Dear Friends,

July brings us the completion of the Book of *Bemidbar* in our annual cycle of Torah reading and also will begin the reading of the last book of the Torah *Devarim* (Deuteronomy) which we know was completed under the watch of King Josiah during the latter First Temple period. It is a modernization of the laws from the previous books and updates to the Jewish codes of law and ethics that give us great insight into how our ancestors morphed from very ancient days till that point during the First Temple period.

This month also encompasses the *Drei Vochen* or 3-week period from the minor fast of the 17<sup>th</sup> of Tammuz to the great fast of Tisha B'Av. This is a low point in our yearly cycle of fasts and festivals. We mourn the destruction of both the great temples and the ultimate destruction of Jerusalem, not once, but twice, first by the Babylonians and then by the Romans. We also mourn the terrible things that have happened to our people over time so that we may never forget them. Once Tisha B'Av passes, we begin a 7 week period upward toward the High Holyday season. As we begin our spiritual ascent to the lofty heights of those holidays, we remind ourselves that we too have short comings that need to be addressed. More on this I will discuss in my article for the August *Mishpacha*.

# Respect for the Torah and Holy Books

We as Jews can trace our history from creation to our present times. The first part, the Five Books of Moses is our Torah. It is our approach as Jews to the most sacred symbol of our faith.

<u>The Torah Scroll</u> The Torah is given the utmost of our respect and honor. It must be kept in a special place in the synagogue and taken out only when it is to be used or repaired. When the Torah is carried during the services we must rise as a sign of respect. When the Torah is read in the synagogue, we must remain quiet and follow the reading.

It is one of the greatest honors to be called up to the Torah to recite the blessings. Every time we thank G-d for giving us the Torah. In essence, we affirm our belief that the Torah is truth, and we bless His name for giving us the privilege of teaching Torah to the world.

Lastly we thank Him for giving the blessing of ever lasting life to the Jewish nation so that it can continue to teach the right way of life to the world.

It is a great "Mitzvah" to donate a Torah scroll to the synagogue. It is an even greater "Mitzvah" to copy a Torah oneself.

When someone carries the Torah scroll in the synagogue, he must be very careful for, if he drops it, he, and all who are present are obligated to fast or redeem their fast by giving charity.

<u>Holy Books</u> It is the duty of every Jew to buy holy books such as: the Bible, prayer books for various holidays, and books of Jewish Law. One should set aside a certain period of the day to study these books. It is a great "Mitzvah" to lend holy books to friends so that they, too, may learn about their religion.

All holy books must be given proper respect. It is forbidden to place them on the floor. They must not be thrown about. They must be placed right side up when they are carried or put on the table. A holy book may be used only for the purpose for which it was made-for study.

When a Torah scroll is no longer fit for use, it is forbidden to throw it way or burn it. It must be brought to the rabbi, who will bury it according to Jewish law. This law also holds true for holy books.

Above all, let us always remember that a holy book contains the words of G-d and His Name. When we handle it with respect, we are showing respect to G-d. When we ignore respect, we are showing disrespect to Him.
