### Perfect Search Engine

"The perfect search engine would be the mind of God," remarked Google co-founder Sergey Brin. Kim Darrah quoted Brin in her article, "The Troubling Influence Algorithms Have On How We Make Decisions."

Kim Darrah said, "While Goggle's uncanny ability to regularly find exactly what you are looking for may seem divine, in reality, even the most sophisticated use of machine learning have run into a wall of human fallibility and immorality.

"People are quick to accept the credibility of computer-generated search results, but algorithmic tools are as flawed as their makers."

At its basis, an "algorithm" is a step by step procedure for solving a mathematical problem or performing a specific task. It can be a simple process such as multiplying two numbers or a complex operation such as in computer programming.

At their heart, algorithms are simply tools that learn from large swathes of data, providing some sort of response like a ranking or rating in accordance with a pre-programmed procedure or process.

This has given them a reputation for being infallible, neutral and fairer than humans, and as a result are quickly making their way into both commercial and public decision-making.

For example, they might be used in how people are hired or promoted, how benefits are allocated, or in deciding whether a person is likely to be re-arrested.

When Google responds to a query, it considers a huge variety of metrics in order to ultimately decide which web pages to include, prioritize and exclude. Like most machine-learning algorithms, Google not only analyzes our behavior, it shapes it.

Sergey Brin may or may not have taken his own comment seriously, but he is right. The perfect search engine is the mind of God. Praying, reading the Bible and being open to God's Spirit shapes our thinking and behavior.

#### Farm Activities and Victory Gardens

The farm and gardening program sponsored by the Alabama Fuel and Iron Company, beginning back in 1931, has taken on new significance and interest under the stress of war and of food rationing.

Fields that have been idle for the past few years are now being plowed and planted to corn, peas, potatoes, and various other vegetables and food crops. Despite the recent cold weather, garden vegetables and crops are coming up and growing. We expect a production this year comparable to that of the greatest year of the Depression when approximately 3,000 acres were cultivated.


The usual procedure is being followed by Alabama Fuel and Iron Co., of furnishing land, mules, and plowing equipment free.

New interest is being taken in raising hogs for meat purposes. Nearly every family has from three to one pigs in the pen that will be grown and fattened to supply the family with meat and lard.

Many families of Acmar and Margaret have purchased milk cows and raising chicks for fryers and layers.

The Home Demonstration Clubs in our communities are looking forward to the canning season when they will sponsor the canning and preserving of all excess home grown fruits, vegetables, and meats.

The men of Acmar and Margaret are doing their bit by working to produce coal, and the men, women, and children are doing their bit by growing vegetables and food crops to help defeat Hitler and Hirohito.
