a humble girl and treated her with dignity.

Through that humble girl, Mary revitalized and continues to revitalize the faith of millions of people. People began to flock to Lourdes from all over the world. The Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes became worldwide in 1907.

After these apparitions Bernadette became a nun and contracted tuberculous but did not seek the curing waters of the spring at Lourdes for herself as the lady told her that the waters were not for her. When asked why the lady did not continue to make use of her she responded, "what does a person do with a broom after finishing using it?...You put it back behind the door and move along to your next task." Her sense of humility was always with her. Lourdes is now a place of pilgrimage, healing, and faith with over 60 confirmed miraculous cures, although there have probably been many more.

"Oh Mary conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to you."

## SICK February 11

The Catholic Church marks the annual World Day of the Sick on February 11, the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. The theme of this year's observance is "Come

to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest," taken from Matthew's Gospel. Christ's words of solidarity, comfort and hope, the Pope explains, is for all people including the poor, the sick, sinners, those who are marginalized by the burden of the law and the oppressive social system... The mercy and comforting presence of Jesus, he says, embraces people in their entirety, each person in his or her health condition, discarding no one, but rather inviting everyone to share in His life and to experience His tender love. Pray for all of those who endure illnesses of any form that comfort and healing may be theirs.
