Questions

What About You?

Have you been baptized? Jesus was baptized, and it pleased God. Use the <u>picture on the title page of the story</u>. Write these words coming from heaven, around the dove, "You are my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased." The Scriptures tell us to get baptized. See Acts 2:38 and Matthew 28:19-20. Have you been baptized? If so, print, fill out, color in, and frame the <u>certificate</u> on page 6.

A Picture of a Promise

Baptism is a picture. Show some <u>photographs</u> of people. Is that person standing here now? No. But the picture is an image or like a symbol of the real person. Baptism is also a symbol of a bigger thing. Show a <u>wedding ring</u>. A ring that married people wear is a silent symbol to the world that they are already promised to someone. Create silent gestures and actions to "speak" this truth: Baptism is a picture to the world that we now follow Jesus.


Inside Out: Picture of Jesus

Baptism is a picture of what happened to Jesus. He died, was buried in a tomb, and then rose to life. When you get baptized, you go under the water. That is a picture of Jesus dying and getting buried. He came back to life and rose again. Coming back out of the water is a picture of Jesus rising again. It also reminds us of our eternal life. Bring in a <u>pastor</u> to talk about baptism; share your story. Or plant some <u>flower seeds</u> together while reading Romans 6:3-5.

Inside Out: Picture of You

Baptism is a watery picture on the outside of what happened inside, in your heart. When you asked Jesus to be Lord, you were washed clean and are new again, just like a brand new baby. Have you ever seen a newborn? Maybe it was a little brother or sister. Maybe it was a new kitten. What is the first thing you noticed? Newborns are wet!! – fresh and ready to start a new life. The Bible tells us when we ask Jesus to be our Lord, we are born again. It's like we become a new child, fresh and ready to start a new life with Jesus. Read John 3:3-18.

The next time you get out of the shower all wet, look in the mirror and tell yourself, "It's a brand new life and a brand new day. Lord, I want to follow your way." Write the poem in the space around the mirror.
