

A Note from Pastor Toni

Fall is in the air. That means Halloween, Thanks-giving and Christmas are already showing up in stores! I dread hearing Christmas music in Wal-Mart as early as Nov 1! ARGH!! Time passes quickly enough without the help of retailers! The trees are beginning to change color, the morning air is brisk, and we're bouncing all over the place when it comes to weather and temperature. I genuinely enjoy living in an area where I have the privilege of experiencing four distinct seasons a year!

Seasons imply change. Seasons bring challenges. Seasons encourage preparation. Seasons are not only reserved for the weather. Our economy experiences seasons. Our ministries experience seasons. Our lives experience seasons—seasons of abundance and seasons of scarcity; seasons of struggles and trials, seasons of joys, grief and celebrations. God's Word says, "in all things, give thanks," "... for it is God who works in you to will and to act according to His good pleasure." Did you catch that? God desires to act through you in accordance with what brings God joy—not you! God's joy is supposed to be our joy as well. If you are truly desiring to look more and more like Jesus to the world around you, then whatever God desires from you ought to be a simple YES the moment you feel the nudge, hear the voice, read the Word and know God is speaking directly to you. But oh, how we drag our feet; how we question and doubt, deny and make excuses.

Every one of us knows what God expects of us as followers of Jesus Christ. Every one of us knows our responsibilities to the Body of Christ as His hands and feet. Every one of us knows within our hearts whether or not we are truly doing our part for God's Kingdom. I know that God's church will not grow without all of you doing your part—inviting friends and family to Sunday worship, reaching out to neighbors and sharing the opportunities available for children throughout the week, helping to serve in our children's ministries when needed, inviting folks beyond the church community to join your small group, encouraging those who have broken ties with the fellowship to return, offering to give rides on Sunday morning to worship. All of these and many more are within each one of our abilities to be Jesus to someone.

We've been learning about what Jesus means when He teaches us to love our neighbor; to have wide-eyed compassion and see those around us who no one else sees or wants; to extend Christ-like compassion to the strangers that we meet; to not back away from our Godly responsibilities to be the presence of Jesus to the people around us! Church, YOU make the church in our community what it is because you are the church! YUMC needs every one of you if it's going to not just survive but thrive into the next 30-40 years. That means making the necessary sacrifices to engage families in our community. I have people say to me frequently, "Well, maybe that's not our church's call to minister in Yreka? Maybe we're supposed to minister to an

older population?" And how long will a church who believes that last? Not very long. Most of us have families living in our neighborhood. When was the last time you invited them to church, or Christmas Eve, or VBS or Kingdom Kids? It will require all of us pulling our weight to grow YUMC. We are moving into a critical time where we can have a positive effect on the lives of others simply by inviting them to join us on Sundays! Tell people your story, introduce them to your faith community and let the Holy Spirit do the rest. Statistics say that it requires a minimum of five invites before most people will respond. Are you willing? If you haven't been to a Sunday worship celebration for a while, I encourage you to get back into the habit of connecting with God and your church community once a week. It's a good habit to get into for you and the kids. Re-connect, refresh, renew yourself. Get a good dose of GOD! You'll be glad you did! It's Fall!


The Book Club –October 10, 2019

TAILGATERS




