Member of the Month

Mike Zinski



Anyone that meets Mike Zinski and has the opportunity to see some of the products of his mechanical and technological skills will be impressed. As he relays, without much higher knowledge or education, every job he has held began at internship level, but soon he was selected for promotion and became a lead employee. The TriCities is his original home site; he graduated from Columbia High School in Richland, and in his lifetime has been employed at several companies in a variety of capacities. Of note, he worked for a cabbing machine company plating diamond laps, he demonstrated Ultratech machines, he was an electronic tech debugging Saturn Launch computers, and worked for General Motors inspecting crank pulleys and motors.

Mike has been a LGMC member since 2016. Today he has a variety of machines in his workshop and offers club members assistance with gem faceting, cabochon production on a vertical machine, and rock sawing to name a few. He has grown to bes passionate about 3D printing and is very resourceful in designing new equipment for lapidary and gem work. He has communication and membership in the Faceters Guild, Spokane, Walla Walla, Yakima, and several other statewide Gem and Mineral clubs as well as relationships with many other individuals nationally and internationally.

Mike is becoming renowned for 3D fabricating inexpensive new equipment, including: rock saws, vertical cabbing machine and vibration laps, lap racks, dopping sticks and custom splash pans and covers for faceting machines. Mike is creating 3D patterns and to provide assistance to members to be able to print their own lapidary equipment and states that he has seen members lose their interest in gems and minerals due to the high cost of equipment. Other clubs are sharing his enthusiasm and are very appreciative of his ideas and fabrications. Mike states that he would really like for LGMC to increase communication and ties to other gem and mineral clubs.

Mike currently is making 3D character figures for handouts to children attending our April show at the fairgrounds. He states he usually is home and suggests that you first give him a phone call to schedule a visit.

2025 SILENT AUCTION RULES

Half Hour Auctions:

• White slips only. Please print the material, your name, and check box if item is a Donation or Consignment. If unchecked it will be automatically considered a donation. Put your opening bid on first line and leave name blank for first bidder.

2 Hour Auctions:

- There will be 3 two hour auctions each day (hour and a half on last one on Sunday) for higher value items, and a limit of two items per family, per auction for each session unless there is a shortage of material for the table. The bid sheets for this auction are on colored slips. Please print your name clearly on the slip as well as what the item is. Fill in the beginning bid price and leave the name area blank next to it. The 2 hour colored sheets have a BUY IT NOW price as well as the opening bid below it. **BUY IT NOW** seems to sell better if that price runs about \$10 to \$15 above opening **BID** amount.
- Bid slips will be available at the April meeting so club members can prepare their items for sale.
- Each sheet should be attached to its item with a rubber band.
- A 4% cover charge will be added to the buyer's total to cover card user charges.
- The first of the day will begin at 10:45 am, so as not to interfere with the calling of door prizes.
- NO BIDDING while working behind the tables and NO socializing with non-workers behind the tables.
- All items must be paid for at the end of the auction round & there will be no storing of materials for club members behind the tables.
- Only volunteers that are pre-signed up are allowed behind the tables unless someone is filling in for a no-show.
- The chairs behind the tables are for the auction-workers use only.
- If an item does not sell, it will be removed from the table and set aside for another sale round or set aside for the owner to claim later.
- The payout on sales is 70% to owner, 30% to club. If you want a certain amount for your item, please figure out that amount in your 70% return and write that on your slip as the opening bid.

Jr. Club Report - March 11, 2025

Some kids discover interesting rocks while camping and fishing, others get hooked on rock collecting through the shopping experience. But either way, they are learning about our planet and its treasures! Many of our club members found us by experiencing all the show has to offer, including gorgeous display collections put together by members, fun games at the Junior booth, and having a geode cracked open.

At the next meeting on April 8, we'll begin a deep dive into the world of tiny rocks as we explore soil. Then in May we'll do a little "mining" to find gems in different kinds of sediment, and in June we'll have a presentation from the president of the International Sand Collector's Society.

Garnet by Devan, age 9

Garnets are common gems that come in every color, the most common being red to the rarest being blue. They are also a group of silicate minerals. It can either have a cubic or rhombic dodecahedron structure. It has a hardness on the Mohs scale of 6.5 to 7.5.

There are also types of garnet like pyrope and andradite. It is used for jewelry, cutting steel (totally safe). It is formed in conditions like tectonic plates colliding. See you later!

Lepidolite Mica by Harper

Today my report is on a rock called lepidolite mica. It can have a pink or lilac color and only breaks in one direction. Other types of micas are muscovite with a hardness of 2.5 to 4, and biotite with a black color and radioactive elements. Abbe Hauy who lived in 1743 to 1822 was one of the few people to realize that crystals split into regular shapes along cleavage planes. Also lepidolite is a mineral of the core area of a lithium-bearing pegmatite. Lastly thank you for taking the time to listen to my report.
