

Read all these correct statements:

- Don't let up when applying Anti-lock Brake System in an emergency.
- When backing your vehicle, check behind both sides by turning your head.
- The distance it will take for a vehicle to stop depends on the weight and speed of the vehicle, and the road surface.
- After coming to a stop at a red light driving a vehicle with an automatic transmission, leave the vehicle in Drive.
- In higher altitudes, you could become short of breath or sleepy because there is less oxygen in the air.
- When driving uphill, you need more power and will use more fuel because of the pull of gravity.
- When driving down a hill in a car that has an automatic transmission, downshift to a lower gear and employ your brakes occasionally to control your speed.
- You know that it is illegal to pass another vehicle when a warning sign and or roadway markings says so.
- When parking in a space just beyond an intersection, you signal after you have entered the intersection.
- The certificate of title proves who owns the car and must always be kept somewhere safe such as in a safety deposit box at the bank.
- The speed limit tells you the fastest speed that you may drive, but you cannot go less than 5 mph under the speed limit if a vehicle is behind you.
- Before granting a driver's license, examiners test for minimum visual requirements (eye test), knowledge of traffic laws (written permit test), and driving ability (road test).
- Maximum and minimum speed limits tell you the speed that cannot be exceeded and the minimum speed that you must go under ideal conditions.
- At night, some states have lower speed limits.
- Fatigue can cause micro-sleeps.
- Wearing sunglasses will help to manage the sun's glare.
- You should turn your engine off to nap, to prevent carbon monoxide poisoning.
- Of all the senses you use while driving, the most important one is your sight.
- The best remedy for driving fatigue is 10-minute nap.
- In Hawaii you are required to signal for a turn at least 100 feet in advance of the turn.
- The alcoholic content of a 5-ounce glass of wine, a 12-ounce bottle of beer, or 1 ounce of Vodka is greatest in the Wine.
- Alcohol is classified as a depressant.
- The way to sober up a person who has had too much to drink is give the alcohol time to wear off.
- A person's vision, coordination, and judgment are affected by alcohol.
- In Hawai'i, Implied Consent requires you to submit to a Blood Alcohol Content test if you are arrested for suspicion of Driving Under the Influence. If you refuse to submit, your license may be revoked for a minimum of 1 year.
- When making a right turn at an intersection, make sure your car is as close to the right edge as is practicable, there are no cyclists on your right, and there is no other traffic entering your path.
- A driver turning left at a green light must yield to oncoming traffic and pedestrians in front and on the left.
- When parking downhill on a two-way road turn the steering wheel all the way toward the road edge, set the parking brake, and shift the car into Park.
- A stop sign is shaped like an octagon.
- A broken yellow line means that you can pass if it is safe to do.
- A brown sign with white lettering can tell you about state parks.
- When beginning a perpendicular parking maneuver line up as far as possible from the parking stall.
- When parking uphill on a two-way road that does not have curb turn the steering wheel all the way toward the road edge.
- Traffic traveling in the same direction is separated by white lines.
- When you come to a yield sign, approach slowly enough to yield to pedestrians and vehicles.
- Keep a minimum following distance of at least 3 seconds on regular roadways and 4 seconds on the freeway.

- If traction is reduced, reduce your speed.
- In City Traffic you should Search your path of travel 2 blocks ahead.
- To merge onto the freeway, accelerate to freeway speed in the acceleration lane, signal, glance between your mirrors and in front to find a gap, and check your blind spot.
- Roads are slickest in the early part of a rainstorm because the collected oils float on the surface of the water.
- Reducing speed will help prevent hydroplaning.
- To make your car more visible use your headlights anytime you drive whether it is day or night.
- You should use your high beams only on dark roads with no other cars visible ongoing or oncoming.
- Never use your high beams in rain, snow, or fog.
- When an oncoming vehicle's headlights are too bright slow down & look at the right edge of the traffic lane.
- Never flash your high beams at an oncoming or ongoing vehicle.
- If your tire loses pressure while you are driving, you should release the accelerator pedal slowly and grip the steering wheel firmly.
- The SIPDE process includes search, identify, predict, decide, and execute.
- The ignition switch is used to turn the car's electrical system and engine on and off.
- For smooth control apply the brakes with the top of your foot, keeping your heel on the floorboard.
