

### Treasurer's Update:

Dear Aldersgate Family, I hope this message finds you well. As your treasurer, I want to provide some important updates regarding our financial situation.

During September, our donations exceeded expenses by \$979.91, thanks to your ongoing support.

While September's offerings were higher than usual, looking ahead to the first two Sundays of October, the offerings have been significantly lower.

To recap September's *Finance Article*, the Trustees, Finance Committee and Church Council authorized the HVAC replacement/repairs with the estimated cost of \$23,320 coming from the Memorial Fund. All HVAC

repairs/replacements have since been completed.

Since the launch of AUMC's "Capital Campaign" in August, we have received \$11,430 in contributions (as of 13 October). The church is grateful to everyone who has contributed. However, we still require \$11,890 to reach our goal in order to restore the

Memorial Fund.

Your continued financial contributions are essential for sustaining the ministry and the facilities at AUMC. Please remain vigilant in your giving, and keep our church in your prayers. Together, we can ensure Aldersgate will continue to thrive.
