**MICHAEL RUHLMAN** is the James Beard Award-winning food writer of 24 critically acclaimed books, including: *Grocery*, *The Soul of a Chef*, *The Elements of Cooking*, *Ratio* and *Ruhlman's Twenty*. He has also collaborated on several bestselling cookbooks, including: *The French Laundry Cookbook*, *Bouchon*, *Alinea* and *The French Laundry, Per Se*. His latest cookbook, *From Scratch*, has been described by Ina Gartner, the TV personality and chef, as "making great cooking totally accessible." Michael and his author, wife Ann Hood (*Kitchen Yarns*, *Knitting Circle*), split their time between Rhode Island and New York City.

**JONATHAN WAXMAN** is a California native. After earning the Grand Diplôme from La Varenne Cooking School in Paris, he returned to California to work at Domaine Chandon and then at the legendary Chez Panisse. In 1979, he became the executive chef at Michael's in Santa Monica, where he developed his famous version of California cuisine. He made his mark in New York in 1984 with the now iconic Jams. Today, Waxman is the chef/owner of Barbuto and Jams in Manhattan as well as Adelle's in Nashville and Baffi in Atlanta. He is a recipient of the James Beard award for Best Chef in New York City. Waxman's numerous TV appearances include: *Top Chef Masters*, *Top Chef*, *Recipe for Deception* and *MasterChef*. His charitable work includes: Alex's Lemonade Stand Foundation, Citymeals on Wheels and many others. Jonathan Waxman is the author of three cookbooks including: *A Great American Cook*, *Italian, My Way* and his most recent, *The Barbuto Cookbook*. Jonathan lives in Manhattan on the Upper West Side with his wife and three children.

**THOMAS KELLER** is the first and only American chef to have two Michelin Guide three-star-rated restaurants, The French Laundry in Yountville, California, and Per Se in New York City, both of which continue to rank among the best restaurants in America and the world. In 2011 he was designated a Chevalier of the French Legion of Honor, the first American male chef to be so honored. In 2017, as part of the Ment'or Foundation — established with chefs Jérôme Bocuse and Daniel Boulud — Keller led Team USA to win gold at the Bocuse d'Or competition in Lyon, France, for the first time ever. He is a #1 *New York Times* bestselling author whose books also include: *The French Laundry Cookbook*, *Bouchon*, *Under Pressure*, *Ad Hoc at Home*, *Bouchon Bakery* and most recently, *The French Laundry, Per Se*.

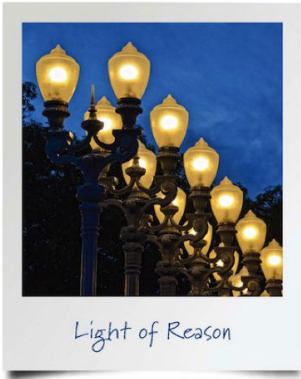

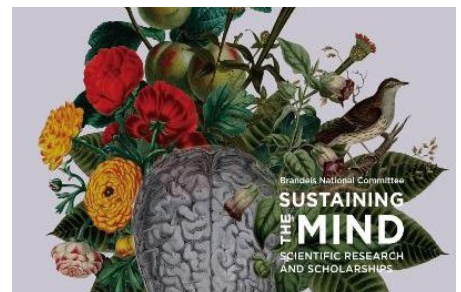
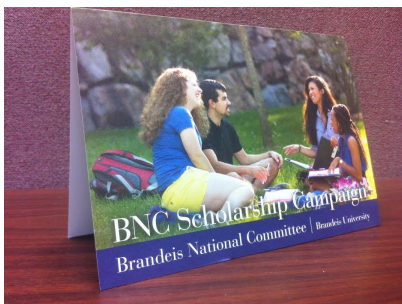
