Roz Fischer



Dear All,

Roz Fischer was a kind, caring and thoughtful leader of the Brandeis University National Women's Committee (BUNWC) - our name before the name was changed to the Brandeis National Committee (BNC) from 1987-1989.

Roz in her own words:

I arrived in Phoenix in 1981 and was asked to join Brandeis by Ellen Tuckman in 1992. I immediately joined the Thursday morning book group and remained a member of this group ever since. Soon after, my aunt, Sylvia Toll and my mom, Pearl New, moved here. They became active members as did my daughter, Sherri Strauss. A member of the Phoenix Symphony, Jan Septon, came to a Brandeis meeting and I was recruited to become a docent for the symphony. My task was to go to schools where children signed up for the Children's Series. There was an established volunteer community service program at that time, where we volunteered at various cultural and educational programs. My husband Bob and I volunteered at concerts and started a fundraising group of volunteers working at the symphony as well. I became President of the Chapter and started a study group visiting many important sites around Phoenix. Also started during my tenure was the Man of the Year Award. It was an excellent program and we raised a great deal of money.

One of my greatest achievements was when I started the music group (today - Concerts & Conversations) with volunteers from the Symphony. The group still continues under the leadership of Joan Sitver. The history and story of Brandeis University became an excellent outreach for our chapter and the university.

In 2009 I was honored with the first Carol Kern Sustaining Leadership Award* for my service.

Arlene Feldman: I moved here from Lexington, MA, a community right next to Waltham where I was taking Lifelong Learning classes at Brandeis University, and called Roz a week after I arrived in Phoenix. That one call involved me in the BNC and it has become my family.

Roz never had a harsh word or raised her voice to get things done. She would ask someone to do something and it was done. It was hard to refuse her! A group that she started called the Brandettes sang at meetings - even if you couldn't carry a tune. We had fun. She was a team player, knew how to delegate and get things accomplished. She respected everyone and made you feel good. On a recent visit, she told me "I want people to remember Brandeis - not me." She was a friend who helped me grow in this community and showed how it was done with dignity and class.

Connie Flegenheimer: I rejoined Brandeis after several years and Roz and I became close friends from that time on. She had innate generosity and a capacity for bringing people together in the BNC and in life. We had wonderful mahj games on afternoons at the Brandeis bookstore back room so that there would always be someone on hand to sell books.

Carol Kern: Roz was a person who saw potential in others even if they did not see it in themselves. She asked me to be the Chapter President when her term was over and worked her best to support and mentor me. She also told me that one day I would become the BNC National President, which was the furthest thing from my mind at the time.

Little did I know that she was a fortuneteller as well. As so many others have said when they speak about Roz as a leader and a friend, she never raised her voice and through her sweet disposition she got things done, even when there were challenges.

OUR Roz Fischer will be sorely missed by all who were lucky enough to know her and she has left a great legacy for our chapter to emulate through her creativity and leadership.

*The Chapter established an award in Carol's name for Sustaining Leadership and another in the name of Ellen Woodnick for Emerging Leaders, given when the chapter deems appropriate.

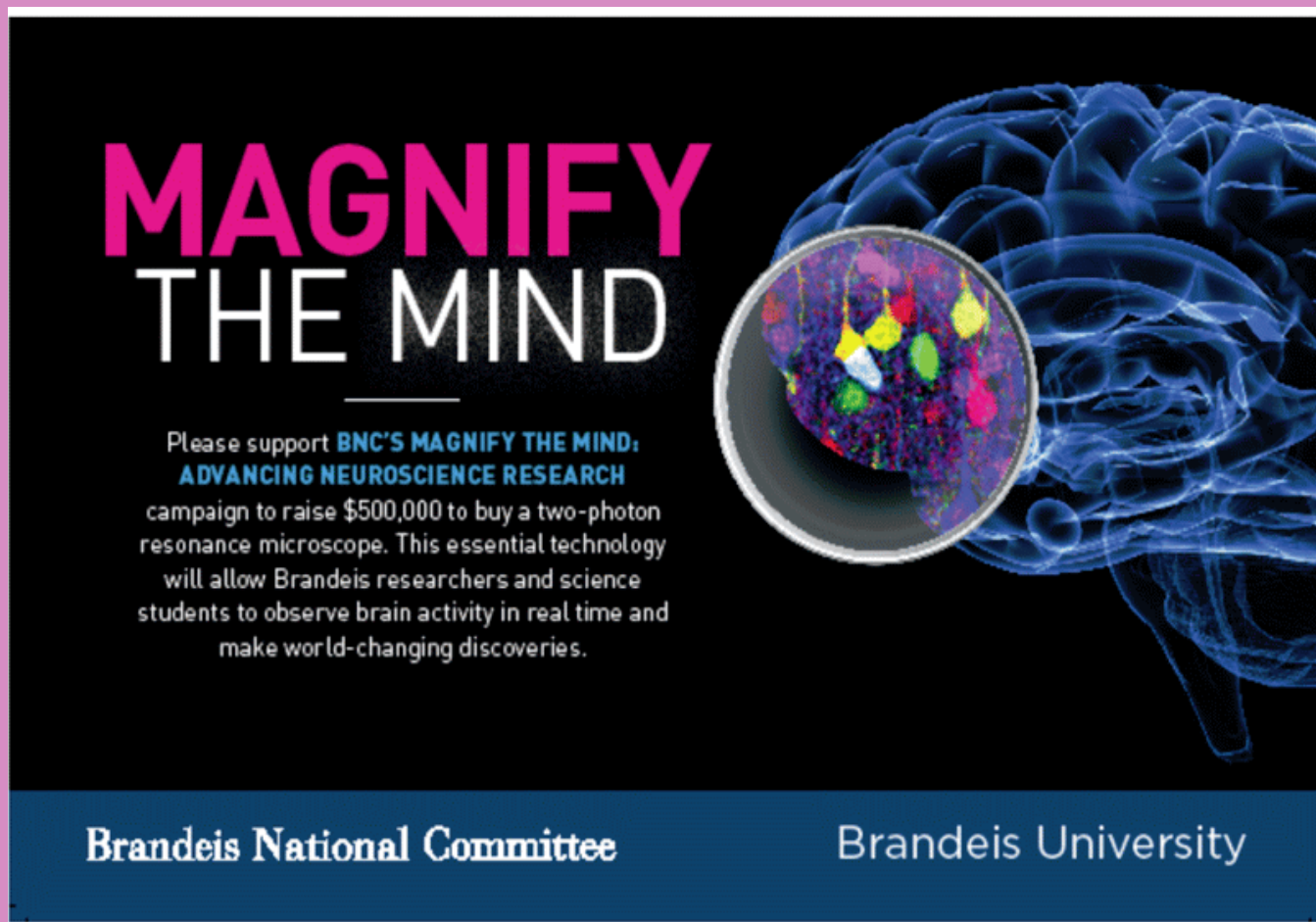
