

Members Report

Feb. 24th Lake Casitas By Luke Fitzpatrick

I hadn't been to the lake for a couple months so I was a bit taken back by how low the water had gotten. There is now a dry roadway out to the island and the boat ramp consists of metal plates laid out so that you can get traction. Not pretty but ts keeping the lake open and running.

The water, although low, is beautiful. Unlike my last visit its clear and clean which made finding the already bedding bass fairly easy, and they are everywhere.

A slow drift along the shoreline is all it takes find some really nice fish. Every few yards theres a bed and more often than not that bed is being protected by a fairly aggressive largemouth bass.

I ended my day with four nice fish ranging from 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ – 4lbs all caught on a chartreuse and silver tube.

As you all know March 1st marked the opening of rockfish season. All the local boats are back in the water looking shiny with new paint and oiled wood.

Just like the last few years I spent opening day aboard the Pacific Dawn but this year was chartered by myself and sponsored by Wils Sport and Tackle. We had a great group of people and a great raffle prize of a custom built Calstar 700L built by Wil.

We had flat calm and foggy seas most of the way out to San Miguel Island. When I woke up the sun was just coming up and the fog was thick enough that you couldn't see the island.

Finally, about 7am we made our first drop. I went with a black and green Cribbs jig and never found a need to tie anything else on. From our first drop we consistently pulled huge 7-8lb red vermillion over the rail along with lingcod ranging from 7-15lbs and the occasional chucklehead, bocaccio and johnny bass. The number and quality of fish put on deck in under three hours was beyond anything we could have hoped for and there wasn't a single person onboard left wanting more.

From there we moved over to Santa Rosa and made two unsuccessful drifts for halibut and spent about 20 minutes trying for a sheephead before heading back to the dock early.
