MCI classes	Michael sent out an email to all service directors looking for sites to do the course. Will be in touch as needed to get help covering those courses.
Triage Ribbon Colors	Discussion to follow up on last meetings discussion about triage ribbon colors. Group agreed that grey ribbon would be used for grey/expectant patients and either checkered black/white or black tape would be used for deceased.
	Michael to purchase grey tape for kits being given out by NCRTAC.
	Adam noted that it would be better if the triage algorithm reminder cards on the ribbon packs could be laminated.
	Michael to draft a position statement about our recommendation to use SALT, SMART triage tags, ribbon kits and the color recommendations.
Trauma Education Topic	Group discussed doing a one-pager and PowerPoint slide presentation again that could be distributed to services like was done last year for hypothermia.
	Spinal motion restriction was discussed and would link to falls which is a BOTS priority area for NCRTAC. Could promote full body vacuum splints. Michael to draft.
PHTLS/ITLS Support	Group discussed desire to get PHTLS or ITLS going again in the region. Unsure where the tech schools are with it. Michael will check with them and Don Kimlicka.
High Consequence Infectious Disease Course	Michael and Dr. Clark discussed the HCID course being held by the NCW HERC and encouraged services to attend.
Regional List of EMS Transport Services	Group discussed having a directory of EMS transport services with contact information on the NCRTAC website. Michael will look into this.
OCI VIOCS	Group would also like ED contact information for EMS follow-ups, etc.
